Associations - The transition period is ending

When the *Associations Incorporation Act 2015* commenced on 1 July 2016 all incorporated clubs and associations were given three years to review and update their rules (commonly called a constitution) to make sure it complied with the Act.

The transition period expires on 30 June 2019 and it is timely we explain the implications of failing to take the necessary steps to update your rules.

After 30 June 2019, if one or more of the Schedule 1 requirements are missing from your rules the relevant clause(s) from the Prescribed Model Rules will be deemed to be apply.

To avoid the possible uncertainty this may cause, if you have not done so already please commence a review of your rules now. Consumer Protection's Transition Pack 3 is a step by step guide to help you review and update the rules to comply with the Act. You will find other useful change of rules resources on our website.

Please note that there are nearly 20,000 organisations registered in Western Australia and Consumer Protection is unable to conduct this review for your club or association.

Is your resolution special?

To change the rules the members need to pass a special resolution at a general meeting. The steps the committee take before this meeting are vital in ensuring the special resolution is validly passed, so make sure that the notice of the meeting:

1. is given to all members in writing;
2. is sent in the time and manner required under the current rules; and
3. includes the exact wording for the proposed special resolution to be considered.

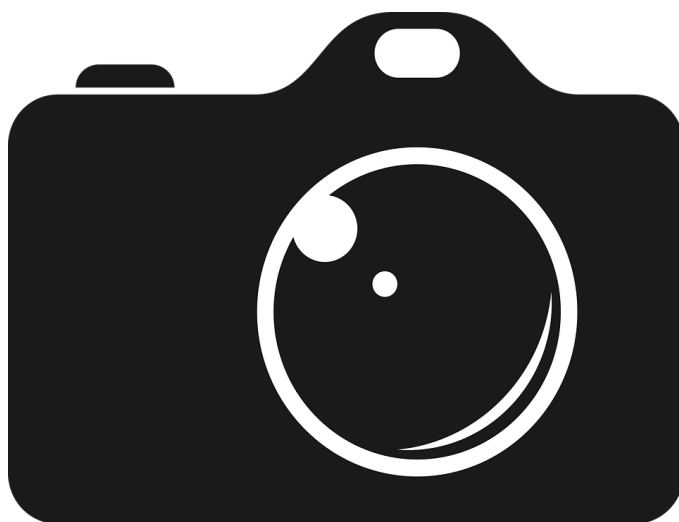
It is also important that full details of the proposed changes are included with the notice given to members.



TRAFFIC NEWS - We had a busy fortnight traffic-wise even though we weren't out and about as much as usual, a snapshot is as follows:

1. Earlier in the week, on a traffic patrol to Kukerin, we came across a vehicle that was unlicensed. A vehicle stop was conducted and we spoke with the driver regarding the matter only to discover he was a "Sovereign Citizen or Freeman on the Land". If you have never come across this type of person, below is a short synopsis of what they truly believe:

Freeman on the Land theory:

The key points of the Freeman on the land movement are as follows:

- Australian legislative laws (statutes) are like contracts and they will only apply if you consent to them;
- Freeman, or sovereign citizens, do not consent to these laws being applicable to them

- Freeman are, however, subject to the “common law” (this is not the same common law as we study in law school);
- “Common law” comprises a strange mix of (real) common law, maritime law, some really old legislation (both Australian and English), and of course the Magna Carta.
- Under the “common law” the Freeman can essentially do as they please.

If you hold these beliefs then you’re obviously going to complicate things if you run into trouble with the government or police. For example, many Freeman cases are related to driving offences. Obviously, if you get pulled over by the police, don’t have a licence, and start going on about how the police are a corporation and don’t have any jurisdiction, it’s not going to end well.

The one sentence summary of the Freeman movement is this: **your legal system is invalid and it doesn’t apply to me.**

Well during this particular traffic stop, suggestions were made by the driver that police did not have the authority to enforce State Laws as they were unconstitutional. The driver became animated but was reminded that tasers work on all types of citizens including sovereign ones, and this bit of information had the desired effect.

