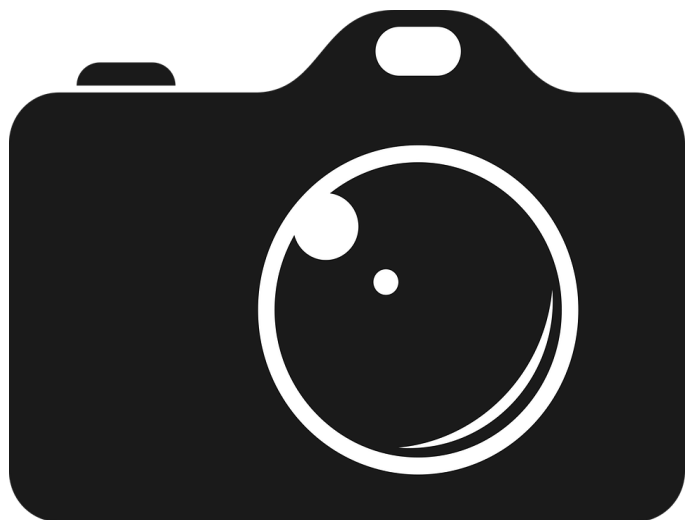

WA Farmers welcome Ministers Support

WAFarmers welcomes Minister Alannah MacTiernan's comments on the untimely, and last-minute attempt by Animals Australia to stop the last sheep shipment leaving Fremantle before the three-month summer moratorium begins.

WAFarmers Livestock President, David Slade backed the minister's position, that the last-minute attempt to stop the shipment only causes more chaos, and potentially jeopardises future animal welfare issues for the sheep currently waiting in quarantine at the feedlot.

"What these groups need to realise is that the industry has adopted all the necessary measures required by the government," Mr Slade said.

"It's clear these groups will go to any length to see the industry stopped. We have seen this before

with the cash for cruelty scandal that is currently under investigation.

"To ensure this does not happen again we would like to see the government treat the claims of the activists with far more skepticism, as they have lost all shreds of credibility with this latest attempt to stop the shipment.

"From now on the regulator should only accept scientifically backed data with real evidence from credible organisations," Mr Slade said.

WAFarmers look forward to the new government setting new standards for the regulators to apply the common-sense rule, when clearly being played by activist organisations.

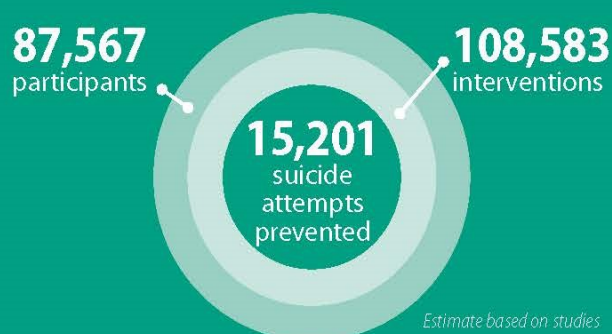

Winter Solstice 2019

FOR most of us, the winter solstice marks the shortest day of the year and means the journey towards summer has begun.

But for astrophysicist Professor Tim Bedding it's an opportunity to dispel myths about the seasons and the earth's orbit.

Saturday, June 22, 2019 at 1:54 am in Sydney. In terms of daylight, this day is 4 hours, 31 minutes shorter than on December Solstice.

It's the exact time when the southern hemisphere or pole is tilted directly away from the sun and the north towards it.

Prof Bedding said although humans have historically used the winter and summer solstices as time markers for seasonal agricultural activities, many people don't understand that the earth's tilt is why we have solstices and seasons.

"The most common misconception people have is that summer and winter happen because the earth is closer in summer and further in winter," he told AAP on Thursday. "You'll still find well-educated people who think that."

But Prof Bedding said the earth's journey around the sun is almost circular and the seasons actually occur because the earth's tilt causes the northern and southern hemispheres to receive varying exposure to the sun during its year-long orbit.

He said although we get sunlight all year round in Australia, when the winter solstice occurs later today the southern hemisphere will be directly tilted away from the sun.

