Coronavirus FAQ's

WA Health is working closely with the Commonwealth and other state and territory governments to respond to an outbreak of a novel coronavirus that has emerged in Wuhan, China.

The risk of transmission in Australia remains low; however, the situation is evolving. Western Australians should remain alert, but they should not be alarmed.

Australia has one of the best health systems in the world and is prepared to deal with the situation.

What are coronaviruses?

Coronaviruses are a large family of viruses that can cause illness in humans and animals. Human coronavirus illnesses are generally mild such as the common cold. However, some coronaviruses can cause severe diseases such as Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS), which was identified in 2002, and Middle East Respiratory Syndrome (MERS), which was identified in 2012.

What is the 2019 novel coronavirus (2019-nCoV)?

This is a new coronavirus that was first identified in Wuhan, Hubei Province, China in December 2019. It is a new strain of coronaviruses that hasn't previously been identified in humans. 2019-nCoV is closely related to SARS and in the same family of viruses as MERS.

What are the symptoms of 2019-nCoV?

Symptoms include fever, sore throat, cough and shortness of breath, like the symptoms of the common cold. In severe cases, the virus can cause pneumonia with severe acute respiratory distress. From what we know now about 2019-nCoV, the symptoms can occur between 2 and 14 days from exposure to the virus.

Can 2019-nCoV be transmitted from person to person?

Yes, the novel coronavirus can be spread from person to person. This can happen when a person comes into contact with the respiratory secretions of an infected person, for example through coughing or sneezing.

Spread of this coronavirus from person to person

is usually between close contacts. Close contacts are those people who have been face to face with a person infected with the virus for at least 15 minutes, or been in the same closed space for at least 2 hours with an infected person.

What should I do if I have symptoms?

If you have travelled or transited through China in the past 14 days AND have respiratory symptoms such as a sore throat, cough, shortness of breath or fever, please call your GP or call the Coronavirus Health Information Line 1800 020 080 and advise them of your symptoms and travel history. If you are attending a GP or require urgent medical assistance at an emergency department, ring ahead and tell them that you have been to China and are unwell. This will prevent other people at the health service potentially being exposed. If you are experiencing a life-threatening emergency dial 000. health.wa.gov.au

What is the treatment for 2019-nCoV?

There is no specific treatment for 2019-nCoV and, in most cases, symptoms will resolve on their own.

Is there a vaccine?

There are no available vaccines for 2019-nCoV at this time.

Are health workers at risk?

Health workers are recommended to apply infection prevention and control measures while seeing patients. The risk to health workers remains low.

How is 2019-nCoV diagnosed?

The current testing available for 2019-nCoV includes obtaining nose and throat swabs. These are then sent to the laboratory for testing. The laboratory will also test for other common respiratory viruses (such as influenza).



The History of Valentines Day

The history of Valentine's Day—and the story of its patron saint—is shrouded in mystery. We do know that February has long been celebrated as a month of romance, and that St. Valentine's Day, as we know it today, contains vestiges of both Christian and ancient Roman tradition. But who was Saint Valentine, and how did he become associated with this ancient rite?

The Catholic Church recognizes at least three different saints named Valentine or Valentinus, all of whom were martyred.



One legend contends that Valentine was a priest who served during the third century in Rome. When Emperor Claudius II decided that single men made better soldiers than those with wives and families, he outlawed marriage for young men. Valentine, realizing the injustice of the decree, defied Claudius and continued to perform marriages for young lovers in secret. When Valentine's actions were discovered, Claudius ordered that he be put to death. Still others insist that it was Saint Valentine of Terni, a bishop, who was the true namesake of the holiday. He, too, was beheaded by Claudius II outside Rome.

Other stories suggest that Valentine may have been killed for attempting to help Christians escape harsh Roman prisons, where they were often beaten and tortured. According to one legend, an imprisoned Valentine actually sent the first "valentine" greeting himself after he fell in love with a young girl—possibly his jailor's daughter—who visited him during his

confinement. Before his death, it is alleged that he wrote her a letter signed "From your Valentine," an expression that is still in use today. Although the truth behind the Valentine legends is murky, the stories all emphasize his appeal as a sympathetic, heroic and—most importantly—romantic figure. By the Middle Ages, perhaps thanks to this reputation, Valentine would become one of the most popular saints in England and France.

