A Beginner's Guide To **MACRAME**Setting up your Workspace

Before you start a new project, you'll need to set up a macrame workspace. Make sure you have adequate lighting and enough room to move around comfortably.

Depending on the type and size of your project, you can work horizontally on a flat surface, or vertically on a hanging setup.

Horizontal Setup

You can do some smaller projects on a flat, horizontal surface – like a tabletop. Secure the starting end of the piece to the table to keep tension on the cords as you work. For smaller pieces, like macrame bracelets, you can secure them underneath the clip of a clipboard.

Vertical Setup

Larger projects, especially wall hangings, will require a vertical workspace. Hang your work high enough that you can work comfortably.

Here are a few strategies for hanging your piece:

- Hang a wood dowel rod from a clothing rack.
- Over the back of a door
- Over the back of a tall chair
- From a doorknob

Basic Macrame Knots

Now that you have your materials and your workspace, you're ready to learn the basic macrame knotting techniques.

Macrame knots are easy to learn, but they do take some practice to truly master. Once you know these common macrame knots, you'll be able to recreate all of the beautiful projects you see online.

Here are the knots you'll need to know, broken down into four categories: mounting knots, square knots, hitch knots, and gathering knots.

Mounting Knots


Use mounting knots to attach your rope to a dowel rod or wooden ring.

Lark's Head Knot

The lark's head knot is a super simple knot used to attach your rope to a dowel rod, ring, or even another rope. It can be tied forward-facing or reverse-facing. Here's how to tie both:

To make a Lark's Head Knot:

- 1. Measure and cut a length of cord. Fold the rope in half, bringing the ends together.
- 2. Bring the folded loop up in front of the dowel, then back down behind the dowel. With the loop pointing downwards, pull the two ends of the cord through the loop.
- 3. Pull down on the ends to tighten the knot, making sure both ends are even



Reverse Lark's Head Knot

To make a reverse lark's head knot:

- 1. Measure and cut a length of cord. Fold the rope in half.
- 2. Bring the folded loop up behind the dowel, then forward and down in front of the dowel. With the loop pointing downward, pull the ends of the rope up and through the loop.
- 3. Pull down on the ends to tighten the knot, making sure both ends are even.

Square Knots and Variations

Square Knots and Half Square Knots are versatile

macrame knots that you'll use in almost every pattern. Square Knot, also called Left-facing Square Knot

This category of knots is made with four cords: two outer cords, called working cords, around two middle cords, called filler cords.

Half Square Knot

Cut two pieces of rope, and attach them to a wooden dowel with a lark's head knot. You will now have four strands of cord.

To make a half square knot:

- 1. Bring the left working cord over the two filler cords and under the right working cord.
- 2. Bring the right working cord under the two filler cords and up over the left working cord.
- 3. Tighten the knot.



Right Half Square Knot


This is the mirror image of the previous half square knot.

- 1. Bring the right working cord over the two filler cords and under the left cord.
- 2. Bring the left working cord under the two filler cords and up over the right cord.
- 3. Tighten the knot.

Square Knot

Each square knot is made from two half square knots, worked one after the other.

Work a left half-square knot followed by a right half-square knot.



Right-Facing Square knot

Work a right half-square knot followed by a left half-square knot.

Half Knot Spiral

The spiral knot is a sequence of half-square knots worked one after another. Make sure all of the half square knots are facing the same way.

Hitches and Variations

This third category of knots makes beautiful designs but can be a bit trickier for beginners.

Double Half Hitch Knot, also called Clove Hitch Knot


This is a variation of the half hitch knot. It can be tied to create horizontal, vertical, and even diagonal lines in macrame pieces.

Half Hitch

The half hitch knot is a simple knot that can be combined in different ways. You can tie hitch knots with an existing project cord, or a new cord.

Horizontal Double Half Hitch

A row of horizontal double half hitch knots made a raised bar across your work. Each horizontal double half hitch knot is made from two half hitch knots made from the same working cord.



