Under 500 shark deterrent subsidies remaining

More than 3,000 Western Australian surfers and divers now have better protection at WA beaches thanks to the McGowan Government's world-first personal shark deterrent device subsidy.

The McGowan Government's personal shark deterrent program, which began in May 2017, has enabled Western Australians to access a \$200 rebate on scientifically proven devices through registered retail outlets.

At the start of the program, one device qualified for the subsidy - this was the FREEDOM7™. A second device, the FREEDOM+ Surf, was added to the program a year later (May 2018) after university testing showed it significantly reduced the risk of an encounter with a shark.

Last month, the shark deterrent subsidies were extended by a further 500 with \$100,000 committed as part of the McGowan Government's comprehensive shark mitigation strategy. In the lead up to Christmas, demand grew with 375 devices purchased over the festive period.

Of the 3,000 devices claimed so far about 400 devices have been purchased by surfers, while divers have snapped up the rest of the subsidised devices.

Personal deterrents for surfers and divers help Western Australians bring their sea sense to the beach and stay safe. The Sea Sense campaign, aims to inform ocean users how best they can use the strategies that are in place to help stay safe and enjoy the beach with confidence.

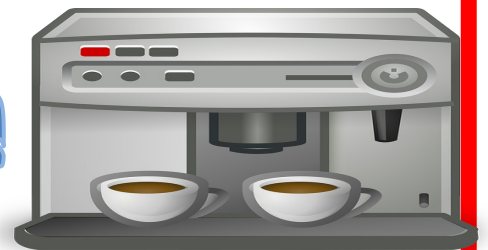
SharkSmart's shark activity map has been improved as part of the campaign. This is the place for water users to get information about shark sightings, tagged shark detections, alerts and safety features at WA beaches.

Water users are urged to help each other by reporting shark sightings to the Water Police on 9442 8600. This ensures that SharkSmart and the Surf Life Saving WA Twitter service can alert the community, and beach managers can close beaches if necessary.

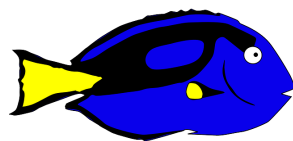

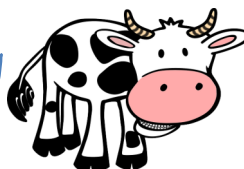

Making good farm decisions before ‘rolling the dice’

Past negative experiences can have a major influence on future decisions, sometimes resulting in significant missed opportunities.

However, a structured approach to making complex and sometimes difficult decisions can help in making a good decision, according to Nicon Rural Services consultant Cam Nicholson.

Mr Nicholson will stress that decision making is a skill that can be learnt and practised when he addresses the upcoming Grains Research and Development Corporation (GRDC) Farm Business Updates in Western Australia. Designed to enhance grower and adviser knowledge of farm business issues, to help with effective planning and management, Updates will be held in Tambellup on February 12, Lake Grace on February 13 and Moora on February 14.

Mr Nicholson, of Geelong, Victoria, says that while some decisions are habitual, not requiring much thought, others appear more difficult due to a range of issues such as not knowing all the facts; there being many pros and cons to weigh up; severe consequences from making a wrong decision; or a strong emotional element.

“Yet we still need to make a decision, even if it is do nothing at all,” he said.

“At the Update events I will focus on providing background information and tools to assist growers and industry personnel to make better tactical or operational decisions.”

Mr Nicholson says decisions are influenced by our ‘head’ – the logical or orderly approach to analysing and solving a problem; the ‘heart’ – the emotional influence on decisions; and the ‘gut’ – the intuitive influence on a decision shaped by our experiences and knowledge.

“The more difficult or complex a decision is, the more we rely on experience or the gut to inform the decision,” he said.

“Our temperament also influences our decision making, and most growers have a temperament

that naturally defaults to relying more on the gut and heart than the head.” (Mr Nicholson speaks about grower personality types in a GRDC podcast at bit.ly/2TxdI2X).

