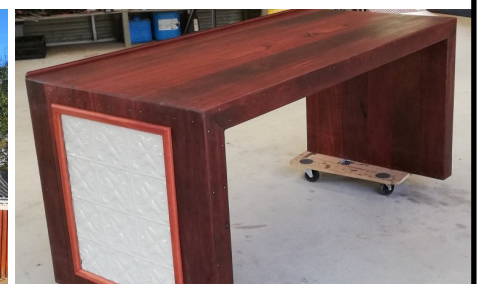

Beware of Tax Time Scammers

The end of the financial year is fast approaching which means it's time to remind taxpayers to be aware of scam attempts that usually spike over the next six months.

Tax scams continue to take a large financial toll on people who are usually cold-called by criminals pretending to be from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) and demanding a fictitious tax debt be paid immediately. In most cases, the caller threatens their victim with arrest if the payment is not made.

In the 12 months to the end of May 2019, 43 people reported to Consumer Protection losing a total of **\$205,250** to tax scams, representing a substantial increase on previous years. In most cases, the victims were asked to purchase iTunes or Google Play cards and supply the codes to the scammers. Scammers often use the same tactics to dupe victims into this type of scam:

- Creating a sense of urgency: scammers seek to put their victims under pressure with the threat of arrest unless money is paid immediately.
- Tax scam victims have reported being told their fake outstanding debt needed to be paid immediately or an arrest warrant would be issued.
- They "spoof" phone numbers. Caller ID spoofing allows you to display a phone number different than the actual number from which the call was placed. With caller ID spoofing, you can send and receive outgoing or incoming phone calls or texts that appear to be from any phone number of your choosing. For example, it may appear as if someone is calling from your accountant's office but in reality it's a scammer.
- They may already know some of your personal or financial information, which can make them seem credible.
- They ask for payment via iTunes or Google Play cards and will try to keep you on the phone while you buy the cards. They often tell victims to lie about why they are buying the cards to prevent salespeople alerting them to the fact that it may be a scam.
- Consumer Protection's campaign targeting the sellers of iTunes and Google Play cards has prevented further losses to gift card scams.
- Woolworths and Coles have been highly responsive to our campaign to train staff to alert any customers who intend to make large purchases of these cards, which scammers now use as their preferred currency.
- Putting doubt in the mind of scam victims may trigger them to get advice before going ahead with the purchases.
- We urge retailers who sell iTunes and Google Play cards to make sure their staff are aware of

this issue and will question customers when they attempt to make purchases involving unusually high amounts of money.

- We want to reduce the community's losses to these types of scams and the cooperation of retailers is vital.

Advice for consumers

- ◇ The ATO makes thousands of outbound calls to taxpayers every week, but would never contact you about a debt in a threatening manner.
- ◇ The ATO would never demand that you load money onto a prepay card at the post office, ask you to send funds via money transfer services or pay by iTunes vouchers or Google Play cards. ATO methods of payment can be found at www.ato.gov.au/howtopay.
- ◇ If the ATO does call to discuss payment of an outstanding debt, they will give you the opportunity to query the outstanding debt with your accountant, other advisers or family.
- ◇ Check your myGov account which has real time tax information available, including any outstanding amounts.
- ◇ If you have been contacted by the ATO and want to confirm the legitimacy of the contact, take note of the caller's name and details and then call the ATO on **1800 008 540**. Most importantly, never send money or give financial details to someone you don't know or trust.
- ◇ Be careful when clicking on links, downloading files or opening attachments. Only give your personal information to people you trust, and try not to share it on social media.
- ◇ Talk to your family and friends about scams - if you or someone you know has fallen victim to a tax related scam, call the ATO as soon as you can or visit ato.gov.au/scams for more information.

This fortnight's article will be on the shorter side as I am on my own again, but only until Tuesday then I will be disappearing for two months. Yes, you read that correct - that is two whole months. My wife and I are off to travel Europe on our motorcycle. For those who may be interested in that type of travel, Meredith will be posting our activities on a Facebook page called "Married with a Moto Guzzi" (except we will be on a Suzuki Bandit for this trip).

Fiona started her CSI course this past Monday and will be back on deck from Monday 22 July 2019. She will be acting as OIC while I am away. Good luck Scotty. That leaves a one-week gap between my departure and Fiona's return, so I have seconded Senior Constable Chris TAYLOR (no relation) from Kondinin Police to look after you all just for that week. She is looking forward to policing the local football and of course will be supporting the Lake Grace team.

As mentioned last time, this week's topic is all about the *Liquor Control Act 1988*. This is the legislation that governs the laws about drinking liquor and behaviour when drinking. The Act allows for three distinct categories of people: licensee's or managers, employees or agents, and

customers. All have responsibilities under the Act and in the event the Act is contravened in any way, depending on which category you fall into, the penalties are reflected in the level of responsibility for the transgression.

