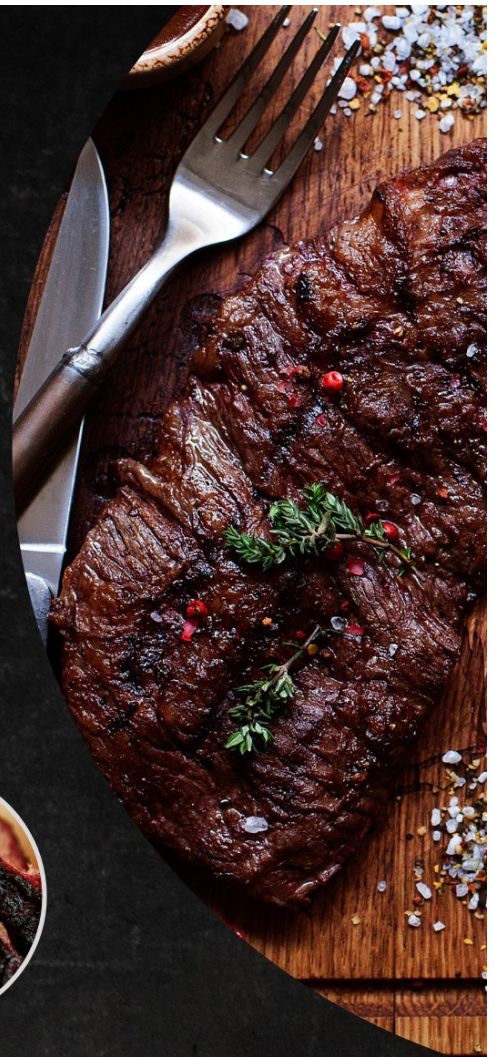

There are a total of three (3) vacancies for Shire of Lake Grace Council, which means that an election will be held Saturday 21 October 2023. This will be a postal election, so if you are on the electoral roll you can expect to receive a Postal Voting Election Pack in the coming weeks.

Optional Preferential Voting will be used in this election, which requires that voters only need to register a first preference on their ballot papers for their votes to be counted. Voters who wish to register one or more additional preferences among the remaining candidates are able to do so, using consecutive numbers.

Household Waste Collection is a weekly service and collected each Tuesday for Lake Grace, Newdegate, Lake King & Varley.

Recycling is a fortnightly service and alternates between Lake Grace and Newdegate. See below for the upcoming recycling collection dates.

Please Note: There is no kerbside recycling collection service in Lake King or Varley.

The recycling bins are collected by Warren Blackwood Waste and transported to a recycling facility. If items which are not recyclable are found, the contents can't be recycled and the load will be directed to the landfill.

If an item is covered in food, it is not recyclable. Food is one of the worst contaminants in the recycling process. By using the yellow top recycling bin correctly you are contributing, in a combined community effort, to reduce the amount of rubbish that is directed to landfill facilities each year.

Spring Equinox | 23rd September

What happens during equinox?

The equinox marks the transition from winter to spring in the southern hemisphere, and will have almost the same number of hours of daylight as darkness!

The equinox marks several astronomical phenomena too! During the equinox, the Sun will rise directly in the east and set due west.