While some believe that Valentine's Day is celebrated in the middle of February to commemorate the anniversary of Valentine's death or burial—which probably occurred around A.D. 270—others claim that the Christian church may have decided to place St. Valentine's feast day in the middle of February



in an effort to "Christianize" the pagan celebration of Lupercalia. Celebrated at the ides of February, or February 15, Lupercalia was a fertility festival dedicated to Faunus, the Roman god of agriculture, as well as to the Roman founders Romulus and Remus.

To begin the festival, members of the Luperci, an order of Roman priests, would gather at a sacred cave where the infants Romulus and Remus, the founders of Rome, were believed to have been cared for by a she-wolf or lupa. The priests would sacrifice a goat, for fertility, and a dog, for purification. They would then strip the goat's hide into strips, dip them into the sacrificial blood and take to the streets, gently slapping both women and crop fields with the goat hide. Far from being fearful, Roman women welcomed the touch of the hides because it was believed to make them

more fertile in the coming year. Later in the day, according to legend, all the young women in the city would place their names in a big urn. The city’s bachelors would each choose a name and become paired for the year with his chosen woman. These matches often ended in marriage.

Lupercalia survived the initial rise of Christianity but was outlawed—as it was deemed “un-Christian”—at the end of the 5th century, when Pope Gelasius declared February 14 St. Valentine’s Day.

Valentine greetings were popular as far back as the Middle Ages, though written Valentine’s didn’t begin to appear until after 1400. The oldest known valentine still in existence today was a poem written in 1415 by Charles, Duke of Orleans, to his wife while he was imprisoned in the Tower of London following his capture at the Battle of Agincourt. Several years later, it is believed that King Henry V hired a writer named John Lydgate to compose a valentine note to Catherine of Valois.

Today the traditions of Valentine's Day are observed all over the world. Celebrating Valentine's Day is a popular Australian custom and 14 February is a major commercial event on the calendar . The red rose is a traditional symbol of love and passion and has appeared in paintings, poetry and songs for hundreds of years. The heart shape used in symbolism is said to be linked to the actual hearts of animals, since the Catholic Church opposed dissection of the human body. This means that whilst the heart symbol we know of today is a familiar shape to the human heart, it is a shape that fits more closely to that of a bird or reptilian heart.

Although the holiday is extremely commercial causing many people to oppose it there’s no harm in telling someone you love them.




This last couple of weeks been a big catch up on the dreaded paperwork. It's kept us in the office a fair bit, but that's not been a bad thing as we've managed to speak to a few people looking for general advice and we were where you needed us for that. That being said, we still managed to get out and about and done the usual traffic safety in the district.

A topic which many of you may not be familiar with has popped up.

Mass, Dimension and loading Requirements. (MDLR) Covered in the Road Traffic (Vehicles) Act 2012 and the Road Traffic (Vehicles) Regulations 2014.

I bring this topic up as Lake Grace Police recently stopped a vehicle that was towing a dual axle trailer with the load being an old school American utility. When police observed the vehicle combination the trailer was nearly scraping the road surface and the towing vehicles front wheels were hardly touching the road.

An examination of the vehicle and its load revealed that the towing vehicle, an F truck with a braked towing capacity of 3.5 tonne was towing a 750kg trailer with a load capacity of 1.8 tonne. On that trailer was 3.5 Tonne vehicle. Total mass being 4.25 tonne. Clearly the mass exceeded both the trailer mass limits and the towing vehicles towing capacity.

This was a problem for the driver. Unfortunately, the vehicle had to be grounded and a tow truck called to ensure the safe continuation of their journey.

It's a good opportunity to cover some points here relation to common MDLR responsibilities.

Categories of breach:

A breach of a mass, dimension or loading requirement is categorised as —

- (a) a minor risk breach; or
- (b) a substantial risk breach; or
- (c) a severe risk breach.

Each type has a different penalty that increases with the associated risk. There are tables and schedules that are used to determine how bad a breach is and what the financial penalty is. These are listed in the Act.

Common issues observed are:

- Overloading trailers or utility spaces greater than the vehicle specification
- Excessive load projections from vehicles and trailers (Front rear and side)
- Failing to secure the loads to the vehicle or trailer with the now approved ropes, lashings and ratchets.
- Ropes, lashing and ratchets that are in poor condition or unserviceable.
- Lack of warning signals for projections.