"We get sunlight but we don't get it for as long and when it does get to us it's shining more at an angle, so the sun is lower in the sky and the heat from the sun is spread over a bigger area," he said. It's why winter is colder and the days shorter than in summer, when the tilt creates longer and warmer days.

Prof Bedding pointed to Stonehenge in southern England and more locally, the Wurdi Youang rock formation in Victoria, which was used by

indigenous Australians to mark solstices more than 25,000 years ago.

"They wouldn't have realised the earth was tilted on its axis, they probably didn't realise the earth orbited around the sun either," he said.

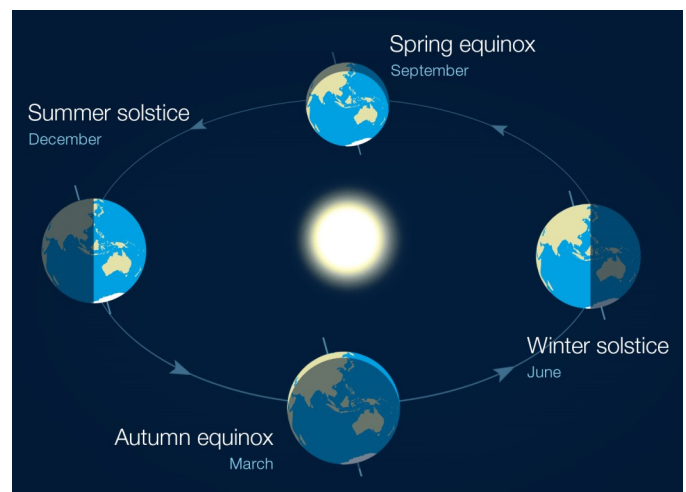
"But they knew something was changing and they could see it."



Celebrations to mark the winter solstice carry on to this day. From Tasmania's Dark Mofo festival to a -3C nude swim in Canberra's Lake Burley Griffin, Australians are embracing the shortest day.

But the finest example of midwinter madness is surely Australia's Antarctic team who braved -22C temperatures and plunges into the icy ocean to continue a winter solstice tradition that began with early explorers, such as Sir Douglas Mawson.

Their midwinter celebrations at Australia's three Antarctic research stations and sub-Antarctic Macquarie Island also include a feast, exchange of handmade gifts, midwinter play and messages from home.

How to perform a Native American rain Dance

Native Americans performed the raindance to bring rain to help crops grow and produce a bountiful harvest, especially in the Southwest where the climate provided little rain, and in August, the hottest and driest month.

Historically, both men and women performed the raindance. For most other ceremonies and rituals, only men participated. Today, some American Indian tribes still perform the raindance.

1. Wear turquoise and feathers, if you have any. Many Native American tribes associate turquoise with rain and feathers with the wind. Put on any turquoise-colored clothing that you may have and turquoise jewellery. If you have access to any bird or decorative feathers, place a couple in your hair or secure them to a hat and wear them during the rain dance.
2. Find an outdoor space where you have plenty of room to move around. Choose a space that

has sparse or no tree cover so that you have a clear view of the sky. The terrain of the space you choose should be relatively flat, which will make it easier to perform the rain dance.

3. Spin around in circles. Begin spinning clockwise at a slow and steady pace. Chant your own simple rain chant as you spin. Your chant can be something as simple as the word "rain" repeated over and over or an entire phrase, such as "Come down rain." Raise your hands to the sky occasionally to urge the rain to fall.
4. Speed up your spinning and chanting. The longer you spin and chant the faster you should spin and chant. Close your eyes as you dance and breathe in deeply between chants. When you want to end the dance, drop to your knees in silence. Stay on your knees until any dizziness you feel goes away and you can regain your balance.

TRAFFIC NEWS - We had a very busy long weekend traffic-wise, including a **tragic fatal crash**.

At about 2.30pm on Saturday 1st June 2019 Lake Grace police were returning to Lake Grace following a traffic patrol of Pingaring, Newdegate, Lake King, Varley and Hyden when we received notification of a vehicle rollover on Lake Grace–Newdegate Road, approximately 10 kilometres west of Newdegate.

