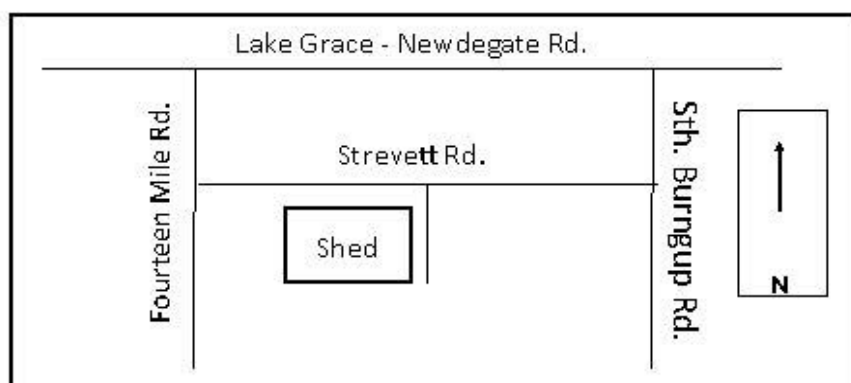

Update on live sheep exports for 2019

The Department of Agriculture has extended the prohibition on live sheep exports to, or through, the Middle East to 22 September 2019.

The department considered the best available science and evidence, and feedback from public consultation before making this decision. The interests of the industry, animal welfare and government policy were also taken into account.

Evidence indicates the risk of heat stress for voyages departing Australia in the first three weeks of September is comparable to, or higher than in June. The department determined conditions in June (along with July and August) are too hot for sheep exports. The industry came to a similar conclusion.

Furthermore, sheep departing Australia in early- to mid-September are acclimatised to cooler Australian temperatures and therefore less heat tolerant than sheep departing in Australian summer or autumn months.

For October, the risk of an animal welfare incident related to heat stress is more aligned with conditions in May.

Once trade resumes, shipments to, or through, the Middle East must comply with the same conditions that applied in May 2019. These requirements include:

- verification of the ship's pen air turnover
- a heat stress management plan
- stocking sheep in accordance with an allometric formula or the heat stress assessment model – depending on which provides more space per animal
- collecting automated environmental data (wet bulb temperatures) and reporting to the department

This decision only relates to 2019. Future regulation of live sheep exports to, or through, the Middle East will be decided following a Regulation Impact Statement process.

Media statement: Investigation into allegations of 'payment for animal cruelty footage'

In January 2019, the department commenced an investigation into allegations reported in the media that live export workers had been offered money to obtain and leak footage of animal cruelty on export vessels.

The investigation also inquired into allegations that 'whistleblowers' had offered to cut off ventilation and switch off exhaust fans to distress sheep on voyages in order to receive payments.

The department sought information from a wide range of sources in relation to these allegations, some of whom cooperated and others who chose not to.

The department has concluded its investigation into this matter and has not found any evidence to suggest that breaches of Commonwealth laws have been committed in relation to alleged payments.

The investigation did not uncover any evidence to

suggest that video footage obtained in 2017 by the crew member of the Awassi Express was contrived, or that ventilation or fans had been turned off to distress the livestock.

The investigation was conducted by experienced criminal investigators within the department's Compliance Division.

These investigators are independent of the Live Animal Export Regulator and conduct investigations into criminal matters across the department's portfolio legislation, and the *Criminal Code Act 1995* as it applies to the department's operations.

Department investigators consulted the Australian Federal Police during the investigation.

The department is aware that the AFP also received a referral of similar allegations but did not identify grounds to proceed to investigation

Week three without the boss, we're managing to stay afloat so far.

We've had a fairly quiet couple of weeks again on the crime front, and even over our duty weekend this week, we were able to finish work on time on Saturday and enjoy our evening without a call out, which is a great relief.

It was nice to welcome our old copper Tara Spencer back to town this week (off duty) for a cameo appearance and enjoy the evening listening to the talents of our local band. I hope some of you managed to catch up with her and tell her how good the new police officers are!

Traffic news....

We were fortunate enough to be in the right place at the right time to stop someone who was detected at a speed of 155kph in a 110kph speed zone, obviously this type of speed is far from being excusable, the driver was slugged with 7 demerit points and a \$1200 fine, in fact if they had been travelling a 2kph quicker the car would have had seized for 28 days and the driver facing a day in court.



Speaking of vehicle seizures, Lake Grace Police were conducting a traffic patrol in Corrigin recently where we stopped a vehicle as the driver had a court suspended drivers licence, which deemed him to be a disqualified driver on our roads. This makes him instantly uninsured, and is a massive risk to all our road users who stick to the rules, as a result of this the vehicle was seized for 28 days, for those of you that may not be aware, when police seize a vehicle a fee of around \$1000 is normally required be to paid to the towage company before the vehicle can be released, so add that cost into the monetary fine and a day in court that the driver will receive for the driving offences you can see that it can become very costly to be driving without a suspended or cancelled licence.



Whilst on our rounds we have noted that some members of the public are taking to parking on a footpath instead of their driveway or the road, admittedly this is not a major issue to some, however this leaves disabled people, parents with push chairs, and other pedestrians with no choice other than to use the road, and place themselves in potential danger. This is something that we will be addressing if we see it in the future, either by a friendly reminder or a traffic infringement.

Road Traffic code section 165:**Stopping on path, dividing strip, nature strip or painted Island.**

The driver of a vehicle (other than a bicycle, an EPT or an animal) shall not stop so that any portion of the vehicle is on a path, dividing strip, painted island, or a nature strip adjacent to a length of carriageway in a built-up area, unless —

(a) The driver stops in an area, to which a parking control sign applies and the driver is permitted to stop at that place under these regulations; or

(b) The driver is permitted to do so under a local law. Penalty \$50.

