Newdegate Bowls Club Hosts 30th Men's Classic



Held over the two days of Tuesday 19th & Wednesday 20th February 2019 the Newdegate Bowls club hosted for the 30th consecutive year its annual Community Classic.

The event was started in March 1989 by the late AJ (Mick) Davey. Mick's concept was for the local community to sponsor a men's bowls tournament hosted by the local bowls club.

The Newdegate business community has been outstanding in its ongoing financial support of this event.

Mick Davey continued his involvement with the Newdegate Classic until his unfortunate passing in 2014. Mick created the format of play; Game 1, fours (14 ends) Game 2, Pairs (10 Ends) with half of the team playing pairs this allowed the hard working catering ladies of the Newdegate bowls club to feed lunch to half of the team not playing pairs. Game 3, Pairs (10 ends) enabling the unfed

bowlers to enjoy luncheon whilst watching the other half of their team play the second game of pairs. Game 4, another Fours match (14 ends) to complete the days play.

Then the social fun started under Mick's guidance, the money wheel was bought into operation, with a local rule anybody spinning the money wheel for prize money must tell a joke or forfeit \$10 of the money prize. This rule still applies today.

After serving an apprenticeship of ten years Mick Davey allowed his Son in Law, the late Neil (Boof) Harvey to take over the running of the Newdegate Classic in 1999. Boof and Mick conducted the classic together very successfully with "No bowler ever going hungry or thirsty", thanks to the many hard working club members supporting both Mick and Boof.

Be careful of baby snakes around your pets!

Please be aware that this is the time of year when snakes are hatching and that although very small (below is a baby dugite) these young snakes are extremely venomous.



Snake bites are a subject that we've brought up on several occasions on this page but nevertheless it's always worth keeping up to date with what to do just in case your pet is bitten.

If you suspect that your pet has been bitten by a snake you should immobilise them and try and keep them as quiet and calm as possible. It's vitally important that they receive immediate veterinary treatment. If you call your local vet and they don't answer head straight to their clinic or seek an alternative vet if possible. Do not wait for a return phone call, when dealing with a snake bite several minutes can make all the difference!

Do not waste time or put others at risk by trying to identify the snake. Individual species of snake often vary in colour and can be all but impossible to identify other than by experienced snake handlers. The signs of a snake bite are varied. They may show some or all of the following signs:

- Sudden weakness followed by collapse.
- Shaking or twitching of the muscles.
- Vomiting.
- Dilated pupils not responsive to light.
- Blood in the urine.
- In the later stages paralysis may occur.

Veterinary treatment varies with each individual

case, how severe the symptoms are and how rapidly the symptoms progress. Treatment usually consists of intravenous fluids and the administration of antivenom to neutralise the snake venom in the pet's body. Some patients can require multiple vials of antivenom. Around 80% of snake bite victims will survive if treated quickly. This percentage drops dramatically the longer the time between the bite occurring and treatment being sought.

Dogs are an inquisitive bunch so we strongly recommend walking them on a leash. Cats however are natural hunters and will attempt to sink their teeth in to practically anything that moves. To lessen the risk to your kitty try and keep long grass and debris in your garden to a minimum. To eradicate the risk entirely keep your cat indoors or build an outside cat run for playtime in the garden.

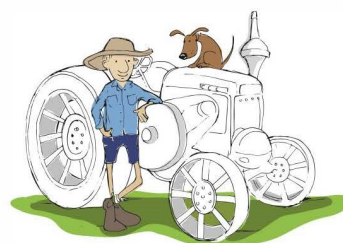



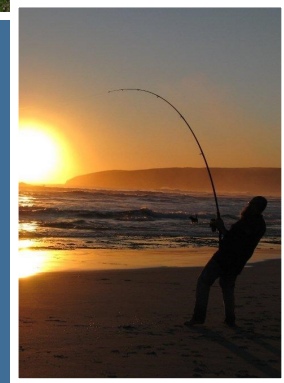

Grains Research Updates 2019: Potential for pulses in WA

The potential for increased pulse production in Western Australia will be the focus of a presentation at the 2019 Grains Research and Development Corporation (GRDC) Grains Research Update today.

Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development senior research officer Mark Seymour has invited Victorian research agronomist Jason Brand, of Agriculture Victoria, to co-present at the Updates on the potential for pulses in Western Australia.

Mr Seymour said as leader of GRDC's Southern Pulse Agronomy Program, Dr Brand delivered applied research that provides best management practices for new pulse varieties, such as lentil, field pea, chickpea and faba bean, in southern Australia.

"Pulse crops have been widely adopted in the Eastern States and recent innovations in agronomy and breeding could lead to further expansion onto sandier textured soils and soils with lower pH, such as in WA," Mr Seymour said.

"Recent advances include soil amelioration to alter soil conditions, plant breeding for tolerance to lower pH and a wider range of herbicides, and selection of rhizobia with greater tolerance to lower pH.

"Dr Brand's presentation will also discuss the implications of new traits on adaptation, crop physiology and management of pulses, and how they fit in WA."

Mr Seymour would provide context from his experience as project leader of the Tactical break crop agronomy project, with co-investment from GRDC, and examples of improvements in pulse adaptation and management from a WA perspective.

A panel discussion will follow, facilitated by Mr

Seymour and Dr Brand, featuring two Western Australian pulse growers who will talk about why they choose to grow pulses, which pulse crops they have grown and their experiences.

Ron Longbottom, of Cape Lagoon Farms at Grass Patch, has a long history growing field peas and in recent years has grown substantial areas of lentils, and Kojonup grower Ben Webb has included faba beans in his rotation.

The growers will be joined by Merredin-based

department development officer Greg Shea who has helped many pulse growers over the past 30 years and will highlight the recent experiences and potential of WA's chickpea industry.

Following brief presentations from each member of the panel, a question and answer session will allow members of the audience to ask questions from the floor.

Combining lime and gypsum boosts crop yield potential

Growers in low rainfall areas with predominantly acidic soils have the potential to increase wheat yields by up to 30 per cent by combining lime and gypsum applications to their soils.

Ongoing research by the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD), in collaboration with the University of Western Australia, is demonstrating that applying lime and gypsum together can be more effective in improving grain yield, than applying either soil ameliorant individually.

DPIRD researcher Gaus Azam will discuss the trial at the 2019 Grains Research and Development Corporation (GRDC) [Grains Research Update](#) in Perth on 25 and 26 February.

Dr Azam said while both lime and gypsum can have a positive effective on yield when applied individually, research was showing the combination of both ameliorants provided better results by increasing soil pH and improving the uptake of nutrients.

"Lime assists to increase the soil pH and decrease aluminium toxicity, which in turn improves the uptake of water and macronutrients including calcium and magnesium," Dr Azam said.

"Gypsum improves wheat yield by increasing the ionic strength of the soil and adds extra amounts

of sulphur and calcium and improves the uptake of micronutrients such as boron, manganese and zinc by the crop."

The research, invested by GRDC, has been underway for two seasons - 2017 and 2018 - on trial plots sown to Mace wheat in Kalannie. Soils in this area are naturally acidic.

The trials not only looked at the effect of lime and gypsum application on soil, but at whether it was more effective to incorporate the ameliorants by tillage or apply them as a surface application.

Dr Azam said for the 2017 season, yield results for trial plots where lime and gypsum were incorporated by tillage treatment were not as good as a surface application.

"Applying six tonnes of lime with three tonnes of gypsum as a surface application produced 30 per cent more grain or 1.04 tonnes per hectare (ha) grain yield, compared to the untreated control of 0.79 tonnes per ha," Dr Azam said.

"However, the 2018 results showed a change with lime and gypsum applied with tillage treatments, especially when applied at higher rates, outperforming the surface application.

"Incorporating the same amounts of lime and gypsum again in 2018, produced 23 per cent more grain or 2.05 tonnes per ha grain yield, compared to unameliorated results of 1.66 tonnes per ha."

Dr Azam expects incorporation of lime and gypsum together might continue to produce better yield results than surface application, as incorporation rapidly increased pH, reduced aluminium toxicity and increased nutrient uptake

The research will continue until the end of the 2020 season.

