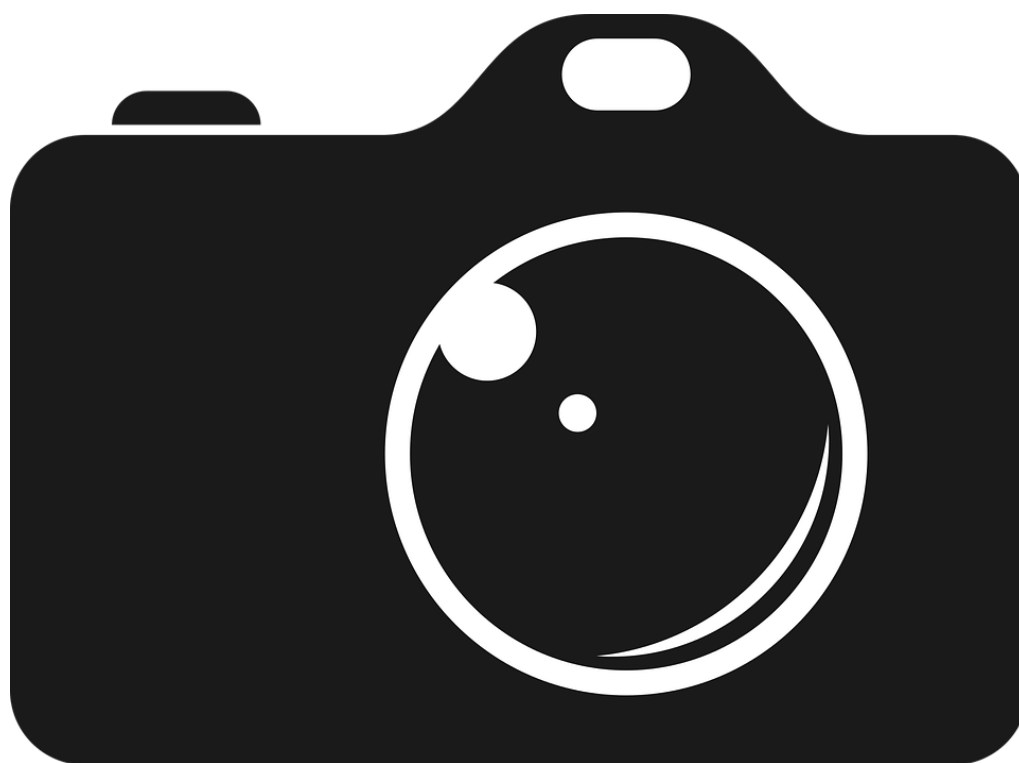

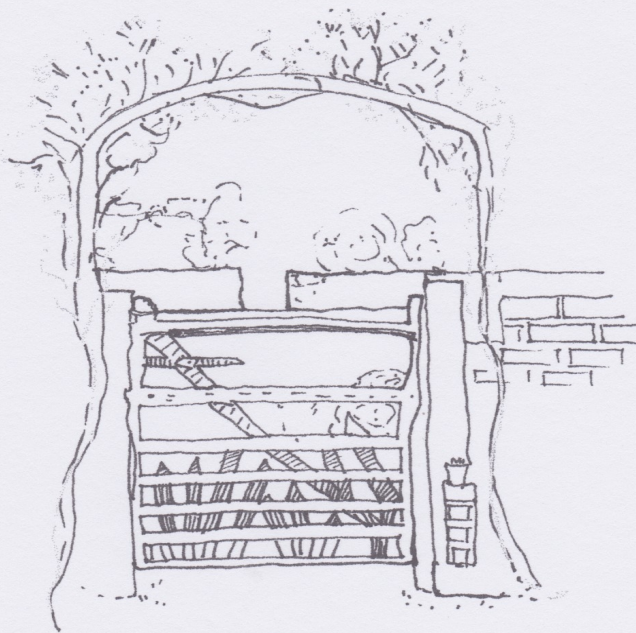

At last! Our newest and final police officer has arrived in Lake Grace. He is currently unpacking furiously getting his new home in order. PC **Scott OATRIDGE** will begin his time at Lake Grace this week and hopes to get around the traps and meet as many people as possible. I am sure you will all make him feel welcome. He will fill you all in on his background next article.

