## Water supply under pressure

When you turn on a tap you expect water to come out and the majority of the time little thought goes into the journey that water takes to get into our households. That thinking was challenged on the 18<sup>th</sup> January when the Water Corporation locked seven standpipes within the Shire to ensure that the town was still receiving adequate drinking water supply.

Lake Grace's water comes from the Harris River Dam near Collie. Travelling via Kulin the reticulation system doesn't just supply Lake Grace, there is a series of water supply systems that flow west and south to farmlands and also eastwards supplying Newdegate and farmlands along the way. This source also supplies to Varley and Lake King.

With the shire having received very limited rainfall and next to no runoff, dam levels on farm were dwindling. Hot weather coupled with low to non-existent farm supplies put extra pressure on the water supply, with the system unable to keep up with the demand.

The decision to lock standpipes was met with plenty of negative feedback however from this situation there is a growing awareness that water supply is the responsibility of many stakeholders; the community, local government and state government agencies. Although the standpipes were locked there were no restrictions placed on the farmlands that receive scheme water and the

standard garden watering restrictions remained in place for the townships.

As per the Emergency Farmland Water Response Plan, standpipes are designed as an emergency off-farm water supply with landholders expected to largely remain self-sufficient; however it is recognised that it is important that these supplies are available particularly in respect of livestock needs. Community dams and tanks are intended to be accessed initially with the piped water (standpipes) provided as a source of emergency water for those landholders whose properties are not connected to the pipeline.

Residents that require access to water for farming are strongly encouraged to contact the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation (DWER) on 1800 780 300 or email [ruralwater@water.wa.gov.au](mailto:ruralwater@water.wa.gov.au). DWER is the responsible government agency that manages emergency farmland water if it is needed from off-farm sources. Until the standpipes were locked DWER had received no indication from households within our shire that on farm water supplies were running low.

A request was put out via the 8th November issue of the Lakes Link asking for farmers to contact the Shire office to register their concerns regarding on farm stock watering issues, low emergency supplies and a high need for carting for livestock watering over summer months. Unfortunately there was no feedback from this request, perhaps there needs to be a multi pronged approach to the dissemination of information.

As most would know government departments within WA have had their budgets and staffing numbers decimated, this has resulted in a portion of their work being pushed down onto local governments. Because of this it is critical that there are open lines of communication between the farming community and the Shire as it is through the shire that the Water Response Plan

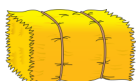

is put into action. If they're getting no feedback there is little they can do.

Six days after the standpipes were locked and with the town supply no longer under threat the Water Corporation re-opened six of the seven standpipes. The Water Corporation will continually monitor water use, and residents should be aware that local government standpipes may be locked again at short notice, if there is a large draw down on the local water supply scheme.

Notification of standpipe closures will be given via the Shire of Lake Grace's SMS notification system. If you wish to receive these notifications contact the Shire of Lake Grace on 9890 2500 to be added. An update will also be posted on the Water Corporation's homepage at [www.watercorporation.com.au](http://www.watercorporation.com.au) DWER is working with the Water Corporation and the Shire of Lake Grace to establish additional non-drinking water

supply alternatives within the Shire of Lake Grace for farming and other commercial uses. Water will be pumped to the Footy dams for farmers to access in the Lake Grace area. The Water Corporation is also in the throes of connecting Newdegate's old drinking supply for farmers to access. Lake King is undergoing repairs to pump and piping to connect to a standpipe. DWER have supplied a list of tanks, dams and bores that are available throughout the shire; if you need a copy of this please contact the Shire of Lake Grace or the Lake Grace CRC.

DWER have sent out surveys requesting information from farmers for their estimated needs for domestic, stock and spray water. These surveys are available at the CRC and also the Shire.

As we move into February, the hottest and driest month of the year it is critical that everyone is conservative with their use of water.

## Grains, Seeds and Hay Industry Funding Scheme

### **Are you interested in the biosecurity of Western Australia's agricultural industries?**

Western Australian producers and other stakeholders in the dairy, beef, grain/seed, hay, sheep and/or goat industries and respective supply chains are invited to apply for positions on Industry Funding Scheme Management Committees.