Dr Azam will also be speaking about the research at the GRDC Grains Research Update, Albany Zone, in Kendenup on 28 February.

Fixed Standpipes – Shire of Lake Grace

It is becoming more evident that not everyone is taking water through the standpipe swipe card system. When this occurs all ratepayers are impacted as we are not recovering enough funds to pay for the water taken from standpipes.

Given this, the shire will be installing surveillance cameras at the standpipes, where water is being taken in excess of card readings. This matter has been drawn to the attention of our local police who will assist in monitoring the cameras.

Emergency Farmland Water Response Plan – Dam Inspections

On Friday 22 February 2019, Councillors Hunt and Chappell and I inspected a number of Emergency Farmland Water Response Dams with Tracy Calvert, Manager Rural Water Planning DWER. The dams inspected were East of Newdegate, including Varley and Lake King. Tracey will be submitting a report on the water levels and negotiating with Water Corporation access to the Water Corporation Dams in Varley and Lake King.

If you haven't completed the Farm Water Shortage Survey and will need to cart water for stock or domestic purposes it is critical that the survey is submitted. Water supplies are limited.

Transfer from Water Corporation - Newdegate Railway Dam and Catchment

In November 2018 Council advised Water Corporation that we had an interest in acquiring the Newdegate Railway Dam and part of the Catchment on Reserve 20629. As part of this agreement, Water Corporation has also agreed that we can have the pipe that comes from the dams to the town. This is on the condition that the Shire pay for the main to be cut and capped to stop access to the town scheme water. The dam located on the Newdegate Wastewater Treatment Plant site be handed to Water Corporation and the pipe from that dam be capped.

Although Water Corporation are currently in the process of undertaking the transfer, I have requested that the capping of the main from the dam be undertaken to allow access to this water to maintain the Town and School ovals. We are still waiting on confirmation of this being able to occur prior to the legal transfer of the facility.

Water Corporation is not giving the Shire access to the Turkey Nest dam that is located next to the old Railway Dam.

Water Corporation – Non-Potable Water Standpipes

Advice is that the non-potable standpipe for Lake Grace will be operational next week. The standpipe in Newdegate is already in use. Water Corporation intend that the Shire of Lake Grace will monitor these standpipes with the installation of swipe card readers.

Discussions are being undertaken with the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation as to how this is going to occur. It appears that the monitoring of the non-potable standpipes will not be funded by Water Corporation.

Buying a used car? Do your checks before you write one.

Buying a second-hand car can be a smart way to save money, but it's important to be aware of the hidden risks that can come with used vehicles.

Most people assume a vehicle's odometer is a reliable measure of how far it has travelled, but this may not always be the case. Misrepresenting the number of kilometres a vehicle has travelled to attract a higher price is a calculated deception that takes advantage of an unsuspecting buyer and is a serious breach of consumer law.

If an odometer doesn't reflect the number of kilometres a vehicle has actually travelled, the necessary checks, services and repairs may not be carried out at the required times, potentially leaving unsuspecting consumers exposed to mechanical and safety issues.

There are now many methods to establish the true odometer reading of a vehicle, so those who engage in this type of sham will quickly be caught out.

In the past year, one of the worst cases of odometer tampering in WA saw a Maddington motor vehicle dealer & repairer fined \$30,000 and banned for two years from holding a dealer's licence or repair business licence, or managing a company that holds either licence, after he was found guilty of selling four vehicles with wound-back odometers.

Before buying a second-hand car, consider undertaking checks to ensure you are getting what you paid for.

You can have the vehicle inspected by a professional. They may be able to uncover inconsistencies between the condition of the vehicle and the odometer reading. For example, if the interior is worn, but the mileage is low, it could indicate tampering.

Check the car's log book history for records of odometer readings to ensure they are correct and consistent. You can also contact the dealer/repairer and ask them to check their records.

A government Personal Property Securities Register (PPSR) check can tell you whether a car has been stolen, has money owing on it or has ever been declared a repairable write-off, but it doesn't include an odometer reading check.