This week I am going to try a new format so any feedback will be appreciated. Also, let me know if there is anything you would like clarified that is police related or would like to know more about.

**Traffic News** - We had to deal with mainly crime this fortnight which prevented regular patrolling of the district and surrounds. However, when we did get out it was good to see that we didn't have to stop many people with regards to their driving, so keep up the good work.

I had an email from District Office (Albany) who oversee the whole Great Southern District as a whole (Lake Grace is just one small part of it). On review of the last three fatal crashes and numerous other serious crashes throughout the District, there is concern that drivers and passengers are **still failing to wear their seatbelts**. Out of the two of the three fatal crashes the failure to wear a seatbelt was a significant detriment to the fatality.

There really is no excuse not to put one on. It's simple, it should be the first thing you do - get into your car/truck and put your belt on.

Police conducted a vehicle and foot patrol of licenced premises within our subdistrict and all was very good in that respect. However, we did notice quite a few vehicles parked up outside the licenced premises with their windows down and

the **keys left in the ignition**. This is not only a bad habit to get into but it is also an offence. You cannot leave a vehicle unattended that is unsecured and you certainly can't leave the keys in it. I know that we all live in the country and it's never a problem - and yes, we should be able to leave our homes and vehicles unsecured because country towns are full of good people. But sadly those days are gone. Not doing so is an invitation for some miscreant to steal your vehicle. If the vehicle is insured, well it won't be if you've left the keys in it.

Further to this, I have observed some locals with children park their vehicles in town and then leave the vehicle to go inside a building or wander off to complete a task **leaving the kids in the vehicle with the engine running!** Can't do that either...

## Road Traffic Code 2000

Section 181. Making motor vehicle secure

(1) A driver of a motor vehicle shall not stop and leave the motor vehicle without first -

- (a) stopping the engine; and
- (b) effectively applying the brake; and
- (c) If weather or road conditions would prevent the effective operation of the brake — effectively restraining the vehicle's movements in another way.

*Modified penalty: \$50*

(2) If the driver of a motor vehicle stops and leaves the motor vehicle, and a person 16 years of age or older does not remain in or with the motor vehicle, the driver shall also secure the motor vehicle by -

- (a) locking the ignition, if any; and
- (b) removing the ignition key, if any; and



- (c) locking the doors — if the doors of the vehicle can be locked; and
- (d) securing the windows — if the windows of the vehicle can be secured, unless the driver has only temporarily left the motor vehicle to pay a fee for parking that motor vehicle.

*Modified penalty: \$50*

(4) For the purposes of this regulation -

- (a) a person leaves a vehicle if the person is more than 3 metres from the closest point of the vehicle; and
- (b) a window is considered secure even if it is open by up to 2 cm and no more.

I would hate to receive a call from a parent informing me their vehicle just got stolen with their kids in it.

**Operations** - May is upon us already and this is also the time when the **annual truck inspection “Operation AUSTRANS”** will occur. Date is yet to be confirmed but local police, along with a team of Main Roads inspectors, will be at a location near you pulling in and inspecting all heavy vehicles travelling throughout the district. So heavy vehicle operators - make sure your signage, lights, loads and vehicles are all serviceable in case you’re one of the lucky ones to be inspected. Scales will also be in use.

“Operation Bluesun” is nearly completed with only two visits left to complete. Local police have enjoyed this particular operation as it provided a good means of visiting many farms and catching up with the locals. As a result, we will be looking to continue the operation targeting those **firearm licence holders aged between 50 and 60** this time. “Bluesun” firearm inspections targeted firearms licence holders aged 60 and above. The operation was a great success with many licence records corrected and numerous firearms handed in for destruction due to unserviceability. We appreciated all the people we met and spoke to along with the cups of tea and biscuits.

As a result of the email from District Office regarding the non-use of seatbelts by drivers, we

will conduct a short operation within the sub-district to specifically target those not wearing seatbelts. As directed by District Office there will be **no cautions given** just infringements. I am letting you know now so you won’t be someone who gets caught.

**Crime - Stealing of steel rail and steel sleepers, value approximately \$80,000** - Police were notified by staff from ARC Infrastructure that between 10<sup>th</sup>–14<sup>th</sup> April 2019, from a site next to the rail line on the Lake Biddy Road in Lake Biddy, approximately 200 second hand sleepers were stolen. They were bundled up into packs of 10 with steel strapping. Two 44 gallon drums of fittings were also stolen. This totalled to about 25 tonne of product stolen.

