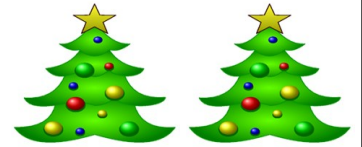

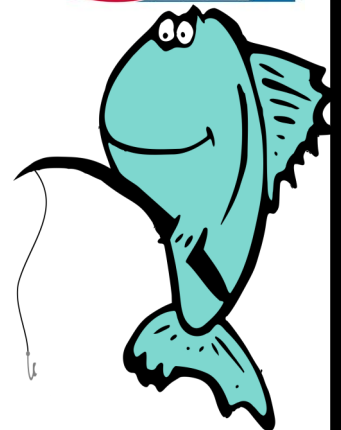

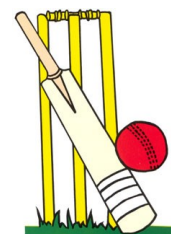

Blitz a success as reports roll in

The community has got on board and contributed to another successful Biosecurity Blitz, with more than 1600 reports submitted during the event from 19 October to 16 November.

Biosecurity Blitz is the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development's annual event that aims to enlist people to monitor for pests that could threaten Western Australia's valuable agriculture and fisheries industries.

While the majority of reports were from WA, all other states and territories participated, with almost 300 reports coming in from Victoria, Queensland and New South Wales combined. Of these reports, the most common were beetles (*Coleoptera* – 249 records), bugs (*Hemiptera* – 253 records) and butterflies/moths (*Lepidoptera* – 168 records).

Pestfax, the department's interactive service with a focus on broadacre pests and diseases, had 60

reports, with the top reports focused on lupins (20 reports) and canola (17 reports).

The State's aquatic reporters were also busy, with WA PestWatch recording 17 reports of species such as goldfish/koi, mosquito fish, cichlids and sailfin mollies.

Department development officer Laura Fagan said the positive response showed that the community recognised the importance of having robust biosecurity systems in place to support the State's primary industries.

"Although we didn't receive any reports of exotic pests during the Biosecurity Blitz, concerted community efforts such as this give evidence of absence, which is just as important," Ms Fagan said.

"Our international trade depends on Western Australia being free of destructive pests that inhabit other parts of the world, so reports of damaging pests were dealt with quickly by the department staff working alongside the individual reporter. As long as we're gathering data that supports area freedom, we'll continue to enjoy access to important global markets. Ongoing reporting also enables us to respond promptly to any pest detections that are capable of having significant negative impacts on not only industry, but also our way of life."

While Biosecurity Blitz has finished for another year, the community is encouraged to continue making reports of any interesting or exotic bugs they see.

People can make reports using the department's free [MyPestGuide™ Reporter](#) or [PestFax Reporter](#) apps or use the [WA PestWatch app](#) for aquatic observations.

Don't duck out – make portable pools safe

Many of us have fond memories of splashing around in a portable pool as a child and, as the weather warms up, we've launched a campaign to remind parents and carers to make these pools safe.

Portable pools – ranging from small blow-up or plastic paddling or kiddie pools to bigger wading pools, inflatable spas or high-sided flexible plastic pools on a frame – can be popular in summer as a cheap alternative to below-ground pools but they are just as dangerous.

On average one child dies from a portable pool-related drowning every year in Australia, while others need hospital treatment, may be left with severe brain injuries and limited life expectancy. For example a toddler who drowned in a portable pool in Noranda in 2015 sadly passed away two years later.

Drowning statistics have prompted Australian Consumer Law and product safety regulators to join forces with the Royal Life Saving Society to spread water safety messages.

We partnered with Royal Life Saving in 2014/15 to run a campaign called 'Make It Safe' and now we've added the reminder of 'Don't Duck Out' of the responsibilities you take on when you buy a portable pool which may include putting up a safety barrier.

Adults following the Don't Duck Out, Make It SAFE tips, such as keeping constant watch of kids around portable pools, can reduce the risk and potentially save lives. The SAFE tips are to:

Supervise - actively watch children within arm's reach. Don't leave older children in charge.

Act - learn emergency first aid including CPR. It's important to start compressions and breaths as soon as possible when a child is pulled from the water and to call triple zero (000) for help. If there are two people, one should make the phone call while the other does CPR.