The end result concluded with a date with a magistrate and the unlicensed vehicle being impounded for a month giving the driver plenty of time to obtain a valid driver’s licence, re-license his unlicensed vehicle, and change it into the correct name so he could continue his journey. Apologies to the Shire.

2. Police attended Newdegate from about 8.00am until 9.00am to conduct a visible speed detection action within the school zone resulting in only one infringement. Traffic wasn’t heavy but steady. The driver behaviour was excellent, with everyone but one sticking to the 40 KPH speed limit. Well done.

3. Most recently local police were travelling out to Newdegate in an attempt to serve some DPP summonses when a driver was detected speeding at 79 in a 60 zone on Mitchell Street, Newdegate.

Police activated emergency lights and sirens indicating for the vehicle to stop.

The vehicle failed to stop, turning left onto a bush track heading towards the Newdegate golf course. The vehicle continued on at speed, entering the Newdegate golf course around fairway 10. The driver continued along the fairway before hitting a large steel inspection cover that was protruding out of the ground. The inspection lid was removed by the vehicle’s sump and moved a meter from its location, damaging the vehicle.



The vehicle continued on, trying to turn right onto fairway 11, however the driver overshot the turn having to brake heavily to avoid hitting a large tree. The driver reversed and continued along fairway 11 with heavy black smoke coming from the vehicle’s engine. The vehicle finally came to a stop at the women’s tee at hole 16 where the two occupants of the vehicle were taken into custody.

- The passenger was later released uncharged and allowed to depart the scene, but was heard saying: “That was awesome” as he left.
- Sadly the driver remained with us for some time “assisting police with enquires”. A date with a magistrate was organised and bail issued covering a variety of charges under the Road Traffic Act and Misuse of Drugs Act.
- Law changes now mean when drivers fail to stop for police when their lights and sirens are activated it will result in a minimum MANDATORY jail sentence of six months. So please stop. The paperwork is also horrendous for police if you don’t.

Details are sketchy at this stage but it is believed the driver is attending properties to see what is in farmers' sheds. Keep an eye out and let local police know of any suspicious vehicle you see in our sub district. It's only a call and you will get feedback.

OPERATIONS - Operation AUSTRANS will occur in May. Date has been confirmed. Can't tell you the date because then it wouldn't be a surprise, but local police along with a team of Main Roads inspectors will be at a location near you pulling in and inspecting all heavy vehicles travelling throughout the district. So heavy vehicle operators make sure your signage, lights, loads and vehicles are all serviceable in case you're one of the lucky ones to be inspected. Scales will also be in use.

Operation Bluesun is nearly completed with only one visit left to go. Because we enjoyed it so much a new list will be received soon from licensing to check all the 50 to 60 year olds with firearms licenses.

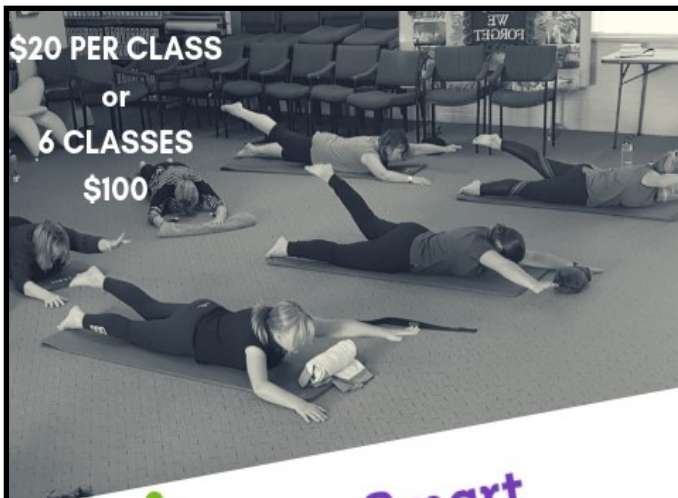

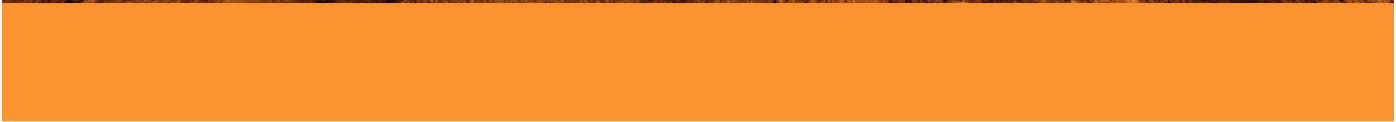

Minister Delivers for Agriculture

The State government has come through as per its pre-budget announcement, with a turnaround budget for the Department of Agriculture.