The offenders returned again sometime between the 24<sup>th</sup> April to 1<sup>st</sup> May going to the same location and stealing 1200 metres of railway line (stacked up in 12m to 15m lengths).

Vehicle tracks were observed at the site. A telehandler or forked loader was used to load the rail onto a truck.

If anybody observed something suspicious around those dates, in particular a heavy vehicle with a load of rail coming through town, please let local police know and quote IR number 010519145415131.

Forensics were conducted on site and we are awaiting results.

I would like to thank all of those involved in the organisation of this event, Cr Peter Stoffberg for leading the minute's silence, the Lake Grace Police, St John Ambulance Volunteers and all of the community members that were in attendance.

### Outcome of Biosecurity Management of Plants and Weeds Grant Application

Following an invitation from the Department of Agriculture and Water Resources to submit an application for a grant under the 'Communities Combating Pests and Weeds Impact during Drought Program', the Shire made an application for a grant that would allow us to work with our communities on eradicating Caltrop in our public spaces and recreational areas.

On 18 April 2019 the Shire received notification that our application had not been successful, which is disappointing, however we will resubmit an application for the next funding round.

### WALGA Forum: Management of Roadside Vegetation

On Friday 3 May 2019, our Manager Infrastructure Services Vanessa Crispe and I attended the WALGA Forum: Management of Roadside Vegetation, held in Northam. At this event we learned, via a variety of case studies, about ways to improve the management of roadsides to better protect vegetation, and improve condition and resilience.

Topics covered in the forum included:

- An overview of the legislative and policy context for roadside management and the clearing of vegetation;
- The ecological value of remnant roadside vegetation, including landscape connectivity, wildlife habitat, and representation of declared rare flora and threatened ecological communities;
- Tools to identify conservation value vegetation in roadsides, and considerations for site surveys;
- Planning new roads or road maintenance works such as drainage, road widening or re-alignments to minimise environmental impacts;
- Pruning, slashing and spraying considerations in roadsides;
- Risk and liability of roadside management and safety treatments;
- The economic value and 'sense of place' that roadside vegetation provides in regional area; and
- Examples of management options to conserve roadside vegetation value.

Of particular interest was a presentation by former Principal Research Scientist Greg Keighery from Dept of

Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions (DBCA) who acknowledged the Newdegate-Lake King Road corridor as ecologically significant to the State.

This forum was both interesting and informative and gave us some 'food for thought' on our responsibility as a local government to provide safe and efficient local road networks.

## Fatal accidents highlight the dangers of quad bikes

Families, friends and the rural communities in which they live are mourning the deaths of two boys aged under ten who lost their lives recently in separate quad bike accidents in WA and Tasmania. The tragic accidents occurred on farms and involved rollovers, a common set of circumstances when we look at the statistics.

On average, 16 people lose their lives each year in Australia as a result of quad bike accidents with about six people a day suffering injuries that require a visit to the hospital. Most accidents occur on rural properties, more than half are workers, a third are aged over 60 and about ten per cent are aged under ten. Often riders and their passengers are not properly trained and are inexperienced.

While sometimes wrongly described as an 'all-terrain vehicle', quad bikes need a skilled and trained rider to operate them safely on uneven ground and someone who is physically able to shift their weight while riding – younger and older riders might find this difficult. High speed and the towing of loads add to the risk, as do vehicles that are not properly maintained.

We recommend that children under the age of 16 do not ride these vehicles but, if they do, parents should ensure that a helmet and protective clothing are used, the child has the physical and cognitive capacity to control the vehicle and is being supervised by an adult.

After conducting extensive research and consultation, the ACCC is currently finalising a mandatory safety standard for quad bikes which will improve their safety. In the meantime, the owners of these vehicles and the properties on which they operate need to consider installing rollover protection devices and adopt other safety measures such as identifying hazardous areas on their property and ensuring users are properly trained and supervised, follow all instructions and heed any warnings.

Operators need to consider if a quad bike is the safest and most suitable vehicle to use on the type of terrain the rider is likely to encounter.