Diagonal Double Half Hitch Knot

Diagonal double half hitch knots are very similar to horizontal double half hitch knots, except the row of knots is positioned diagonally instead of horizontally.



Gathering Knots

And finally, we have a group of knots that are used to finish projects.

Overhand Knot


The overhand knot is often used to prevent the end of a length of rope from unraveling. Overhand knots can also be used to tie two cords together at the bottom of a piece.

Wrapping Knot

Use a wrapping knot to secure a group of cords. You

can use this knot at the beginning or end of a macrame project.

- 1. Cut a long length of cord. (You will trim it to size later.)
- 2. Gather the group of cords that need to be wrapped. Bring the folded end of the working cord down to the area you want to wrap.
- 3. Wrap the working cord around the grouped cords. Pass the working cord through the loop, and pull the other end to secure.



How to Add Fringe to Macrame

The type of fringe you can create depends on the type of cord you've used for the project.

- 1. Trim the cords to your desired length.
- Use a stiff wire brush to brush the cords, starting and the ends and working up. Brushing the cords will separate the fibers to create a fine fringe.
- 3. Trim the ends again with sharp scissors.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS 2023

Currently here at the Shire of Lake Grace we have eight Elected members serving as Councilors. Elected members serve a four-year term. Local Government elections in Western Australia are held every two (2) years.

The 2023 ordinary local government election will be held on Saturday, 21 October 2023.

Under the Local Government Reforms introduced in May 2023, the number of elected members for the Shire of Lake Grace will drop to seven (7). This means that out of the four (4) elected members whose terms are due to expire in 2023 there will be three (3) positions to fill.

CONDUCTING ELECTIONS.

The Electoral Commissioner is responsible for conducting all local government postal elections in Western Australia and can also conduct voting in person elections on request under the Local Government Act 1995. By making the Electoral Commissioner responsible for those elections, the local governments concerned ensure that elections are conducted independently and with impartiality.

For local government elections, rolls close at 5.00pm, 50 days prior to polling day. All electors should check their details are up to date before rolls close on 25 August 2023.

If the number of candidates is equal to the number of vacancies, the candidate is elected unopposed. If there are more candidates than vacancies, the election will proceed.

While voting in a local government election is not compulsory in Western Australia, all electors are strongly encouraged to vote.

RESIDENTS ROLL.

The residents Roll is maintained by the Western Australian Electoral Commission. People who live in the Shire of Lake Grace and are enrolled on the State electoral roll will automatically be placed on this roll.

You can check your enrolment status by using the Online Enrolment Check tool on the Western Australian Electoral Commission's website. A link can also be found on the Shire of Lake Grace website.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT CANDIDATES.

Nominations open: Thursday 31 August

Nominations close: Thursday 7 September, 4pm

To be a candidate under the Local Government Act 1995, you must be:

- An elector of the district (residential or owner/occupier and,
- Over 18 years of age

ABORIGINAL CULTURAL HERITAGE ACT EDUCATION WORKSHOP CANCELLED

In light of the State Government's announcement to progress changes to Aboriginal heritage legislation, all upcoming education sessions are now cancelled.

The intention is to repeal—remove—the Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act 2021 and restore an amended version of the Aboriginal Heritage Act 1972.

Any future sessions will be considered once the amendment Bill passes through Parliament and in line with the requirements of the new system, which will include returning to what is known as the Section 18 approvals process.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINARY ELECTION CLOSE OF ENROLMENTS Shire of Lake Grace ROLL CLOSE: 5:00 PM Friday, 25 August 2023

You may be eligible to be enrolled to vote in the local government elections on 21 October 2023 if you live in or are an owner or occupier of rateable property in the Shire of Lake Grace.

Residents

You are automatically enrolled to vote if you are on the State Electoral Roll as at 5:00 PM Friday, 25 August 2023. If you are not already on the State Electoral Roll and meet the eligibility criteria, or if you have changed address recently, you must complete an enrolment form.