For the first time in years, the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) has secure funding to end the annual budget cuts, which over the past decade have seen staff numbers effectively halved.

The \$131 million of new funding over the next four years will lock in current staffing at 1580 Full Time Equivalents (FTEs), with around 1000 staffers working on Agriculture related issues. This will mean that the planned cuts in forward estimates which would have taken out another 100 staff will not go ahead.

It is not back to the days when the Department had 1500 staff, but at least they have put a floor in, and the Department can start recruiting the next generation of graduates. Finally, we have gotten away from the short-term Royalties for Regions projects that while supported by the industry, offered no career path for developing graduates which were on a contractual basis.

This government has spent its first two years finding its feet within the industry, as it merged the Department with Fisheries and Regional Development, but this budget is clearly a sign that this process is coming to an end, and they are up and running and taking our industry seriously.

This is a credit to Minister Alannah MacTiernan as it is the first time in 20 years we have seen a Minister stand up to Treasury and not just hold the line, but push back and demand the level of funding support needed to help the industry grow. You can not turn a \$7 billion-dollar industry into a \$10 billion-dollar industry with government not playing its part, as our turnover grows its right

to see government reinvest some of our tax revenue. We have already had announcements this year of new funding support for biosecurity, dog fences, mobile phone black spots, Asian market trade support, and grains research and development. WAFarmers acknowledges the Minister's focus on these areas and the serious dollars she has put into them.

Fees and charges have been kept at inflation, so no complaints there; except for country stand pipes which have seen huge rises in charges from \$2.53 to \$8.35 per megalitre.

\$87.5 million for the Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Route which is a start to the billion dollars needed to upgrade the 4300 km of country roads.

\$24.1 million in ongoing funding for the 'WA Open for Business' program to promote export opportunities for regional businesses.

\$10 million to support more development in the Ord picks up on one of our calls to keep developing broadacre farming in the north of the state.

\$45 million for a new Employer Incentive Scheme and training delivery in regional WA is important to help address the ag skills shortage and help WA employers with the costs of employing apprentices and trainees.

WAFarmers Rhys Turton said, "credit is needed where credit is due, the Treasurer and Minister for Agriculture have delivered a good budget which will help set up agriculture for the next four years."

CEO's Corner

Water Deficiency Declaration

On Friday 10 May an application to be declared water deficient was submitted to the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation (DWER) on behalf of eight (8) farmers in the Mallee Hill area. An announcement was made by the Minister of Water the Hon. Dave Kelly on Wednesday 15 May that the area was water deficient.

Given this the Government will start carting water to provide farmers with emergency water for livestock. The farmers included in this declaration are the only farmers that are able to access the water being carted. Initially there will be 375KI of water carted per week, this will be monitored to ascertain the future requirements.

DWER have engaged a contractor to desilt, enlarge, create a spillway and upgrade the catchment at Tommy's Dam. They have also ordered a tank ~300KI to be located at Tommy's Dam as part of the upgrade.

It is also proposed that another tank will be located at the Mallee Hill Standpipe by DWER.

White Ant Treatment at the Newdegate Hall

The treatment of the white ant infestation at the Newdegate Hall is now complete and there have been no further reports of any white ant activity.

Please note that we will be back to complete the varnishing of the hall floor before the Newdegate Field Days.

If you spot any further white ant issues, please call the Shire office on 9890 2500.

Motorbike Damage at the Jam Patch

It has come to our attention that someone has done burn outs at the Jam Patch with their motorbike which has torn up the reserve and damaged the pathways.