The Act is written to ensure that the provision and service of alcohol to the public does not cause antisocial behaviour or is detrimental to one's health.

So here are the basics:

Section 115 Drunk people, offences as to, refusal of entry to etc.

- 1) Where a licensee, or an employee or agent permits — Drunkenness or violent, quarrelsome, disorderly or indecent behaviour, to take place on the licensed premises or permits any reputed thief, prostitute or supplier of unlawful drugs to remain on the licensed premises. That licensee, and the employee or agent concerned, commits an offence.

Penalty for this subsection:

- (a) for the licensee or a manager, a fine of \$10,000;
- (b) for an employee or agent, a fine of \$4,000.

- 2) Sell or supply liquor to a drunk person or allow or permit a drunk person to consume liquor or obtain or attempt to obtain liquor for consumption by a drunk person.

Penalty for this subsection:

- (a) for the licensee or a manager, a fine of \$10,000
- (b) for an employee or agent, a fine of \$4,000



(c) for anyone else, a fine of \$2,000

- 4) If subsection (1) or (2) apply to a person, an authorised person (manager, employee or police) may refuse the person entry to the licensed premises or an authorised person may require the person to leave the licensed premises.

If this requirement is not complied with — an authorised person, or any other person (police) on the request of an authorised person, may remove the person using such force as may be reasonably necessary.

(4B) A person commits an offence if the person does not leave licensed premises after being told to leave.

Penalty for this subsection: a fine of \$2,000.



- 6) A person who under this section — Has been refused entry to or has been required to leave and has left, or been removed from, licensed premises and remains on any foot-path or in any area subject to the control or management of the licensee or that is adjacent to the licensed premises, commits an offence.

Penalty for this subsection: a fine of \$5,000.

- 7) A person who re-enters premises within 24 hours of being refused entry to, required to leave, or being removed from, those premises under this section commits an offence; and any other person, on the request of the licensee or a manager of the

premises, may remove the person who re-entered the premises from those premises using such force as may be reasonably necessary.

Penalty for this subsection: a fine of \$2,000.

119. Unlicensed premises, Street Drinking, Park Drinking etc.

(1) A person who consumes liquor in any place or on any premises, including any park, street or reserve, without the consent of the occupier, or of the person or authority having control of that place or those premises commits an offence.

Penalty: a fine of \$2,000.

121. Licensed premises, offences as to juveniles

(1) Subject to this Act, where liquor is sold or supplied to a juvenile on licensed premises the licensee and any manager who is supervising and managing the licensed premises at the time the liquor is sold or supplied and any other person by whom the liquor is sold or supplied, and any person who permits the sale or supply, each commit an offence.

Penalty:

For the licensee or a manager, a fine of \$10,000

For the sale or supply by any other person, a fine of \$4,000

For anyone else, a fine of \$2,000.

So folks, those are the basics. There are actually many more offences but the above ones are the most common. Nine times out of ten if you are running amok in the pub and asked to leave it will be best to leave. Otherwise police will attend and endeavour to assist you off the premises and - if compliant - may even take you home. However, how that goes will be entirely up to that individual and (on occasion) their mates.

CRIME:

No crime to report for the last fortnight which is excellent news. Lake Grace Police did attend a reported group of young adults loitering and believed to be casing several local businesses in the main street of Lake Grace at about 8.30pm on Sunday night. As it turns out it was some local lads playing a large scale game of hide and seek, which

is better than playing computer games I suppose. In any event we had a giggle.

Next Fortnight:

I am not sure what Fiona and Scott have planned for the next article but it's bound to be good. I am now officially on holidays. Looking forward to catching up with everyone in two months' time. Until then, stay safe.