Industry Funding Schemes enable agricultural industries to raise funds to address priority pests and diseases at a whole-of-industry level.

The schemes are industry-driven and overseen by a Management Committee made up of producers and other stakeholders with appropriate industry knowledge and expertise.

Members of the committees are appointed by the Minister for Agriculture and Food for a period of up to three years. Support is provided to the schemes and management committees by the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development.

From 1 July 2019, there will be vacancies on the following Management Committees:

Cattle Industry Funding Scheme (6 positions)

Grains, Seeds and Hay Industry Funding Scheme (5 positions)

Sheep and Goat Industry Funding Scheme (4 positions)

Committees meet quarterly on dates agreed by members, and members are remunerated, including sitting fees and travel expenses.

The committee terms of reference, the selection criteria for members of the Management Committees, and guidelines for expressions of interest are available on the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development website at [agric.wa.gov.au](http://agric.wa.gov.au). ## Scientists test smartphone cameras in crops to nab pests

Smartphones are being trialled by Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development researchers to more effectively track and combat crop pests.

Results from trials using smartphones to monitor for crop contaminants such as weed seeds and snails will be outlined at the 2019 Grains Research and Development Corporation Grains Research Update, Perth on 25 and 26 February.

A 'GrainCam' device was trialled at a Mount Barker site to scan for potential contaminants during harvest. Department senior research officer John Moore said knowing where the source of a contaminant was within a paddock would allow growers to target control or avoid heavily infested areas during harvest.

"Continuous detection can help growers to quickly identify new unwanted pests at low levels, before they can easily be detected manually or have become well established," Mr Moore said. "The use of smartphones offers an inexpensive and readily available option for growers."

The trial involved a small auger being placed at the outlet of the harvester's bubble auger to deliver small samples of grain onto a metal plate in front of the smartphone camera that could capture high resolution photos with GPS locations. The study found GrainCam could be deployed under field conditions but further evaluation was required to ensure detection models were robust under a range of conditions.

Researchers also used image analysis of field photographs taken with mobile phones attached to farm equipment to map snail distribution and density within a paddock.

Department research officer Svetlana Micic said the method could provide an inexpensive technique for mapping snail distribution. "This methodology was shaped by growers at meetings held by the Regional Cropping Solutions Network in the Albany and Esperance regions in 2017, who wanted inexpensive technologies for snail control that could be adapted for their farming system," Ms Micic said.

An app was trialled on a site at Gairdner, recording the GPS location and triggering a mobile phone camera when it was pointing towards the ground. This allowed the phone to be mounted onto any wheel, and the combination was called the 'WheelCam'.

An analysis of the images taken using computer algorithms to detect snails was then tested and used to make contour maps of the distribution and density of snails. This technology will allow growers to target areas with high snail numbers and avoid baiting areas with few or no snails. Ms Micic said further refinement was needed to determine the best combination of input data and model, to most accurately assess snails on the ground.

## 200,000 reasons to get active & be healthy

New Cancer Council Australia funded research has shown over 200,000 cancer cases could be avoided in Australia over the next 25 years if all Australian adults maintained a healthy weight and met the physical activity guidelines for cancer prevention. The forecast, released this World Cancer Day (4 February), has prompted a call for Government to take stronger measures to help Australians live a healthier lifestyle.

The study, conducted by QIMR Berghofer Medical Research Institute, aimed to quantify the proportion of cancer cases that would be potentially avoidable if the prevalence of overweight/obesity and inactivity could be reduced in Australia.

Researchers found that if all Australian adults maintained a healthy weight, as many as 190,500 overweight/obesity-related cancers could be prevented over a 25-year period.

A further 19,200 inactivity-related cancers could also potentially be avoided if every Australian adult undertook at least five hours of moderate intensity physical activity per week.