What might not be known is that this behaviour constitutes an offence under Section 60 of the Road Traffic Act (reckless driving on space open and used by the public). For first time offenders the penalty is a



minimum \$600 fine, seizure of vehicle, and a six month licence suspension – hefty consequences.

If you witness further incidents of antisocial and destructive riding/driving in the Shire, the Lake Grace Police advise taking a photo or video of the offender if possible, then report the incident to them and they will investigate.

Driving on Lake Grace

Once again, the Lake Grace has been adorned with tyre tracks left by people driving on the lake.

As an entry way to our Shire, this is not an attractive sight for any visitors passing through and also ruins the look of the lake for those stopping off.

Driving on the lake is unsafe, as the land is often very soft and unpredictable. There is also a high chance that you will end up getting yourself bogged.

I would like to remind the community that driving on the Lake is prohibited.

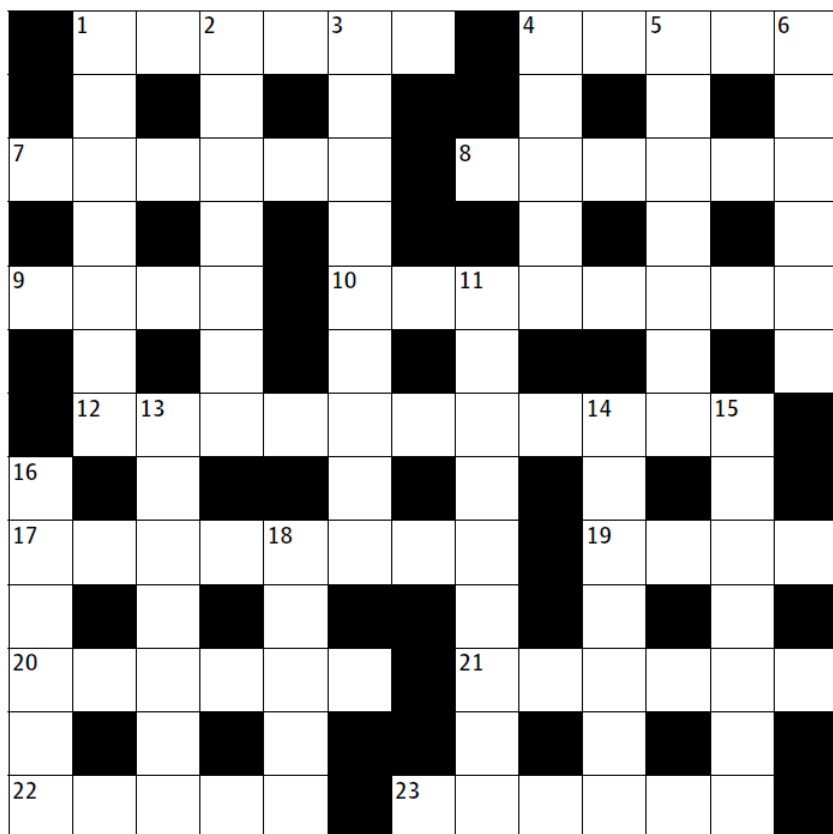

Strawberry and Lemonade Scones

Ingredients

- 3 cups self-raising flour, plus extra for dusting
- 1 cup thickened cream
- 1 cup cold lemonade
- 1 tsp vanilla bean paste
- 250g strawberries, hulled, sliced, plus extra to serve
- Whipped cream and jam, to serve



Method

1. Preheat oven to 200 degrees Celsius. Grease and line baking tray with baking paper.
2. Stir flour, cream, lemonade and vanilla in a bowl until just combined. Add strawberries and fold through.
3. Turn out onto a floured surface, press out until 5.5cm thick. Use a 5.5cm plain cutter, dusted in extra flour, to cut into rounds. Place rounds on tray so they are slightly touching. Bake for 20-22 minutes or until lightly golden.
4. Cool slightly on a tray then halve and serve with whipped cream, jam and extra strawberries