- Stephen Park, Pacer Legal: Labour arrangements forum – Are you compliant? What is at risk? What you need to do next. Session to include questions and answers with a grower case study
- Susan Brumby, National Centre for Farmer Health: Sustaining farm family businesses – your health is critical.

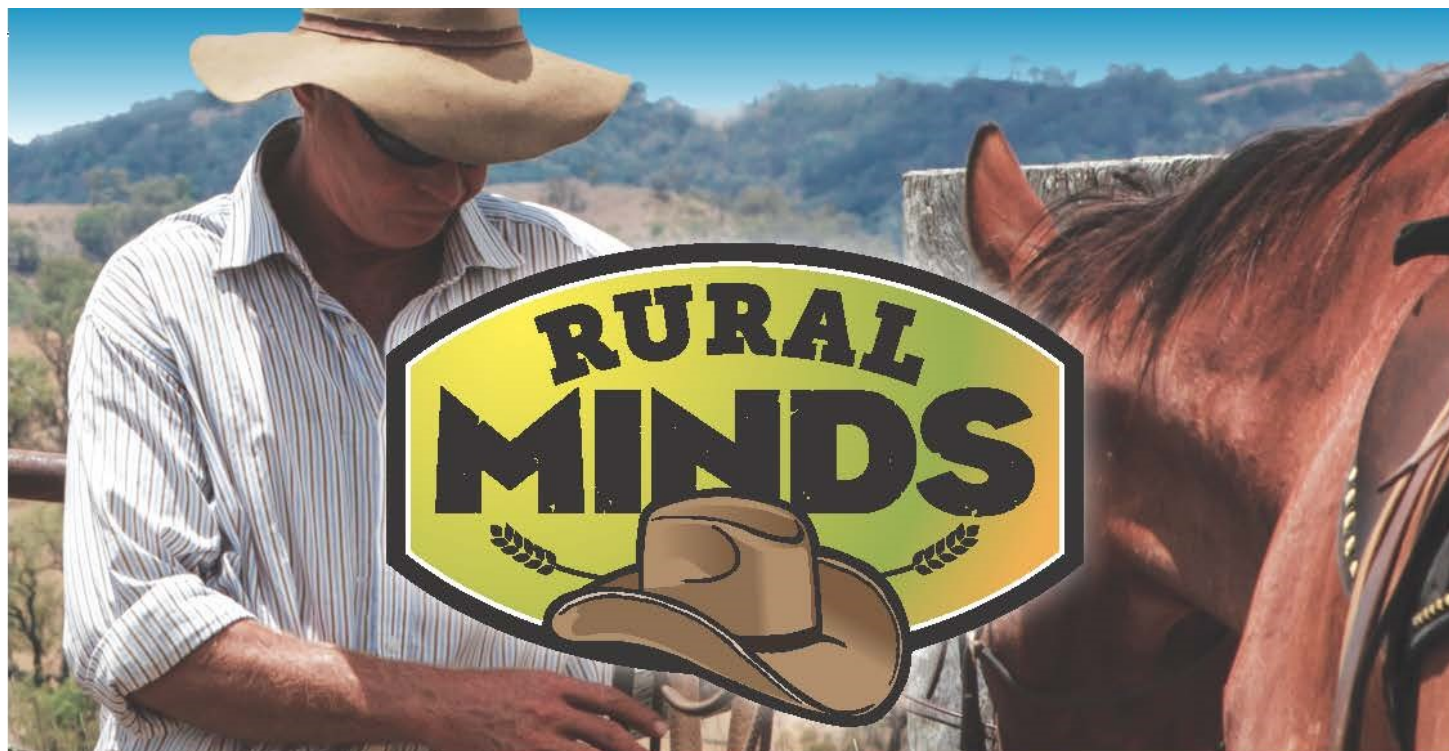

Home gardeners urged to look out for pest plant

The Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development is urging home gardeners to hand in a prohibited plant mistakenly sold in Western Australia over summer.

Callisia repens, commonly known as creeping edge plant, is present in other States but is prohibited in Western Australia due to its potential environmental impact. Gardeners who recently purchased a *Callisia Pink Lady* from Bunnings stores should return it to their store of purchase for a full refund.