Enrolment Forms

You can enrol or update your details online, or download an enrolment form, via the Western Australian Electoral Commission website (www.elections.wa.qov.au/enrol). Forms are also available from the Australian Electoral Commission (www.aec.gov.au). Enrolments and updates must be completed and received by 5:00 PM Friday, 25 August 2023.

Non-Resident Owners and Occupiers

If you are a non-resident owner or occupier of rateable property in the Shire of Lake Grace and are on the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll, you are eligible to enrol to vote. If you are not on the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll and own or occupy rateable property in the Shire of Lake Grace you may be eligible to enrol to vote. This applies if you were on the last electoral roll for the Shire of Lake Grace prior to May 1996 and have owned or occupied rateable property in the district continuously since this time. Please contact your local government for details. Owners of land who were on the last Local Government roll continue to retain that status until they cease to own the rateable property to which the enrolment relates. Occupiers do not have continuous enrolment and should contact the Shire of Lake Grace to confirm their enrolment status. To be eligible to enrol as an occupier, you will need to have a right of continuous occupation under a lease, tenancy agreement or other legal instrument for at least the next three months following the date of the application to enrol.

Joint Owners and Occupiers

If a rateable property is owned or occupied by more than two people, a majority of the owners/occupiers may nominate two persons from amongst themselves who are on either the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll, to enrol as owner/occupier electors.

Corporations

A body corporate that owns or occupies rateable property may nominate two people who are on either the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll to enrol as owner/occupier electors.

Enrolment Forms – Non-Resident Owners and Occupiers Only

Enrolment forms can be obtained from local governments and must be lodged with the Chief Executive Officer by 5:00 PM Friday, 25 August 2023. Further information can be obtained from the Shire of Lake Grace.



Sagittarius and the Teapot | 19th August

Time for a cuppa! Can you see a "Teapot" in the night sky? Yes, there's really a teapot up there! But we haven't found the kitchen sink yet!

The "Teapot" is what's known as an asterism rather than a constellation. A constellation is an area of the sky that is officially recognised by the International Astronomical Union. Whereas, an asterism is a pattern of stars that we can use to make up a recognisable shape or object. Some asterisms form part of official constellations.

The "Teapot" asterism is part of the constellation of Sagittarius. In the Southern Hemisphere, Sagittarius appears upside down and so is the "Teapot". Grab a nice cup of tea, head outside, use the Moon as your guide and try and see if you can see the "Teapot".

When and where to look: Look directly above at around 8.30pm on 19th August.

Something Interesting

When you look towards the constellation of Sagittarius, you're looking to the heart of the Milky Way Galaxy. In the Southern Hemisphere the heart of the Milky Way is high overhead. We're lucky to see it much better here than in the Northern Hemisphere.

After some frantic phoning around we managed to find our third man from Corrigin Police Station.

It was great to see so many local faces on the day despite the rain, and we had a thoroughly enjoyable day out and somehow managed to pick up second place (some contributed more than others). A big thank you for all of those involved in the organisation of the event, we are already looking forward to the next one.

Crime News

We have been busy assisting our neighbouring stations over the past fortnight with a mixed bag of jobs, including a welfare check out in Dunn Rock, and a drunken male causing no end of dramas in Corrigin, thankfully he decided to go to sleep on a park bench and caught the next available bus out of town.

We've had reports of people in our area being targeted by romance scams recently. You may not be aware, but this sort of activity has been going on for years and can be devastating emotionally and financially.

We thought we'd explain a little bit about this type of scam and what to look out for, not just yourselves but also friends and family.

In short, a scammer uses dating or friendship to win your trust and get your money.

Never assume a person that you've only met online is who they say they are. Scammers go to great lengths to convince you the relationship is real and manipulate you to give them money. Romance scammers will leave you broke and broken-hearted.

Scammers will find you on social media, dating or gaming apps and websites. They might also text or email you. They hide behind fake profiles and identities, sometimes of famous people. They're really good at making you feel special, so you believe the relationship is real.