Some of these fines are expensive, especially for heavy vehicles.(anything >4.5 tonne GVM).

Tips:

Check the towing and mass specs of your vehicles. Check the condition of your load restraints and their load capacity. (pointless strapping down a 4 tonne load with a 2 tonne strap.)

Protrusions from the rear or front of a vehicle cannot exceed 1.2 metres or 150mm from the sides.

Front and rear protrusions over 300mm but under 1.2 metres are required to be marked with a coloured flag or material. At night it has to be a red light indicating the end of the protrusion.

Simple things that will save you a lot in fines.

A lot of this past week has been assisting other agencies, and other policing areas with fires around the district believed to be caused by lightning strikes during the storms. We were called out on Friday to a scrub fire in Corrigin, which was quickly under control, it caused the road to be closed on Corrigin-Brookton Road for a few hours until it was made safe, but became no threat to property.

Then over the weekend we were called to assist with a fire in Lake King. This fire was on a much larger scale, and became out of control and became a potential risk to property and lives in the area. We stayed with DFES in the area overnight assisting with traffic management, and being on standby in case evacuations were required. This, thankfully, was not required. We stayed until the fires became more manageable, and although they are still burning, they are no longer deemed a risk to property.

Also, Last week, we got called out to three pole top fires in the area. We'd like to thank everyone who assisted in putting the fires out, between the agencies and members of the public, we all

worked together amazingly, which got the fires out double quick, causing minimal disruption or damage.

Part of the reason we got these sorted so quickly was that we were told about them almost straight away. This goes for anything you feel we need to know. If you want to report a crime or just general information, the earlier we find out about it, the more efficient we can be. We understand that sometimes you're not sure or need to think about things, but honestly, you will never be wasting our time. If you come a tell us something that turns out to be nothing, that's fine. We like these conversations the best.

Over the next couple of weeks, you'll see a slight change to the front of the station. We're finally getting two new flag poles. So out the front you will soon see the federal, state and aboriginal flags flying when we are on duty. Some of you may have noticed that we've also had our police sign fixed, so it is now illuminated in the hours of darkness.

Continue checking paddocks for skeleton weed

Wheatbelt farmers are reminded to keep up paddock searches for the declared pest skeleton weed throughout late summer and autumn.

Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) project manager Martin Atwell said monitoring should include previously searched and treated skeleton weed paddocks for any late plant finds. "Skeleton weed can grow quickly, up to 20cm a week, setting seed within days of flowering," Mr Atwell said. "Despite the dry conditions, some paddocks which were searched and cleared in November and December for early flowering plants now have later germinating plants found during monitoring of infested sites. "It is imperative that farmers continue with follow-up monitoring of infested sites throughout summer and early autumn to ensure these plants are prevented from setting seed."

Immature plants, or rosettes, have recently been found at sites in Moora, Wongan Hills, Ballidu, and Narembeen.

Skeleton weed has upright and usually leafless stems, which give the appearance of the skeleton of a plant. It is most recognisable for its bright yellow daisy flowers when flowering during summer and autumn. Information on skeleton weed and control is available from agric.wa.gov.au/skeletonweed, or contact your nearest DPIRD or Local Action Group.

Transporters reminded to make journeys safe for livestock

The Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development is reminding livestock transporters to monitor extreme weather conditions before and during transport, and to manage any animal welfare issues identified during the journey.

With increased temperatures during summer, producers and transporters need to consider the potential negative impact extreme temperatures can have on their livestock. The Codes of Practice for the Transportation of Cattle and the Transportation of Sheep in Western Australia, require owners to take into account the nature and duration of the proposed journey and only select livestock which are fit for travel.

DPIRD regional compliance manager Russell Adams said high temperatures could make animals more susceptible to stress, and loading and travels plans should be modified to suit the conditions. "Heavily pregnant females, young and old animals, and livestock in poor condition are more severely affected by stress, so owners of livestock may need to reconsider whether these animals should be transported in very hot conditions," Mr Adams

said. "There is also a responsibility for transporters to reduce any adverse effects, taking note of the construction of the transport unit and its ventilation, the speed of travel, and number of planned stops. "Managing animals in high temperature requires good forward planning. Wherever possible, animals should be transported directly to their destination and only in the cooler hours of the day."