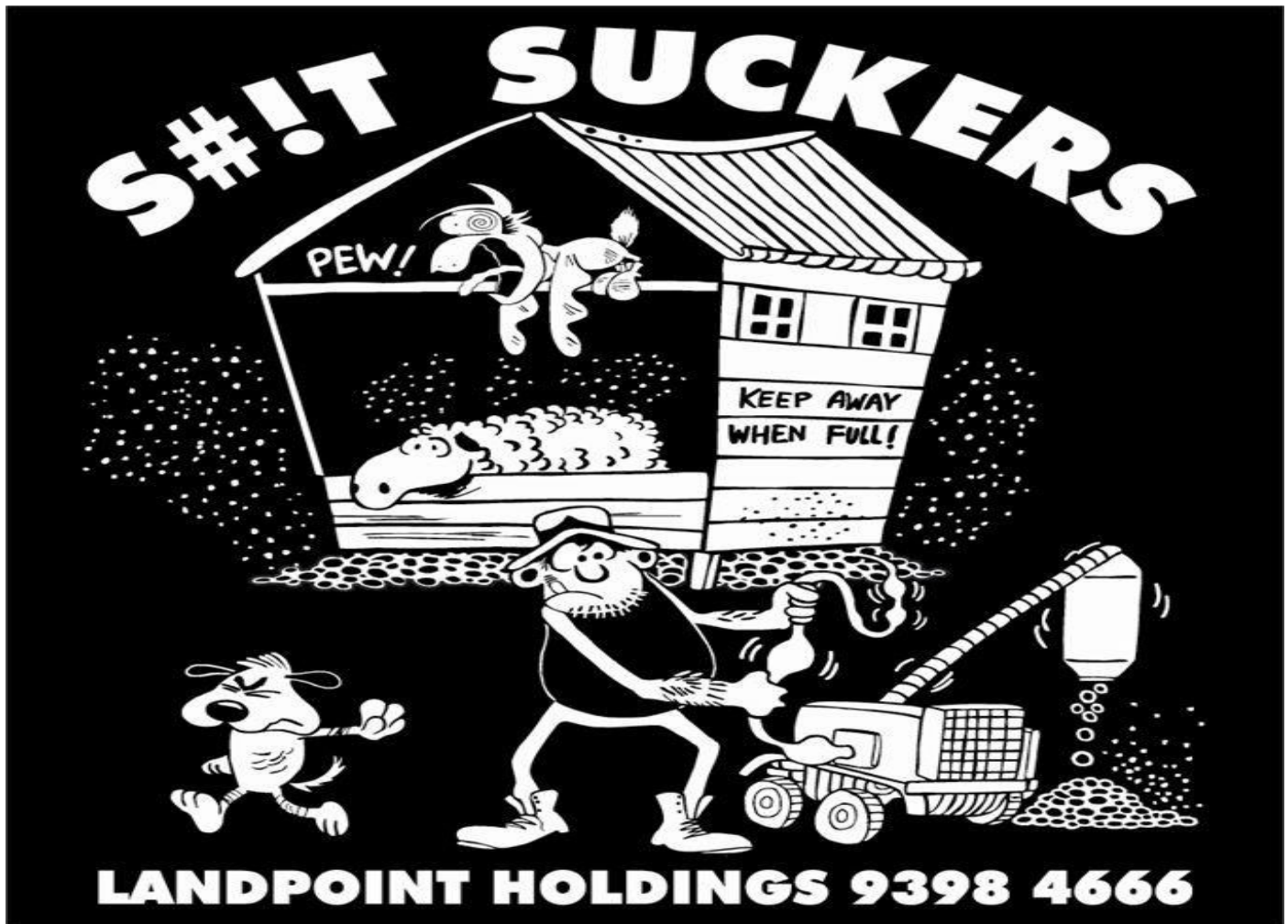

CEO's Corner

Newdegate Country Club Refurbishment

Newdegate Country Club Building Project representatives and I are working with Michel Greenhalgh MCG Architects to consider options to refurbish and modernise the building for up to 100 people.

The priorities given for the project are as follows;

- Ablutions to conform to current standards, including disability access and the inclusion of a shower recess with all associated plumbing and sewer disposal to be upgraded;
- Kitchen to conform with current commercial standards with a desire to increase to the size of the food storage area;
- The floor surface is to be levelled, with particular attention paid to the area adjacent the current bar area.

Other considerations are to refurbish and modernise the building structure, ducted air-conditioning, modernise the office, crèche and bbq area.

Michel has inspected the Country Club and has presented some drawings showing the principal of planning for the group to consider. With this exciting project, the group is looking to present a well-functioning building compliant to current standards, for the long term benefit of the Community.

The Shire has been working with members of the Lake King Playgroup Committee to upgrade the Playground area between the hall and sports centre in Lake King.

After assessing a number of quotes, the Playgroup Committee decided Forpark Australia's submission provided the best range and value for money, and they have been appointed as the successful play equipment supplier.

Quotes are now being sought to undertake a number of other works at the site including fencing, paving, shade structures, and limestone retaining walls for soft fall.

Expected completion date has been set for beginning of October. The Playgroup Committee have worked hard to get this project off the ground and once finished it will provide a most welcome and attractive addition for Lake King.