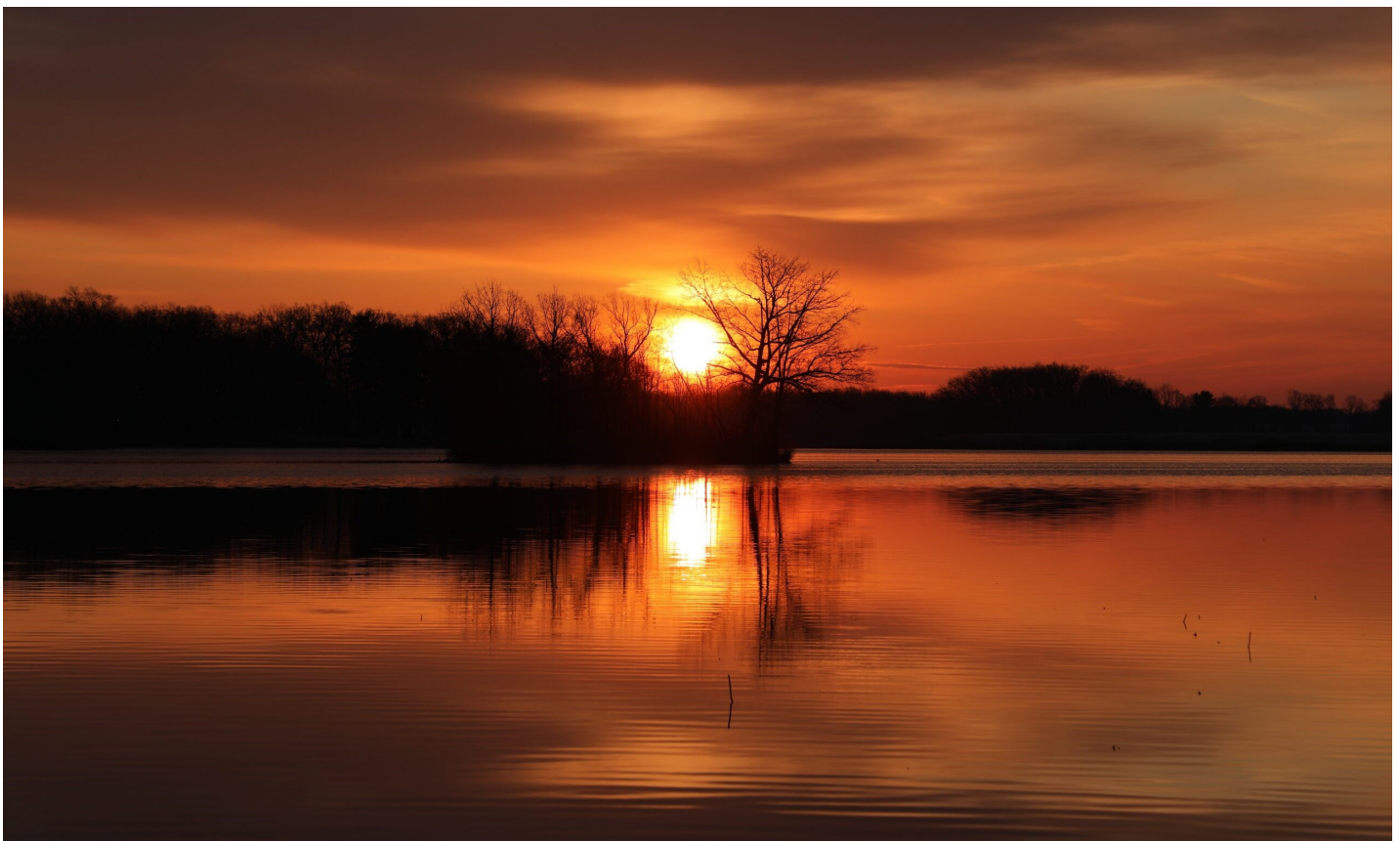
The Sun will also appear exactly halfway between its northern most and southern most location in the sky. The exact time of the equinox occurs when the sun is directly above the Earth's equator, for 2023 this will occur at 2:49pm for West Australians.

We thought it might be a good time to remind firearms licence holders of their storage obligations under the Firearms Regulations. During some recent visits to firearm holders, we found their storage fell well below par and was non-compliant. We strongly encourage you to ensure your firearm storage is adequate and compliant, not only to prevent any chances of being prosecuted but also to make theft of your property more difficult. This means firearms are to be stored in an approved firearms cabinet and not left where members of the public, or other household members, may have access to.