Professor Sanchia Aranda, CEO Cancer Council Australia said, "With more than two thirds of adults considered overweight or obese, and nearly half insufficiently active, these results show we have the potential to prevent a significant number of cancers in Australia and potentially save thousands of lives."

The cancers with the highest number of potentially avoidable cases in the study include postmenopausal breast, endometrium, bowel and kidney cancers.

Professor Aranda continued, "While it is important for people to look after themselves by doing regular physical activity and eating a balanced diet, Australia's obesity problem cannot be placed entirely on the individual's shoulders.

"In the lead up to the next federal election, both sides of politics need to recognise their responsibility to help protect children from mass marketing of junk food; improve the Health Star

Rating food labelling system to provide simpler, more informed choices to consumers; and promote more public education about the benefits of good nutrition and exercise."

Professor Aranda explained that individuals can also take steps to reduce their risk of lifestyle-related cancers.

"Improving your diet can be as simple as eating more fruit, vegetables and whole grains. An easy measure is the 2 & 5 goal - two fruits and five serves of vegetables every day. When it comes to physical activity, if you can't commit to five hours of physical activity per week it's important to remember that every little bit counts so making an effort to be more active each day can still lead to better health."

World Cancer Day is an initiative of the Union for International Cancer Control (UICC) held on 4 February each year that raises awareness of cancer globally. The study has been published in the International Journal of Cancer. It was funded by Cancer Council Australia and the National Health and Medical Research Council.

Cancer Council Australia makes the following recommendations for nutrition and physical activity in support of the Dietary Guidelines for Australian Adults and the National Physical Activity Guidelines for Australians:

1. Aim for five hours of moderate physical activity each week, such as a brisk walk, recreational swimming, dancing or even pushing a stroller
2. Eat plenty of vegetables, legumes and fruit: five or more servings of vegetables and two or more servings of fruit per day
3. Make most of your cereals wholegrain
4. Eat meat in moderation - no more than three to four servings of, lean red meat each week and avoid processed meats
5. Select lower fat foods like lean meat and reduced-fat dairy products, and try using low-fat cooking methods like grilling instead of frying
6. Choose low-salt products - flavour foods with herbs and spices instead of salt.



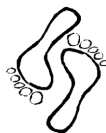

## CEO's Corner

I would like to start by extending a warm welcome and my thanks to our Deputy Chief Executive Officer, Belinda Knight for stepping into the Acting Chief Executive Officer position whilst I was away on leave. Belinda has done a great job having only just joined the Shire at the start of the year.

Thanks also to all of the staff for the support offered to Belinda during this time and for embracing the changes that Belinda is implementing.

### Farm Water Shortage Survey

The Department of Water & Environmental Regulation (DWER) have released a Farm Water Shortage Survey. It is critical that anyone with livestock completes this survey immediately. Non return of the survey form assumes that you have adequate water supplies for this summer. The survey can be found on the Shire Website or at your local CRC.

Completed surveys have started coming in to DWER and the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) have allocated a staff member to collate and map the areas of concern and the estimated water needs for the district. Please ensure the effort is made to complete the survey as water is not being guaranteed from local government operated standpipes, by Water Corporation.

### Farm Water Carting

Concern has been raised with the Shire that road trains are to be carting water to dams for the watering of livestock. It is a known fact that evaporation is generally regarded as the most significant contributor to water loss in farm dams in WA.

Given the water shortages we are faced with this summer, everyone carting water for livestock, is encouraged to store this water within tanks on your farm. This will ensure that the majority of water carted is available for the livestock and isn't wasted through evaporation.