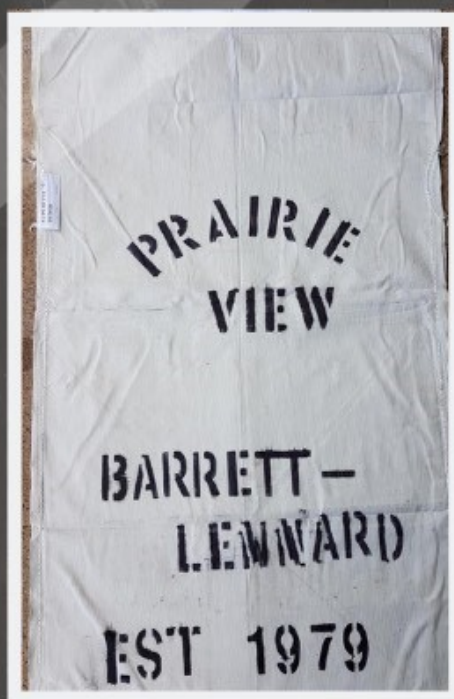

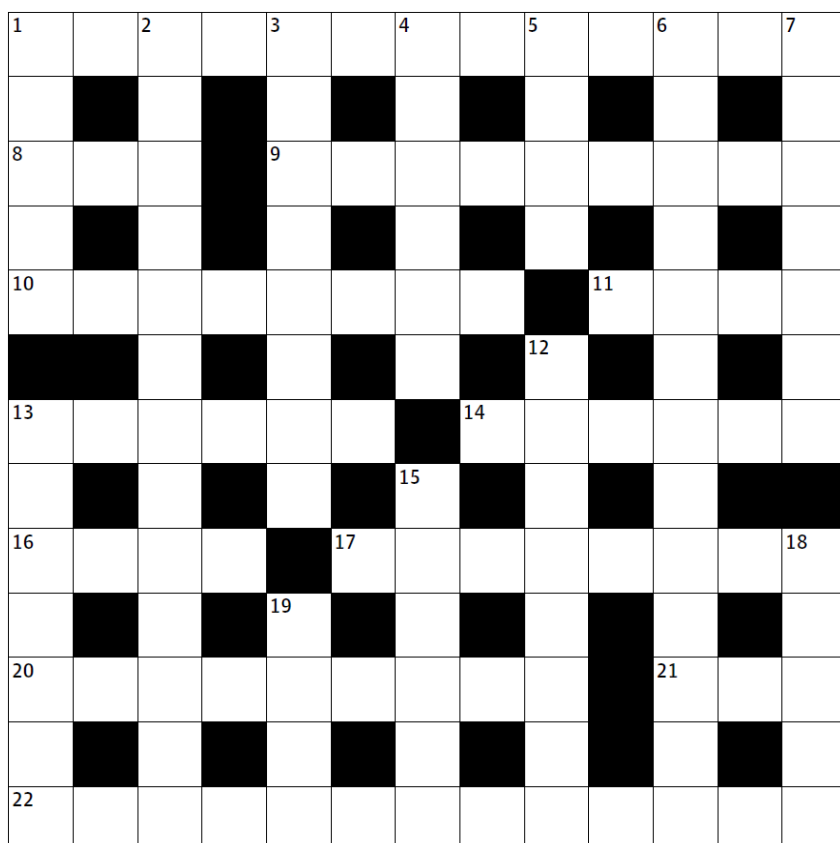

Recipe of the Week - Thai Basil & Pork StirFry

Ingredients

- 80ml Oyster Sauce
- 1 tbsp Fish Sauce
- 1 tbsp Dark Soy Sauce
- 1 tsp sugar
- 60ml (1/4 cup) Vegetable Oil
- 4 cloves of garlic
- 2 long fresh chillies
- 1 fresh birds eye chilli
- 600gm Pork mince
- 4 eggs
- 1 cup firmly packed Thai Basil leaves
- Steamed Rice to serve



Method

1. Combine oyster sauce, fish sauce, soy sauce and sugar in a small bowl. Set aside
2. Heat 2 tbs oil in a wok or large frying pan over high heat. Add the garlic and all the chilli. Stir-fry for 1 minute. Add the pork and stir-fry for 5 minutes or until well browned. Add the oyster sauce mixture and stir-fry for 1-2 minutes or until well combined and heated through. Remove from the heat and cover to keep warm
3. Heat remaining 1 tbs oil in a non-stick frying pan or wok over medium-high heat. Add 1 egg and cook, tilting the pan and spooning some of the hot oil over the egg, for 2-3 minutes or until the egg is crispy on the edges and the yolk is cooked to your liking. Transfer to a plate lined with paper towel and cover with foil to keep warm. Repeat with remaining eggs, adding more oil if necessary.
4. Add basil leaves to pork mixture and toss to combine. Divide steamed rice among serving plates. Top with pork stir-fry and fried eggs. Sprinkle with extra chilli, if you like.