Fence - in WA, and most of Australia, pools with more than 30cm of water in, are legally required to have a compliant safety barrier and could be fined or prosecuted if you don't. Check with your local Council.

Empty and store safely - after keeping watch all day, pour out water and put the pool away where children can't reach. Never leave it where it can refill with rain or sprinkler water.

As part of the campaign, we've been working with major retailers who will also be helping to spread the Don't Duck Out, Make It SAFE message at the point of sale. Under the Australian Consumer Law, portable pools and their packaging are required to have labels drawing the buyer's attention to drowning risk, the need for active supervision, proper storage and local fencing laws.

Anyone thinking about purchasing a portable pool should take a few minutes to check out the campaign website at www.productsafety.gov.au/makeitsafe for more information. If you spot a portable pool without a warning label you should report that to Consumer Protection by emailing consumer@dmirs.wa.gov.au or you can call 1300 304 054.

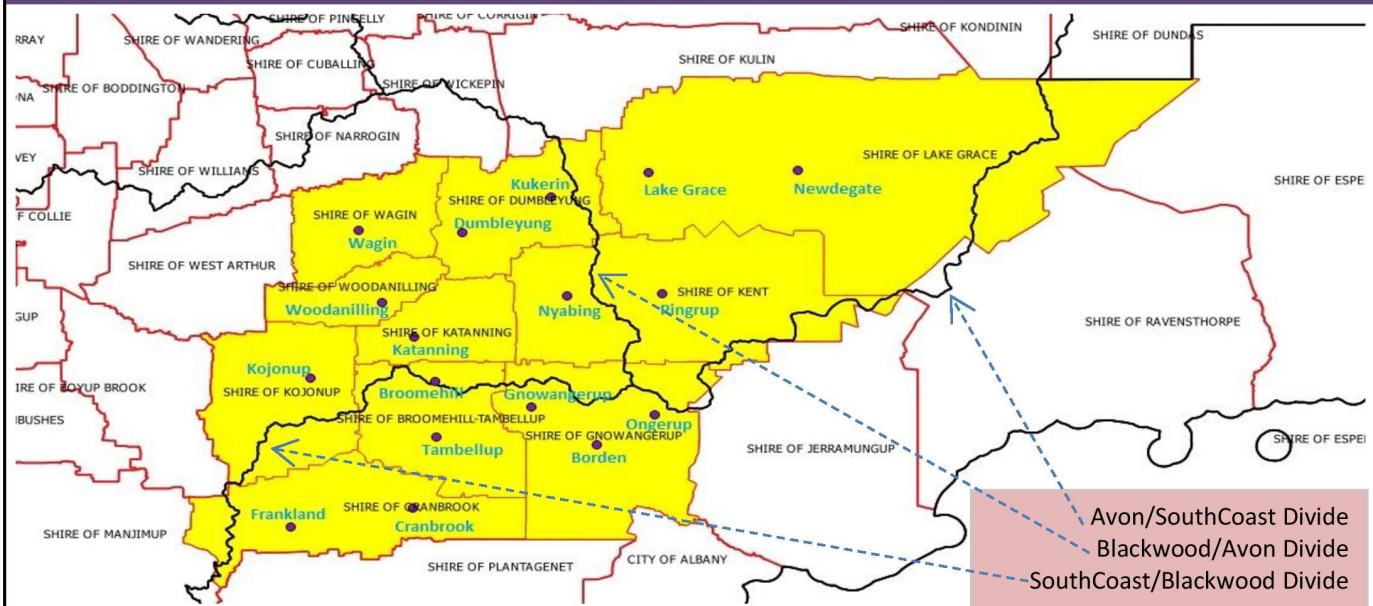

NRM/Landcare News

Within Kent & Lake Grace Shires



Efforts to Collaborate with Neighbours



The Shire of Kent has led efforts to bring together 7 local NRM/Landcare groups that represent a 10 shire area, including: Kent/Lake Grace Shire (**KT/LG**), Dumbleyung Shire (**DU**), Katanning Landcare (**KA**), Wagin Woodanilling Landcare Zone (**WWLZ**), Kojoonup Shire (**KO**), The Gillamii Centre (**Gill**) and North Stirlings Pallinup Natural Resources (**NSPNR**).