Alternative farm vehicles may be safer and more suitable for the job.

Using a quad bike can be convenient and at times fun, but the 'adventure' can soon turn into a tragedy if the measures outlined in this article are not put into practice.

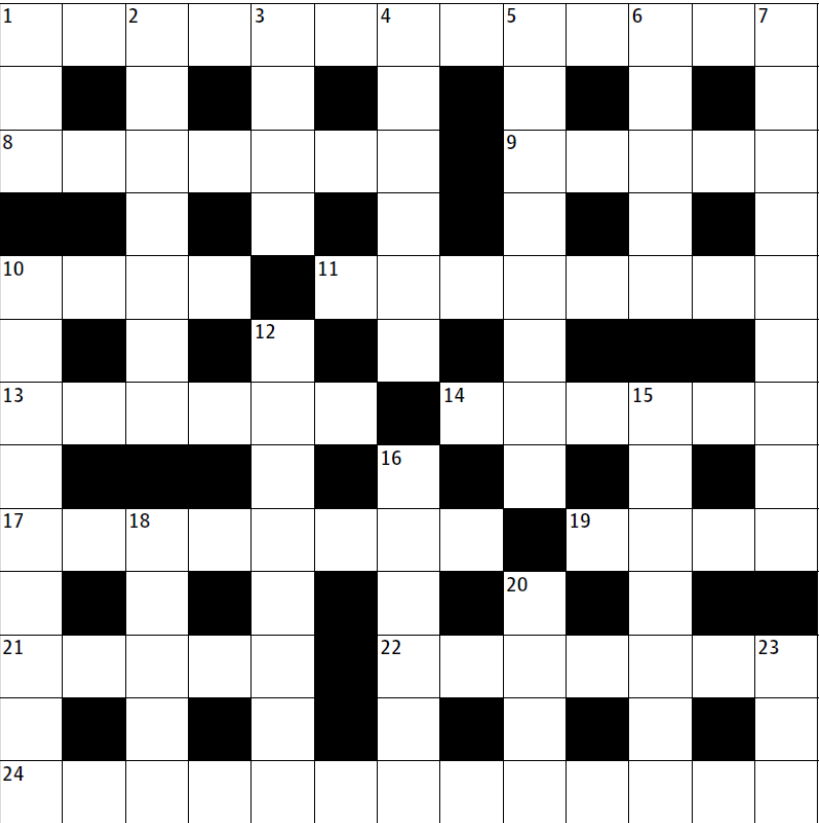

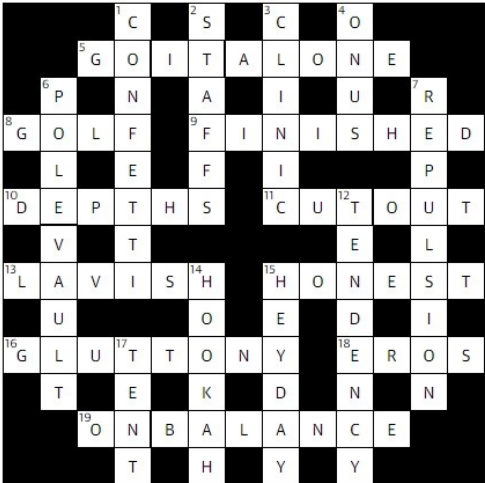

## Recipe Page

### Pea and Ham Hock Soup

#### Ingredients

- 2 tbs olive oil
- 1 onion finely chopped
- 3 celery stalks chopped
- 2 potatoes peeled & cubed
- 2 carrots peeled & chopped
- 1 1/2 cups yellow split peas
- 1 ham hock fat trimmed, rindless, skin off
- 2 chicken stock cubes
- 2l water



#### Method

1. Heat oil in a large saucepan or stock pot. Add onion and celery, cook for 2 minutes. Add carrots, potatoes, split peas, ham hock and chicken stock cubes mixed with 2 litres of water.
2. Bring to the boil. Reduce heat and simmer for 50-60 minutes until vegetables are cooked and ham hock is very tender. Remove pan from heat. Remove ham hock and allow it to cool.
3. Cut meat from the bone and shred finely.
4. Blend the soup until smooth
5. Bring soup slowly back to the boil. Reduce heat and simmer. Add ham meat. Serve with crusty bread.