The Start of a New School Year

Well the summer holidays are over for another year and I hope that everyone had a safe and enjoyable break.

Its back to school for our young ones and I would like to wish all of our students the very best of luck as they embark on the next steps in their school lives, whether thats moving up a year in their current schools or packing up, saying goodbye to mum and dad and heading off to boarding school.

Water

Water is still a hot topic around our district, as our long, hot and dry summer continues.

Water Corporation is carting approximately 11 million litres of drinking water each week to Cranbrook, Grass Patch, Hyden, Lake King, Varley, Rock Gully, Wellstead, Salmon Gums, Ravensthorpe and Walpole and with the lack of rain forecast it is expected that water carting may be needed for other towns, including Jerramungup, Ongerup, Frankland and Borden by the end of March.

On behalf of the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation (DWER), Water Corporation is also carting water to six water deficient declared areas for animal welfare needs. Approximately 250 tanker movements are carting water each week for town water supplies and water deficient declared areas.

The lack of rain has also meant that some on-farm dams are at low levels or empty, which has resulted in property owners becoming more reliant on standpipes connected to Water Corporation Schemes and this extra demand has made carting necessary over the last six months.

The total cost of carting to the schemes and to water deficient declared areas since January 2019 is estimated to be over \$4million and without any substantial rain this could potentially exceed \$11million by the end of June 2020.

With this in mind, Water Minister Dave Kelly has asked that householders, farmers and small businesses in our communities be careful with their water use and to only take as much water from standpipes as they need for their weekly needs.

Farmers are also still encouraged to complete the farm water surveys circulated previously by DWER, as these provide State Government Agencies working to support farming communities with essential information to help them to continue to provide assistance. Please Note: There is no kerbside recycling collection service in Lake King or Varley.

The recycling bins are collected by Warren Blackwood Waste and transported to a recycling facility. If items which are not recyclable are found the content can't be recycled and the load will be directed to the landfill.

If an item is covered in food, it is not recyclable. Food is one of the worst contaminants in the recycling process.

New laws for miniature motorbikes

Consumer Protection welcomes new safety requirements for miniature motorbikes, which strengthen consumer protection for young riders.

Miniature motorbikes are often copies of popular road motorcycles, such as grand prix race bikes or ‘chopper’ motorbikes and are usually about half the size of a full-size motorcycle.

Mini motorbikes might look like toys but because they have an engine or are electronically-powered, they are capable of high speeds – up to 80 kilometres an hour – so proper safety precautions need to be followed. Being able to ride that fast can be a risk to children who may not have rider experience or the cognitive development to operate a vehicle at high speeds, or even remember to put on protective gear.

Between 2005 and 2016 there were 14 deaths in Australia involving miniature motorcycles. It is important to remember that it is illegal to ride mini motorbikes on public roads. The new product safety law builds on existing requirements to prevent the supply of unsafe products, by requiring:

- miniature motorbikes to carry a warning statement to guide children, parents and carers about their safe use, including that children should always be supervised;
- miniature motorbikes to be fitted with a speed limiting device so that young or inexperienced riders can develop their skills before riding at higher speeds; and
- regulation of high speed electric-powered miniature motorbikes.

The safety standard excludes:

- vehicles with a maximum speed of 30 kilometres per hour or less, including toys, e-bicycles and e-scooters;
- smaller motorbikes eligible to be registered for road use; and
- smaller off-road minibikes designed and intended for use by children as a learner or as an introductory minibike.


Suppliers of mini motorbikes have 12 months from when the new law came into effect (18 December

METHOD

1. Preheat oven to 200C/180C fan-forced.
2. Cook frozen cauliflower and broccoli in a saucepan of boiling water for 2 minutes. Drain. Transfer to a bowl. Add frozen peas, corn and capsicum, and onion. Add flour. Season. Toss to combine. Transfer to a 6-cup-capacity baking dish.
3. Whisk cream, pesto and 1/2 cup parmesan in a jug. Pour over vegetables in dish. Combine remaining parmesan, mozzarella and breadcrumbs. Sprinkle over vegetables.
4. Bake for 20 minutes or until heated through and top is golden and crunchy. Serve topped with parsley.