The collective met several times in 2018 at the Katanning DPIRD offices to drum up some team spirit for our continued decentralised mission (*preventing depopulation by maintaining locally-positioned service delivery*) and nut out a list of high priority at-risk environmental assets that need the most urgent attention for hazard prevention/minimisation.


Improving soil-landscapes (*less dust storms, gullies, salinity, etc*) within paddocks (*via best practise farming*) and protecting/restoring water-flow areas, namely waterways, lakes and wetlands (*via best practise catchment management*) was identified by the collective as the two most concerning issues where collaboration will enhance investment significantly.

We are eagerly waiting to hear if an application to the State NRM Program (*submitted in August*) will fund our service delivery of activities for these two investment assets identified by the collective, for which the Kent Shire would be the lead project stakeholder and grant devolver. An annoucement is expected just before Christmas or early in the new year, fingers crossed!

In 2018 Perth Solar Force completed their solar energy installations (with 'Fronius' inverters and 'Jinko Solar' panels) on the Shire's Nyabing **administration** (15KW from 72x275W panels) and **depot** (10KW from 48x275W panels) buildings, providing for reductions of carbon dioxide emissions (from *municiple electricity production*) of ~22,037kgCO2/year and ~13,097kgCO2/year from the two buildings and associated cost savings from electrivty bills for the two buildings of ~\$7,346/year and ~\$4,366/year.

This project is a great demonstration of a sustainable energy system so anyone interested in viewing the setup are welcome for an inspection, contact us for details.

Our drainage planning report will be available in February. Elevation survey's (UAV drone image & ground RTK) are almost complete at the 2 demo sites adjacent to townsites of Nyabing (S.Crosby's) and Lake Grace (S.Slarke's) . This project was to help farmers better plan for the placement and design of soil excavation works for areas with poor surface water drainage.

The Farm Water Grants, a state program, which provided **rebates** to farm businesses for non-scheme water infrustracture such as tanks, dams, etc was **discontinued** at the end of the 2017/2018 and grants approved up to this date have until November next year to claim works. I praise the 41 farm businesses who secured these rebates through our NRM/Landcare service (*via water audits*) to improve their non-scheme sustainable on-water supplies from harvesting, storage and distribution of rainwater and runoff.

Fairly importantly to note however the **Farm Water Supply Planning Scheme**, which involves water audits (*was a prerequisite for the now discontinued rebates*) is still available at 50% of auditors cost, capped at \$1,000+GST per farm business. Contact us if you are interested in an water audit of your farm, to plan for your own water works.

Members from the Nyabing Farm Improvement Group (NFIG) think the two varieties would go well together due to their different maturing times and NFIG are keen to do heaps more with pastures and soil amelioration, so contact us if you would like to share some ideas.

Fox (& rabbit) eradication is recommended in the district due to impacts on our valuable sheep industry, but also due to risk to native fauna populations. 1080 Baiting is suggested at least twice a year to ensure on-farm control.

We secured DPIRD to run 1080 baiting accreditation workshops in Newdegate, Nyabing and Katanning on 26th & 27th July. **If you missed the workshops we will be running more in the new year, so please contact us to register your interest.**

CEO's Corner

AGRN: 743 Flood Event

With the exception of the causeway on Magenta Road all work has been completed, to reinstate our roads to the condition they were prior to the February 2017 flood event. Culvert cleaning works were finished last week. All audits have been finalized on all sectors.

The causeway on Magenta Road is proposed to be sealed in January 2018, when the shire's sealing program is being undertaken.

Shire of Lake Grace Digital Census Survey

It was very disappointing to see the draft results of the Digital Census Survey. A total of 40 surveys were completed, which included one from outside the Shire of Lake Grace. Of these 57.5% were Business responses and 42.5% home responses, a total response of 8.3%. To indicate a justifiable demand statement, the target response to achieve this is a minimum of 20%.

2018 ALGA National Local Roads and Transport Congress

On 20 – 22 November 2018, Shire President Cr Jeanette De Landgraft and I attended the 2018 ALGA National Local Roads and Transport Congress held in Alice Springs.

The theme of this year's Congress was Connecting Transport Networks Now and to support this a number of different sessions were held focusing on: Implementing the National Freight and Supply Chain Strategy, Land Transport Marketing Reform, Technology is Changing How We Travel, Realizing Regional and Industrial Benefits from Inland Rail, The Challenge of Delivering Integrated Transport and Land-use Planning, Sustaining our Regional Airports and Stepping up Safety on our Local Roads.