Once you trust them, they have an 'emergency' and ask you to give them products or money to help them. Or they ask you to do things for them, like set up accounts or transfer money they give you. Scammers can wait years to build this trust.

Warning signs it might be a scam

- They express strong feelings quickly and the relationship moves fast. You are made to feel special quickly.
- If you are chatting on your usual social media platform or an official dating service, they will quickly try and move the conversation offsite, for example to WhatsApp.
- Romance scammers will encourage secrecy and will influence you to only trust them. They may try to isolate you from your family and friends.
- There will always be an excuse why they can't meet in person or show themselves on camera.
 They say they live overseas or somewhere remote, or their technology isn't working.

Other things to look for

- Their online profile doesn't match what they tell you about themselves.
- They talk about money or investments. They might say they know about cryptocurrency and offer to teach you.
- You are asked for personal photos, videos or information they could use against you in the future.
- The scammer gets desperate or angry if you don't do what they ask. They may threaten to cut off the relationship.

Steps you can take to protect yourself

Never send or transfer money to someone you haven't met

- If your online connection asks you for money, they are likely a scammer. Stop contact right away and seek support.
- Don't send money, card or bank details or important identity documents like your passport to someone you've only met online: No matter how long you've been messaging them.
- Never agree to transfer money for someone else. It's called money laundering and being involved is a criminal offence.

Check the person is who they say they are

- Take things slowly. Ask lots of questions and watch for things that don't add up.
- Search for the scammer's name along with the word 'scam' in a search, and look for websites about romance scams in the results.

Be careful what you share (and what you don't)

 Never send intimate pictures or videos of yourself to people you don't know. Scammers

- use these to blackmail people.
- Don't keep your online relationship a secret.
 Speak to people you know about it. It can be easier for others to spot the warning signs.
- Be careful about what you share about yourself online. Scammers can use information about your hobbies, job or family to target you.

Learn how to spot a fake profile

They usually have:

- photos that look too professional
- very little personal information
- no connection to social media accounts
- few comments, likes or shares on their social media from other people

Take care and stay safe.

Grain Brokers Australia Weekly Market Report

Global wheat supplies tighten amid growing geopolitical uncertainty...

The United States Department of Agriculture released its latest World Agricultural Supply and Demand estimates last week, and while the global wheat production estimate for 2023/24 was down compared to the July update, the changes were largely expected and had essentially been baked into market rationale and global values.

This month's global wheat outlook is for lower opening stocks, decreased production, reduced consumption, declining international trade, and lower ending stocks compared to the July update. The USDA tinkered with the old crop numbers resulting in a 1 million metric tonne decrease in worldwide opening stocks to 268.3MMT. With production in 2023/24 lowered by 3.3MMT to 793.4MMT, still 1.8MMT higher than in 2022/23, we have a 4.3MMT reduction in global supplies to 1,061.7MMT. This compares to the USDA's 2022/23 global wheat supply of 1062.6MMT.

The USDA trimmed 2.2MMT of its July wheat export number to land on global trade of 209.4MMT this month, down 4.2 per cent from 218.6MMT in the 2022/23 marketing year. All this adds up to a worldwide ending stock projection of 265.6MMT, 0.9MT lower than July and 2.7MMT less than this season's revised opening stock number. This will be the lowest global wheat carry-out figure since 2015/16 when it was 247MMT, and global consumption has increased more than 10 per cent in the ensuing years.

Russian wheat production unchanged month-on-month at 85MMT seems reasonable given most of the local analysts and consultants are thereabouts or even a little higher in recent weeks. Respected Black Sea agricultural consultancy SovEcon is currently calling the Russian wheat production 87.1MMT compared to 104.2MMT last season. The USDA is yet to subscribe to such a big crop in 2022/23, leaving its old crop estimate at 92MMT. The crop was reportedly around 42 per cent harvested midway through last week against 31 per cent a year earlier.