Never deal with people known to be unlicensed motor vehicle dealers. You can check whether a car dealer is licensed by doing a search on the Consumer Protection website: www.commerce.wa.gov.au/cp/licencesearch.

Illegal operators should be doxed in to Consumer Protection so we can put a stop to their activities. Unlicensed car dealers can be reported by emailing consumer@commerce.wa.gov.au or by calling 1300 30 40 54.

Motor vehicle buyers who believe they have been misled can lodge a complaint on the Consumer Protection website www.consumerprotection.wa.gov.au.

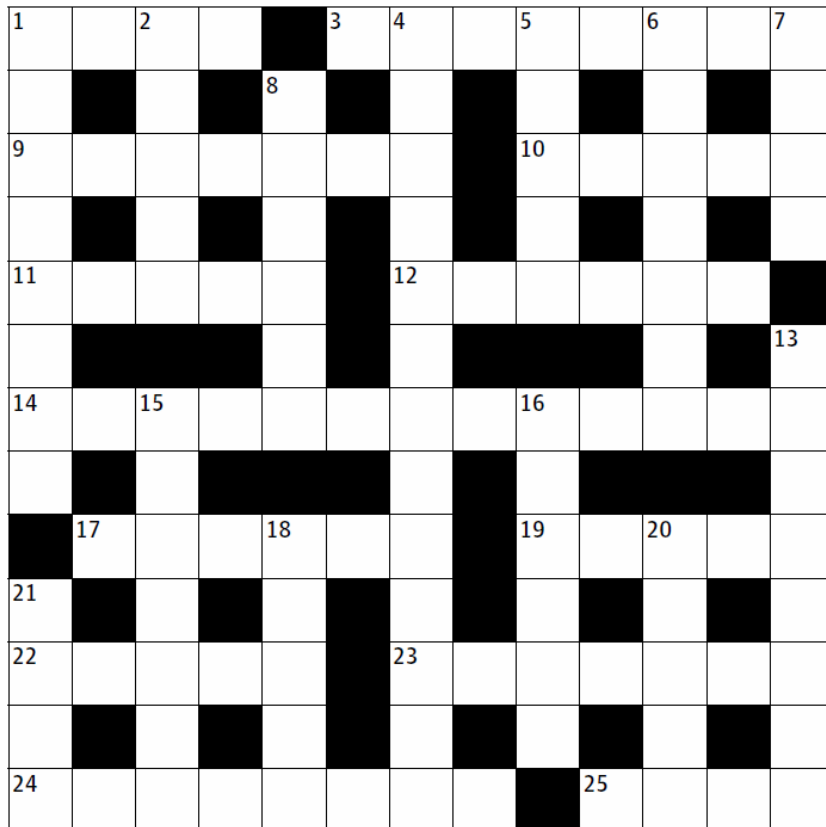

Recipe Page

Chicken Fried Rice

Ingredients

- Olive Oil
- 160g Chicken breast
- 2 medium eggs
- 2 cloves garlic
- 2tsp ginger, finely grated
- 80g bacon, finely sliced
- 200g prawns
- 2 green shallots, thinly sliced
- 1/2 cup peas, frozen
- 3 cups rice, boiled
- 2 tbs soy sauce
- 1 tbs oyster sauce
- 2 tsp sesame oil



Method

1. Put some oil in a pan and cook the chicken, turning occasionally, for 8-10 minutes or until cooked through. Transfer to a plate. Cool for 5 minutes before thinly slicing. Cover to keep warm.
2. Meanwhile, heat a wok over a high heat. Add oil and heat for 30 seconds. Add egg and swirl to coat the wok, Cook for 1-2 minutes or until just set. Transfer the egg to a board. Roll and thinly slice.
3. Reheat wok over a medium heat. Add more oil and heat for 30 seconds. Add garlic, ginger, bacon, prawns and half of the shallots. Stir-fry for 1-2 minutes or until prawns change colour and are just cooked through. Add peas, rice, soy and oyster sauces, sesame oil and chicken and stir fry for 1-2 minutes or until rice is heated through. Top rice with sliced egg and remaining shallots. Serve