Department invasive species priority weeds manager Kay Bailey said the plant was sold at stores in the metropolitan area and regional areas including Albany, Kalgoorlie, Geraldton, Bunbury and Busselton. "It is a long-lived herbaceous plant with creeping stems forming dense mats of vegetation," Ms Bailey said. "This species grows into dense mats creating problems across a wide range of environments. It is spread by stem segments and seeds, which means it is easily spread via dumped garden waste."



Ms Bailey said the department was working with Bunnings to raise customer awareness and locate these plants. "We are working to recover about 800 plants which were sold during the December and January period," she said.

Callisia repens leaves are densely clustered along the stems but gradually become smaller and more distant from each other along the flowering stems. These small leaves (1-4 cm long) are usually green, often with numerous tiny purple spots or purplish margins. It has small white flowers.

The diverse event offered something of interest to both past and present members of the community with the 'Bush Engineers Tractor Museum' a lasting reminder to all future residents of the ingenuity and enterprise of the towns farming pioneers.

The Bush Engineers Tractor Museum has given the town of Lake King a focal point and encourages tourists to stop when travelling through the town.

The interactive display has brought to life the unique history of the homemade tractors of the area. It provides a visual and oral resource for surrounding schools and all those with an interest to learn about our local history.

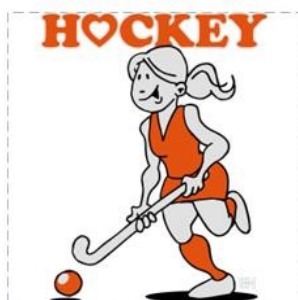

Make sure your donations go to legitimate charities

Western Australians are well known for their generosity but donors need to ensure that they are dealing with a licensed organisation to ensure their money reaches the intended recipients.

Always ask for identification from door-to-door charity collectors and, if you do donate to them, get a receipt. Times for door-to-door collections for a charitable purpose are between 9am and 6pm Monday to Saturday. Generally no collections are allowed on Sundays and Public Holidays.

Any organisation or club collecting money or goods from the public for charitable purposes needs to be licensed under the *Charitable Collections Act*, which is administered by Consumer Protection.

Well-meaning community members trying to raise money for others can end up inadvertently doing the wrong thing because they are unaware of the need to get a licence or to ask an established charity to work under their licence and supervision.

There is no fee required to obtain a licence and applications are reviewed by the Charitable Collections Advisory Committee. This committee consists of five independent members appointed by the Governor of Western Australia, it meets monthly to consider new applications or make recommendations to the Minister about charity licensing matters.

As a condition of holding a licence, the charity has to lodge financial statements to show money is being spent as it should be, and that only reasonable operating costs are deducted. Making charities accountable in this way also helps to protect them from criticism about funds not being used appropriately.

However, it's important to be aware that organisations collecting and receiving money from the public for non-charitable purposes do not need a licence. This includes social and sporting clubs, schools or kindergartens, which raise funds for their own use.

Tip for donors:

- Ask face-to-face collectors for proof of identity and permission to collect, such as a street collection permit or authorisation letter from a licensed charity.
- Report unlicensed charity collections to Consumer Protection or complain to the relevant crowd funding website if you think a campaign is a scam.
- Haven't heard of a charity before? Check WA's licensed charities register at www.consumerprotection.wa.gov.au before donating.

Tips for collectors:

- To run a one-off, short-term fundraiser, approach an existing licensed charity, such as a Rotary Club, to ask to collect under their authority.
- For crowd funding campaigns we recommend [Everyday Hero](http://EverydayHero.com.au), which connects the fundraising campaign to established charities.
- Charitable organisations wishing to authorise fundraising activities under their charity licence should download the guidance pack from our website.