The USDA increased exports by 0.5MMT to 48MMT, which is certainly possible given the pace of exports in the 2022/23 marketing year. SovEcon raised its 2023/34 export forecast by 0.9MMT to 48.1MMT last week. The world needs Russian exports, and Russia yearns for the hard currency, so any disruptions to the flow of grain from Russian ports could be explosive for global wheat prices. The Russian military is inspecting all ships before they enter the Kerch Strait for fear they could be floating bombs. Rumours are also circulating that the threat of attacks on Russian Black Sea ports and the Kerch Strait Bridge could force Putin to reconsider the Black Sea grain corridor deal.

Elsewhere in the region, the USDA increased Ukrainian wheat production by 3.5MMT to 21MMT on the back of updated planted area estimates from Ukraine's Ministry of Agriculture. Timely rainfall and favourable temperatures in most regions also raised yield prospects. Exports remain unchanged at 10.5MMT, which will rely heavily on alternate export routes through Europe with the Black Sea corridor currently closed. Production in Kazakhstan also increased, with the USDA landing on 15MMT, 1MMT higher than July but 1.4MMT lower than last season. Exports at 9.5MMT were unchanged compared to both last month and last season.

Despite the reports of widespread crop losses in late May and June, the USDA only shaved 3MMT off Chinese wheat production for 2023/24. The output of 137MMT now sits slightly lower than the 137.7MMT reportedly produced last season but much higher than where the market was expecting when the flooding was reported. The token reduction allowed the USDA to leave imports at just 12MMT, 1.3MMT less than in 2022/23, but this is widely expected to be higher by season's end.

US wheat production was unchanged compared to July, but there were some changes among the classes. Hard Red Winter wheat production increased slightly, Soft Red Winter wheat output increased by four per cent, and spring wheat production decreased by six per cent. US export projections were reduced from 19.7MMT to 19.1MMT.

The USDA left the Australian wheat production number at 29MMT this month. While this represents a 27 per cent year-on-year reduction in output, it seems a fair prognosis given seasonal growing conditions across the country this year. Some regions are as good as last year, but others suffer from a lack of rainfall. In many instances, the subsoil moisture is good, but more rain is needed to join it up with the surface moisture band. Exports of 21.5MMT, also unchanged from July, are certainly achievable, but the

opening stock number of 2.8MMT is probably 35 per cent of reality, and the closing stock number of 2.8MMT is around half of reality.

Drought conditions continue to intensify across the Canadian Prairies, leading the USDA to cut its Canadian wheat production forecast from 35MT in July to 33MMT this month, which is now almost 1MMT lower than last season's output. Accordingly, exports were also trimmed by 2MMT compared to July to 24.5MMT, 1MMT lower than 2022/23.

Unusually hot and dry weather conditions through the spring and summer saw soil moisture deficits grow and yields fall across much of the European Union, and now excessive rainfall in some regions during harvest is seeing an increase in quality downgrades. The USDA has reacted by trimming 3MMT off the production outlook over the last month to land on 135MMT in August, still almost 1MMT higher than last season. However, the USDSA left exports unchanged at 38.5MMT, against 34.5MMT last season, a tall order if the Russian program continues unimpeded.

Surprisingly, the USDA left Argentinian wheat production and exports unchanged at 17.5MMT and 12MMT, respectively. While this is a huge improvement on last season, the drought conditions that decimated last year's crop largely remain in many winter cropping regions. Soil moisture reserves have recovered somewhat in the past month, but large swathes of the planted area were seeded into parched soils and have been stressed since emergence.

The two biggest surprises in last week's global supply and demand revision were leaving Indian wheat production unchanged at 113.5MMT, which allowed the USDA to leave imports at just 1MMT. The production number is far too high compared to local reports, other than those of the optimistic government, which is facing an election next year.

The government said it would offer 5MMT of wheat from state reserves to large domestic millers to cool prices, but in reality, India will need to import substantial quantities of wheat before the next harvest to keep food inflation in check. With demand from the growing middle classes increasing at a much quicker rate than production, India will be dropping the 40 per cent wheat import duty in the not-too-distant future and, like China, will likely become a regular, and sometimes substantial, entrant on the demand side of the global balance sheet in coming years.