Proposed changes to how cars are bought and repaired in WA

Major changes to laws covering the sale and repair of motor vehicles in WA will go before Parliament which, if passed, will introduce a cooling off period in certain circumstances, remove special warranties and reduce fees for consumers.

For vehicle sales, the proposed changes will involve:

- A three day cooling off period for motor vehicle sales that are linked to dealer finance, either offered in house or as a referral to a credit provider (a flat \$100 fee will apply);
- A maximum five per cent charge for the termination of a sales contract, replacing the current maximum 15 per cent 'pre-estimated liquidated damages' provisions;
- Removal of special warranty provisions for used vehicle sales, relying instead on the consumer guarantees under the Australian Consumer Law to protect buyers;
- Salespeople no longer having to be licensed but licensed dealers will have the obligation of ensuring their sales staff have the appropriate experience, skills and training; and
- Improved disclosure requirements for dealers relating to whether a used vehicle is a repairable write-off or has had its engine replaced.

The cooling off period for sales linked to finance gives consumers the opportunity to review their decision to purchase under those circumstances and brings WA in line with most other States.

Having a set, low contract termination fee prevents the current situation where consumers in many cases face losing thousands of dollars if they want to pull out of the deal. Likewise the amount better reflects the actual losses incurred by the dealership.

Separate warranties for used vehicle sales are no

longer required with the consumer guarantees within the Australian Consumer Law providing adequate protection for buyers, so vehicles will be treated like any other consumer product.

For vehicle repairs, the proposed changes will involve the certification for individual repairers to be renewed every three years, replacing the current one time only applications, among other changes.

We believe that the changes to the laws strike a fair balance that provide appropriate protections for consumers while maintaining the commercial viability of businesses operating within the motor vehicle industry in WA. They are also designed to reduce red tape and to modernise the laws which protect what is a major purchase for most consumers.

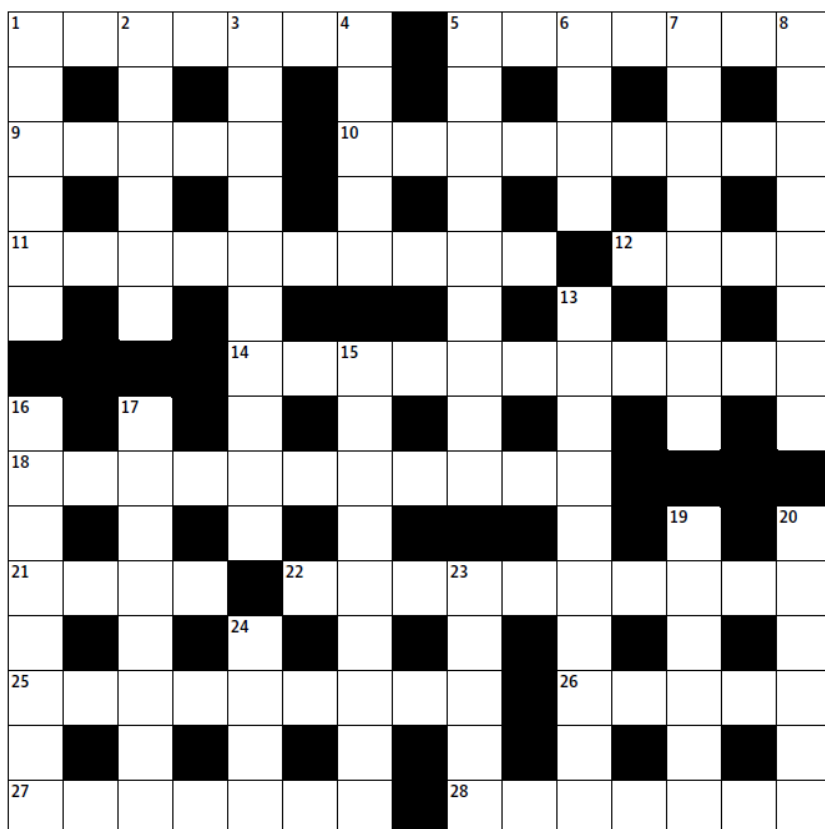

Recipe Page

Cauliflower mac & cheese

Ingredients

- 150g macaroni
- 1 small cauliflower, cut into small florets
- 2 cups full cream milk
- 2 tbsp butter
- 1/4cup plain flour
- 1/4 tsp ground nutmeg
- 1 cup tasty cheese, grated
- 1 cup mozzarella, shredded
- 1/4 cup chives, chopped
- 150g ciabatta or Turkish bread, torn into small pieces
- 60g butter, melted
- 1 garlic clove, crushed



Method

1. Preheat oven to 200C. Grease a 10-cup (2.5L) ovenproof dish. Cook the pasta in a large saucepan of boiling water for 3 mins. Add the cauliflower and cook for a further 8-10 mins or until pasta is al dente and cauliflower is tender. Drain. Return to pan.
2. Meanwhile, combine the milk, spread, flour and nutmeg in a medium saucepan over medium heat. Cook, whisking constantly, for 4 -5 mins or until the mixture boils and thickens. Season. Combine the tasty cheese and mozzarella in a large bowl.
3. Add the sauce, half the chives and half the cheese mixture to the pasta mixture. Stir gently to combine. Pour into prepared dish. Toss the bread, extra spread, garlic, and remaining chives and cheese mixture in a medium bowl. Sprinkle over the pasta. Bake for 15-20 mins or until golden.
