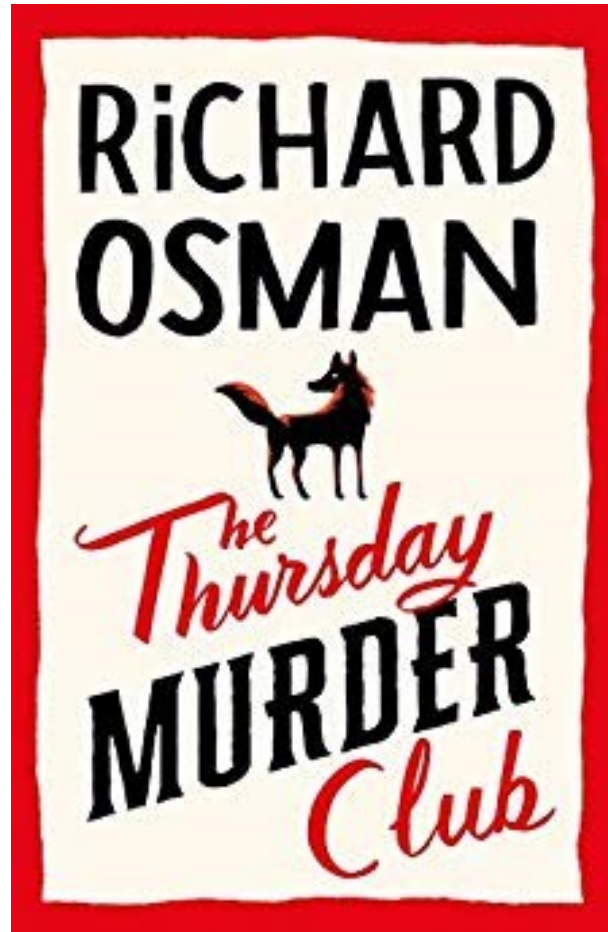

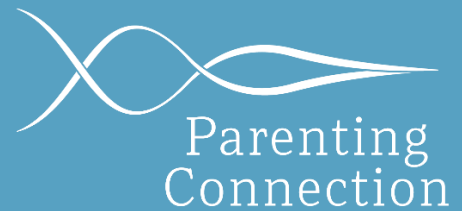
In a peaceful retirement village, four unlikely friends meet up once a week to investigate unsolved murders.

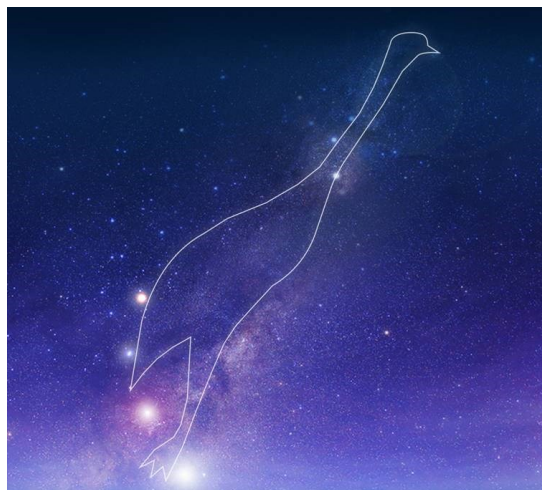

Have You Seen the Emu In The Sky?

One of the most incredible objects to see in the night sky is the Aboriginal constellation of the Emu In The Sky. It lies within the band of the Milky Way and its shape is outlined by dark areas of the night sky, not the stars. The Emu is best seen throughout winter in dark country skies and is spectacular, spreading right across the evening sky.

To find it, first locate the Southern Cross constellation above the southern horizon. Two bright stars directly above due south are, “the Pointers” to the Southern Cross. The Southern Cross is to the right of “the Pointers”.

On the left-hand side of the Southern Cross, try to find a dark oval shape, called the Coalsack Nebula. This is the head of the Emu with the beak pointing downward. The long neck stretches to the left through the middle of “the Pointers”. The body and legs of the Emu stretch halfway across the horizon towards the east.

When to look: 8.30pm, mid-June.

Which direction to look: South.

South Western Australia’s Indigenous people lived by six seasons. When the Emu is seen high in the sky, it indicates weather is changing and getting colder and wetter. This season is called Makuru and was a time to move inland for sheltered locations. Campfires formed the heart of communities, providing warmth and a place to gather for music and storytelling.

Another beautiful cosmic view to enjoy will be on the 22nd June when Mars, Venus and the Moon make a close approach together. The three celestial objects will form an almost perfect equilateral triangle in the western sky. The evening star Venus, the red planet Mars and the lovely thin slither of the Moon will make a spectacular site in the twilight sky.

When to look: Sunset to 8.00pm on the 22nd June.

Which direction to look: North west.

We have had a busy fortnight, with double demerits over the long weekend and assisting the surrounding police stations with tasking.

We also visited Lake Grace District High School, who have arranged for us to speak with some of the older students about cyber bullying and cyber safety. Whilst we did something similar at the end of last year, it appears to be an ongoing issue.

The prevalence of mobile phone and social media use amongst children and adolescents requires parents, caregivers, and families to take measures to protect children from this behaviour. We'll be giving some advice about what you can do in future editions.