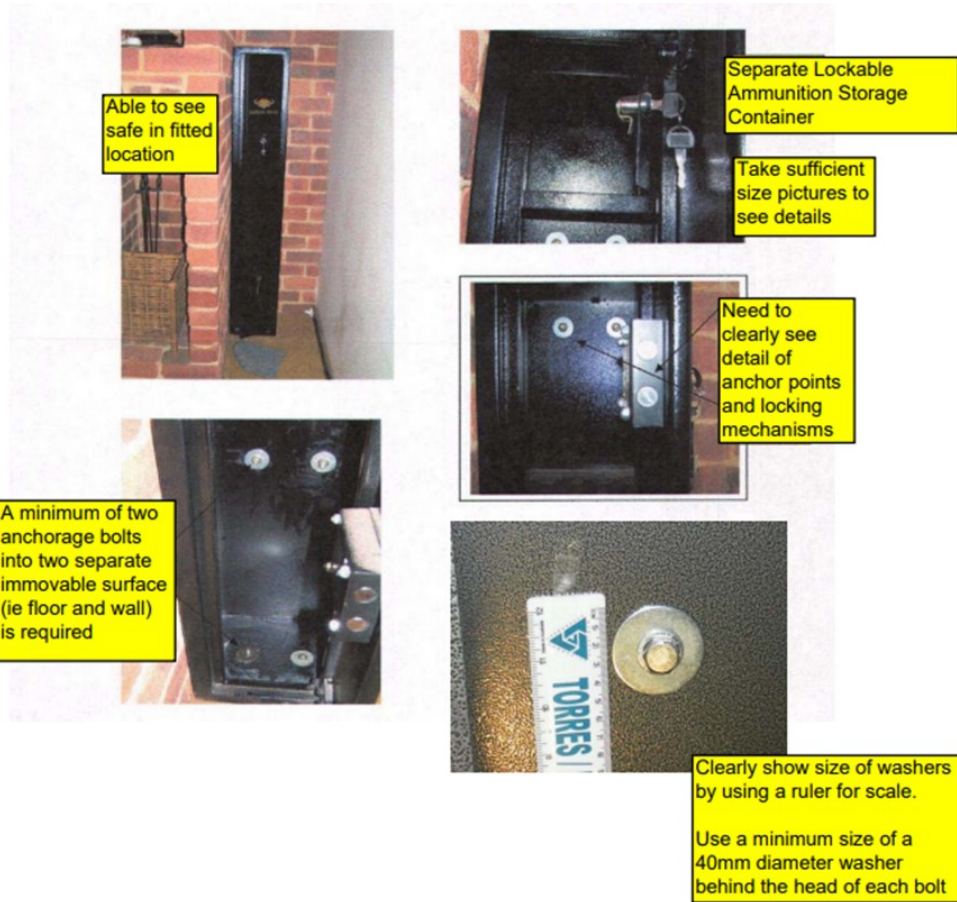

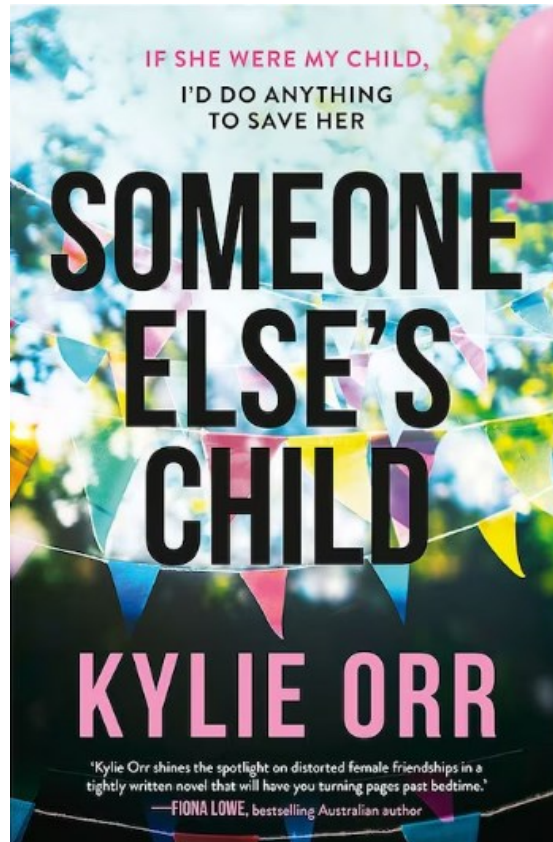

Ham and Cheese Potato Wheel

Ingredients

- 300g Desirée potatoes, peeled, cut into 3cm pieces
- 400g leg ham, cut into 2cm pieces
- 200g camembert, cut into small wedges
- 1/4 cup chopped fresh chives
- 125g (1/2 cup) sour cream
- 2 tsp Dijon mustard
- 10 filo pastry sheets
- 80g butter, melted
- 1 tbsp sesame seeds
- 300g tomato medley mix, halved
- Fresh continental parsley leaves, to serve
- 1 tbsp lemon-infused olive oil (If you don't have lemon-infused oil, add 1 tsp finely grated lemon rind to 1 tbs olive oil)

Method

Preheat oven to 220C/200C fan forced. Place the potato in a large saucepan and cover with plenty of cold water. Bring to the boil over high heat. Cook for 10-15 minutes or until just tender when pierced with a skewer. Drain then transfer to a heatproof bowl and set aside to cool completely.

Add the ham, camembert, chives, sour cream and mustard to the bowl. Season then toss until combined.



Lightly grease a 22cm (base size) round fluted tart tin with removable base with oil.

Place the filo on a clean work surface. Cover with a dry tea towel then a damp tea towel (to prevent the filo drying out). Brush 1 filo sheet with a little butter. Fold in half crossways. Place over base and up side of prepared tin, allowing the filo to overhang side. Repeat with remaining filo and most of the butter, overlapping sheets, to completely cover base and side of tin.

Spoon the ham mixture into the filo case. Carefully fold over the overhanging filo to enclose filling. Brush with remaining butter and sprinkle with sesame seeds. Bake for 25-30 minutes or until golden. Set aside in pan for 10 minutes to cool slightly.

Transfer the tart to a serving plate. Top with the tomato and parsley. Season and drizzle over the infused oil to serve.