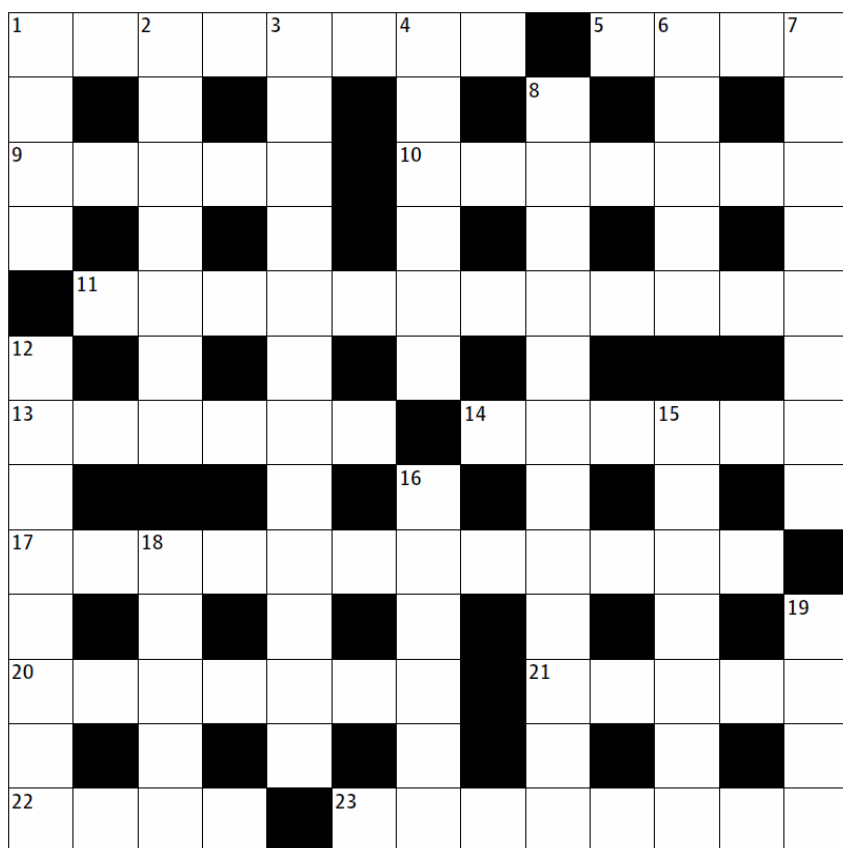

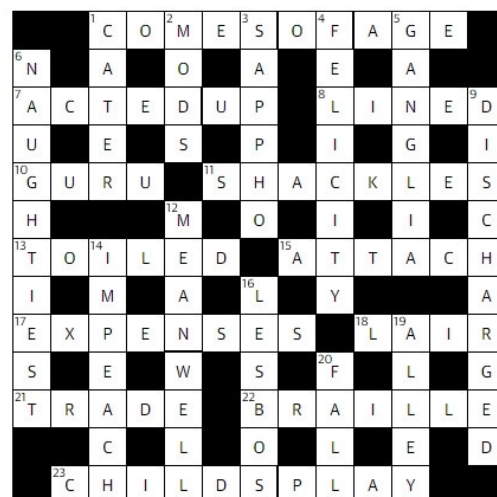

Zucchini Fritters

Ingredients

- 6 Zucchini
- 1 cup plain flour
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 200g crumbled feta
- 3 whisked eggs
- Pepper
- 2 tsp salt
- 4 finely chopped green shallots
- 1 cup grated parmesan
- 1/3 cup chopped dill
- Sour cream
- 1/2 cup cornflour
- 1/3 cup olive oil



Method

1. Grate 6 zucchinis and place in a colander. Sprinkle with 2 tsp salt and stand for 10 minutes. Squeeze out as much liquid as possible and place in a large bowl.
2. Add 1 cup of plain flour, 1/2 cup of cornflour, 1 tsp baking powder, 4 finely chopped green shallots, 200g crumbled feta, 1 cup grated parmesan, 3 whisked eggs, 1/3 cup dill and pepper to taste.
3. Heat 1/3 cup olive oil in a non-stick frying pan over a medium heat. When hot, drop tablespoons of the mixture into the oil and cook for 2 minutes on each side or until golden and cooked through.
4. Transfer to a plate. Cover to keep warm. Repeat with remaining mixture. Serve with sour cream and dill.