A Honda CRV carrying seven passengers - two adult males, one adult female and four children - travelling to Esperance for the long weekend crashed when the driver became distracted and drifted onto the left hand side of the road verge. The vehicle travelled 240 metres on the left hand verge before the driver over-corrected, lost control of the vehicle as it re-entered the road in a four wheel skid and pirouette, crossed to the other side of the road where it rolled once over an 18 metre distance.

Sadly a four year old female was ejected through a closed rear passenger window when the vehicle rolled and sustained injuries not compatible with life. All other passengers were injured to varying levels, however not life threatening.

Three ambulances and a fire crew were involved with the incident.

Unfortunately it appears that few people in the vehicle were wearing seatbelts at the time of the crash nor were any child restraining devices present in the vehicle.

I would personally like to thank all the people who assisted and attended this incident, in particular the St John Ambulance volunteers from Lake Grace and Newdegate, the Voluntary Fire

Brigade for assisting with the scene, medical staff at Lake Grace Hospital, and Mike and Maggie from the Lake Grace pub who assisted with the language barriers. I had several calls from local emergency service coordinators who, whilst not present in the district, still effectively coordinated the necessary resources to attend and I'd like to thank them also.

This was my first serious emergency in the Lake Grace sub-district and it was gratifying to see everyone working together competently and professionally in such a difficult situation.

Again, a reminder to all drivers who approach any emergency vehicle who are working on the side of the road with emergency lights activated: **slow down to 40 kph** on approach and when passing those emergency vehicles. When I re-attended the fatal crash scene the following day with Major Crash, there were two police vehicles on both sides of the road with emergency lights flashing and still several drivers insisted on travelling at 110 kph right where we were working. Number plates were noted and registered owners will be receiving some mail.

Also, vehicles travelling with emergency lights activated on priority attending an accident **are not pace cars for civilian traffic** who are travelling in the same direction. Just because an ambulance is travelling at high speed to get to a critical incident doesn't mean you can do the same. We received two complaints from St John Ambulance officers en route to a fatality of people driving in this dangerous manner.

CRIME - No crime was reported this fortnight within the sub-district or that we know about. If you see something suspicious or know of any criminal activity let us know or call Crime Stoppers.

Narrogin, on the other hand, is having issues and Lake Grace Police will be assisting in their sub-district this coming week.

OPERATIONS - Operation AUSTRANS was completed on the 28th May in conjunction with two Main Roads inspectors. A total of 48 heavy vehicles were inspected, with the majority passing with flying colours. S/C MAIN and PC OATRIDGE

are now all trained up and will be stopping heavy vehicles for inspections in the future.

Operation BLUESUN is completed. We should be receiving the next list of firearms checks shortly.

Drought Taskforce Meeting – 28 May 2019

'If in Doubt Leave it Out'

What's Recyclable What's Not!

Acceptable Items



Plastic bottles- without lids, newspaper, cardboard (clean), paper grocery bags, egg cartons, magazines, junk mail, stationery and envelopes, glass bottles and jars, milk & juice cartons, aluminium/tin cans, foil, trays, all plastic food containers, empty aluminium cans.

Unacceptable Items



Plastic wrap, plastic bags, coffee cups, fast food wrappers, paper plates, soiled paper, paper towels, napkins, light bulbs, food waste, cups, plates, wine and drinking glasses, batteries, green waste, shredded paper.

Specific materials which may have questions about them include 'If in doubt leave it out':

Aerosols – although the instructions on current education materials say that empty aerosols are permissible for recycling bins, many aren't. Aerosols have caused 5 small explosions in the compactor of one of the MRF Operators over the last year. There is also the concern that people are putting all types of aerosol into the recycling bin, including butane canisters which are potentially extremely hazardous. Therefore it is recommended that people do not put their aerosols in the recycling bin, instead they take them to one of the 13 Household Hazardous Waste facilities throughout WA.

Coffee cups – although a similar material to milk cartons, coffee cups are not recyclable through kerbside collections because of their shape (they would not be sorted by the sorting screen). Also these materials would represent a contaminate in the cardboard stream.