### Available Water Sources Emergency Farmland Water – DWER Update

DWER provided the following update on available water sources within the Shire of Lake Grace as at 8 February;

- Dunn Rock – Taylor Road: estimated 10,000kL pump repairs and access to 2nd dam will commence Monday 11 February.
- Cuffy's – South East Newdegate: estimated 7,000kL

- Magenta North – Ardler Road: estimated 10,000kL
  - South East Newdegate – Magenta Road: estimated 5,000kL
  - East Newdegate – Machetti's Tank: estimated 1,000kL low source
  - Lake King Tank & Standpipe: Dam level low, plumbing contractor arranged to install an off switch to avoid over flow to Lake King Irrigation Dam
  - Newdegate Town Dam (Water Corp Dam): Water Corp working to install a temporary Emergency Farm water supply
  - Lake Grace Town Dam (Water Corp Dam): Water Corp working to install a temporary Emergency Farm water supply
  - Mt Madden Bore (MM3) – near Mt Madden Dam: Is suitable for livestock. Bore is equipped with piping and pump. Farmers will need to take own generator to operate the bore.
  - Mt Madden Bore (MM6) – near Mt Madden Dam: Is capped and not available as it is too salty (~1,454mS/m)
  - Mt Madden Dam – South Lake King: estimated 13,600kL full and available, swipe card access
- Other sources not assessed but possibly available:
- Sugg Rock: Capacity 10,000kL status unknown
  - Purtna Rock Tanks: Capacity 3,600kL status unknown
  - Dingo Rock: Status Unknown
  - Varley Dam: Capacity 25,000kL status unknown

### Communities Combating Pests and Weeds Impact During Drought Program

The Shire of Lake Grace has received an invitation from the Department of Agriculture and Water Resources to submit an application for a grant under the 'Communities Combating Pests and Weeds Impact during Drought Program'. Some of the main objectives of the programme are to assist communities to manage the impacts of wild dogs, vertebrate pest animals and weeds during drought, to contribute to the government's broader biosecurity objectives, and to limit the negative impact of wild dogs, pest animals and weeds on agricultural production.

The Shire of Lake Grace is keen to accept this invitation and would use this grant to work with our communities on eradicating Caltrop in our public spaces and recreational areas.

Caltrop is a weed that grows flat along the ground stemming from a central tap root to about 1m long. Leaves are oppositely arranged and flowers are yellow. Flowers then turn to woody burrs with sharp rigid spines which split into five wedge shaped segments when ripe. These spikey thorns contain 20 seeds, which could mean as many as 8000 seeds are generated from a single plant and these seeds remain viable under the soil for years! Controlling Caltrop is important, as it is can damage the feet of animals as well their mouths, stomach and intestines. It is toxic to sheep and may present similar issues to our native fauna.

We will be working with our local community groups to put together an application for this grant, for which the closing date is 15 February 2019.

### Banners in the Terrace 2019

Each year the Shire of Lake Grace participates in the WA Local Government 'Banners in the Terrace' Competition. This competition is one of the State's largest single community arts projects and invites local communities to design a banner that represents their local government area. The banners are then displayed

in St Georges Terrace in August during Local Government Week.

Last year our banner was designed by the Newdegate CWA and they did a marvellous job!

## Recipe Page

### Cheats Vegetarian Paella

#### Ingredients


- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 onion, sliced
- 2 garlic cloves, sliced
- 1 pinch each saffron & chilli flakes
- 1/2 teaspoon smoked paprika
- Finely grated zest and juice of 1 lemon
- 1 cup (220g) medium-grain rice
- 1/2 cup (125ml) white wine
- 400g can cherry tomatoes
- 300ml vegetable stock, heated
- 4 chargrilled artichokes, quartered
- 1 bunch asparagus, blanched, trimmed
- 100g green beans, blanched
- Chopped flat-leaf parsley, to serve



#### Method

1. Heat oil in a large frypan over medium heat. Add onion, garlic, saffron and chilli flakes, then season and cook, stirring, for 3-4 minutes until onion starts to soften. Add the paprika and lemon zest and cook, stirring, for 1 minute or until fragrant. Add the rice and cook for 1-2 minutes, stirring to coat the grains. Add the wine, cherry tomatoes and hot stock, stirring to combine. Bring to a simmer, stirring, then cover the surface closely with baking paper. Reduce heat to medium-low. Cook for 12-15 minutes until rice is just cooked.
2. Add artichoke, asparagus and beans, then cook, uncovered, for 2 minutes to warm through. Squeeze over lemon juice, garnish with parsley and serve.