Yellowface

By R.F.KUANG



What's the harm in a pseudonym? Bestselling sensation Juniper Song is not who she says she is, she didn't write the book she claims she wrote, and she is most certainly *not* Asian American—in this chilling and hilariously cutting novel from the #1 New York Times bestselling author R. F. Kuang in the vein of White Ivy and The Other Black Girl.

Authors June Hayward and Athena Liu were supposed to be twin rising stars: same year at Yale, same debut year in publishing. But Athena's a cross-genre literary darling, and June didn't even get a paperback release. Nobody wants stories about basic white girls, June thinks.

So when June witnesses Athena's death in a freak accident, she acts on impulse: she steals Athena's just-finished masterpiece, an experimental novel about the unsung contributions of Chinese laborers to the British and French war efforts during World War I.

So what if June edits Athena's novel and sends it to her agent as her own work? So what if she lets her new publisher rebrand her as Juniper Song—complete with an ambiguously ethnic author photo? Doesn't this piece of history deserve to be told, whoever the teller? That's what June claims, and the *New York Times* bestseller list seems to agree.

But June can't get away from Athena's shadow, and emerging evidence threatens to bring June's (stolen) success down around her. As June races to protect her secret, she discovers exactly how far she will go to keep what she thinks she deserves.

With its totally immersive first-person voice, *Yellowface* takes on questions of diversity, racism, and cultural appropriation not only in the publishing industry but the persistent erasure of Asian-American voices and history by Western white society. R. F. Kuang's novel is timely, razor-sharp, and eminently readable.



Beef and Beer Stew with Cheesy Mash Topping

Ingredients

60ml (1/4 cup) olive oil

1.5kg beef chuck steak, cut into 4cm pieces

100g piece speck, cut into lardons

3 carrots, peeled, coarsely chopped

2 brown onions, coarsely chopped

2 garlic cloves, finely chopped

3 fresh thyme sprigs

500ml (2 cups) Massel beef style liquid stock

250ml (1 cup) beer

90g (1/3 cup) tomato paste

300g button mushrooms, halved

Small fresh parsley leaves, to sprinkle

Cheesy mash topping

1.2kg Sebago potatoes, peeled, chopped

50g butter, chopped

125ml (1/2 cup) hot milk

40g (1/2 cup) finely grated parmesan

Melted butter, to brush

Method

Heat 1 tbs oil in a large flameproof heavy-based casserole dish over medium-high heat. Add one-third of the beef and cook, turning, for 3-4 minutes or until browned. Transfer to a heatproof bowl. Repeat with the remaining oil and the beef in 2 more batches.

Reduce the heat to medium-low. Add the speck to the dish. Cook, stirring often, for 3-4 minutes or until golden and crisp. Add the carrot, onion,



garlic and thyme. Cook, stirring often, for 3-5 minutes or until the onion is softened.

Add the stock, beer and tomato paste to the dish. Cook, scraping the base of the dish with a wooden spoon to dislodge any cooked-on bits, for 2-3 minutes or until reduced slightly. Return the beef to the dish. Season. Bring to the boil. Reduce heat to low. Simmer, covered, for 1 hour. Uncover. Stir in the mushroom. Simmer for 1 hour or until meat is tender and liquid has reduced slightly.

Meanwhile, for the topping, place the potato in a saucepan. Cover with cold water. Bring to the boil over medium heat and cook for 25 minutes or until tender. Drain. Return to the pan. Cook over low heat for 2-3 minutes or until dry. Use a potato masher to mash until smooth. Gradually mash in the butter and milk. Stir in the parmesan. Season. Cool slightly.

Preheat grill on high. Transfer mash to a piping bag fitted with a 2cm plain nozzle and pipe the mash onto the beef mixture. Gently brush with melted butter. Place under grill. Grill for 5-10 minutes or until mash is golden. Sprinkle with parsley.