Harvest Road Safety

Council has agreed to place a speed restriction on gravel roads again this harvest. The following notice will be distributed.

80km Restrictions - Gravel Roads

All vehicles greater than 4.5 tonnes are restricted to a maximum speed of 80 km/hr on all gravel roads within the Shire of Lake Grace from 1 November to 31 December 2018 inclusive.

This is to assist with road safety and road preservation over the harvest period. Please be alert and considerate of other roads users.

Harvest brings more grain trucks on our gravel roads, take care, be aware of other roads users and road signs.

All road users be aware of Shire maintenance vehicles on roads in your area throughout harvest.



- Do not speed. Abide by traffic management signs where roadworks are taking place.

- Shire road works locations are subject to change for emergency repairs, be aware at all times.

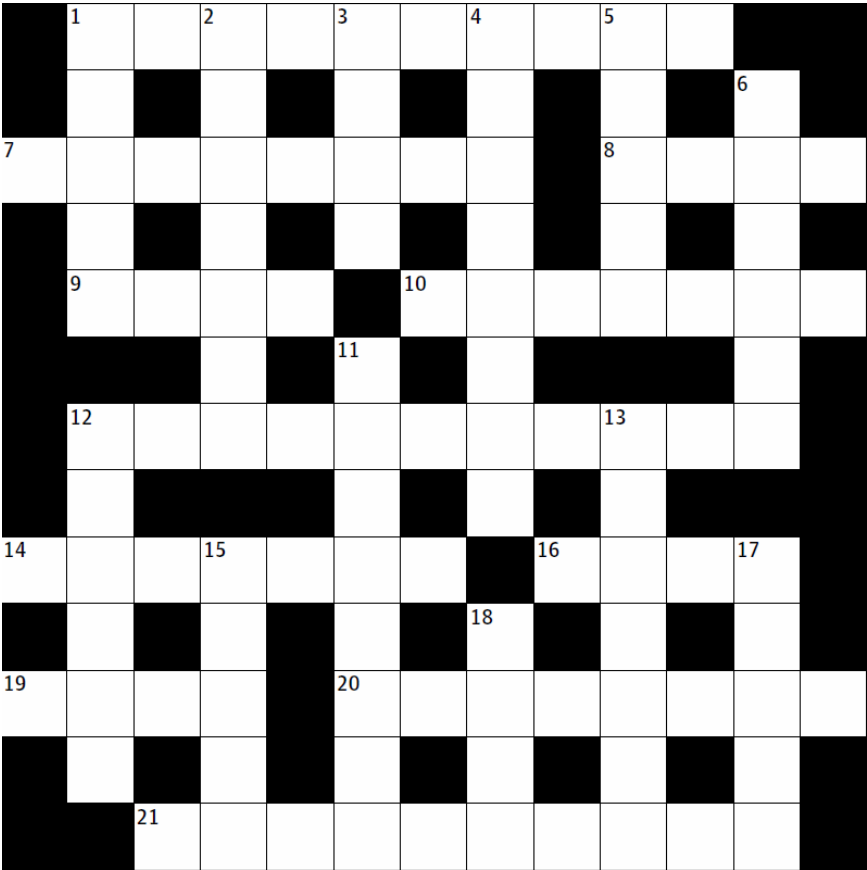

Mango Chutney

Ingredients


- 3 just-ripe mangoes, peeled, stoned, coarsely chopped
- 2 brown onions, coarsely chopped
- 1 cup (250ml) apple cider vinegar
- 2 cups (440g) white sugar
- 1 tablespoon ginger, finely grated
- 2 teaspoons cumin seeds
- 1 teaspoon ground coriander
- 1 teaspoon mixed spice
- Pinch of ground cloves



Method

1. Place the mango, onion, vinegar, sugar, ginger, cumin, coriander, mixed spice and cloves in a heavy-based saucepan. Bring to the boil over a high heat. Reduce heat to medium-low and cook, stirring occasionally, for 1 hour or until mixture thickens. Remove from heat.
2. Carefully divide hot chutney between warm sterilised jars and seal. Turn upside down for 2 mins. Turn upright and set aside to cool completely.