UHT Milk containers – if silver lined, are not recyclable through the kerbside system. These materials are composite packaging. Normal milk cartons which do not have a silver lining are acceptable in the kerbside recycling bin.

Take away food containers – yes if they're clean.

Meat trays – no, currently it is too confusing to know what the material is therefore if it is or is not recyclable.

Plastic containers 1 – 7, all are recyclable. What isn't recyclable is flexible plastic or polystyrene.

Shredded paper – should not be in the recycling bin as shredded paper is too small to be captured and it contaminates the glass stream.

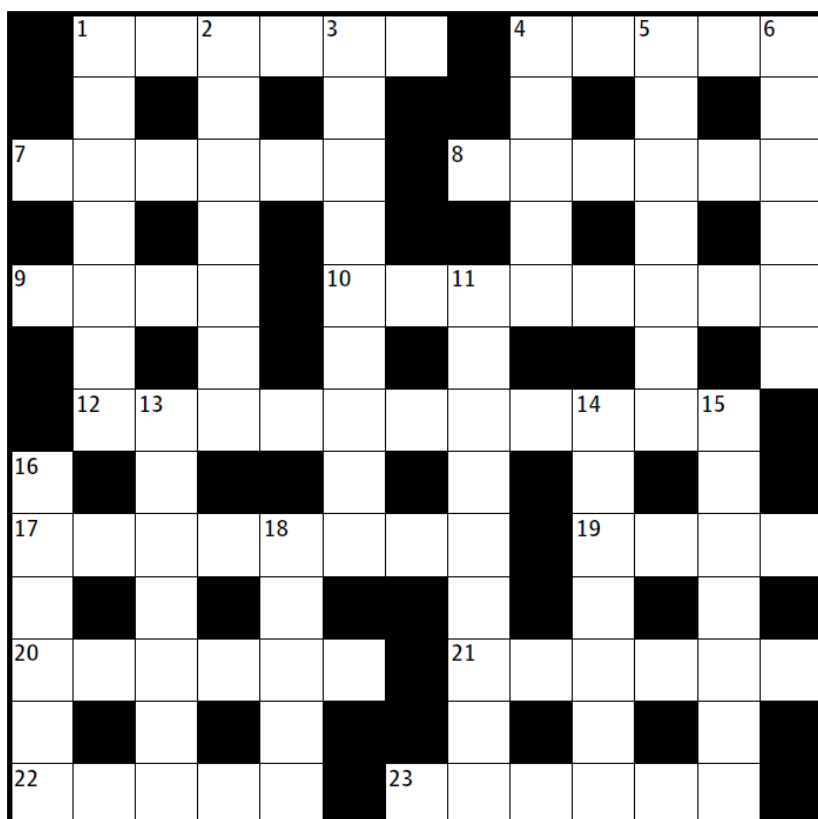

Recipe Page

Mushroom Soup

Ingredients


- 1/4 cup unsalted butter
- 800g sliced fresh mushrooms
- Pinch of salt
- 1 brown onion, diced
- 1 1/2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 6 sprigs fresh thyme
- 2 garlic cloves, peeled
- 4 cups chicken broth
- 1 cup water
- 1 cup heavy whipping cream
- Salt and pepper to taste



Method

1. Melt butter in a large soup pot over medium-high heat; cook mushrooms in butter with 1 pinch salt until the mushrooms give off their juices; reduce heat to low. Continue to cook, stirring often, until juices evaporate and the mushrooms are golden brown, about 15 minutes. Set aside a few attractive mushroom slices for garnish later, if desired. Mix onion into mushrooms and cook until onion is soft and translucent, about 5 more minutes.
2. Stir flour into mushroom mixture and cook, stirring often, for 2 minutes to remove raw flour taste. Tie thyme sprigs into a small bundle with kitchen twine and add to mushroom mixture; add garlic cloves. Pour chicken stock and water into mushroom mixture. Bring to a simmer and cook for 1 hour. Remove thyme bundle.
3. Transfer soup to a blender in small batches and puree on high speed until smooth and thick.
4. Return soup to pot and stir in cream. Season with salt and black pepper and serve in bowls, garnished with reserved mushroom slices and a few thyme leaves.