CRIME NEWS

We mentioned in the last edition the man who had left his firearm in his employer's safe and moved away. Well he has continued to give us the run around and still hasn't surrendered his firearm's bolt. We've spoken to the Inspector in charge of Firearms Licensing and he has approved the revocation of the man's licence and he will be barred from ever obtaining one again.

Once the paperwork is served on the male he will be committing the offence of Unlicensed Person Possessing a Firearm (or component).

In some good news, the group allegedly responsible for the spate of burglaries across the region have been arrested and charged. Funnily enough, the burglaries have stopped, which is a reassuring sign.

We recently assisted Kondinin Police with a Burglary and Stealing offence. An unknown person had gained entry to the Karlgarin Country Club. Once inside offenders have located the key to the safe and subsequently helped themselves to a fair amount of cash. To give them credit, the offenders then very kindly locked the safe and returned the key to its not-so-secret location.

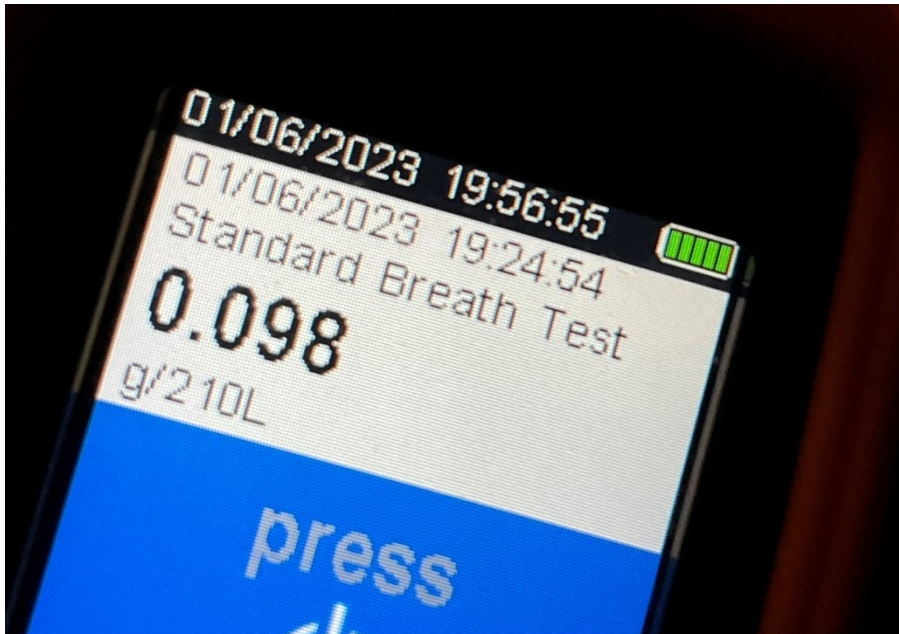
A forensic examination was carried out at the scene and we are awaiting the results back from the Chem Centre in Perth.

CEO Chat

Winter came a day early last week with some decent rainfalls received throughout the Shire, hopefully there wasn't too much damage caused.

The roadworks at the Stubbs St South Main Rd intersection in Lake Grace has been completed with not too much disruption to the public. The Main Roads hierarchy for the region met with myself, Craig Elefsen and Sgt. Egan-Reid at the intersection on Thursday 1 June to discuss the outcome and any concerns. The intersection will be monitored over the next 12 months for its efficacy and any perceived shortcomings will be discussed.



We have several irons in the fire at the moment for some grant funding opportunities which include;

1. The development of some more residential land for release in Lake Grace. At the moment we have only 2 vacant lots for sale left in Quondong Court development due to popular demand in recent times.
2. Renovations and additions to the Lake King Sports pavilion
3. The development and release of more light industrial land in Dewar St Lake Grace.

These things take some time to prepare submissions and getting approval can be a lengthy wait so let's hope we get approvals across the line.

The Community Strategic Plan Review is well underway with a very pleasing number of surveys being returned. Thank you to all those that have completed the surveys. They are currently being collated ready for the next steps.

Some highlights from the 24 May Council meeting were;

- Due to concerns expressed from a neighbouring landowner Council approval was sought for the closure of Walker Road. This road is virtually a no through road that runs to the edge of Lake Grace North and is impassible after rains. The closure of the road will be advertised for public comment. Council voted 7/1 in favour of the closure.
- Main Roads received a request from a local transport company to have all the roads within the Varley town site assessed as being included in the RAV road network. This would allow all heavy vehicles to travel on what are basically residential roads within the town. Council resolved to advise Main Roads that permission to access the roads will only be given to the local contractor under a Restricted Local Access Permit.

- Council endorsed a review of the Shire of Lake Grace Financial Management Systems and procedures carried out by an independent consultant. This is a requirement of the Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996.
- The Council approved the sale of Lot216 Quondong Court to Akron Pty Ltd and this is subject to public comment as per government regulations. Details are on the shire website.
- The CEO Annual Performance Review was endorsed by Council.

The Aboriginal Cultural Heritage (ACH) Act 2021 comes into effect on 1 July 2023 and there are wide ranging ramifications for farmers, land owners and the shire. You are strongly advised to visit the Shire website for details of the workshops being held. We have contacted DPLH and requested that a workshop be held in the shire as the nearest workshops are in Esperance and Merredin!

Weather Cams for Aviation

In early May this year all Aviators and the General Community gained access to real time weather information via the installation of weather cameras giving the current state of conditions at Newdegate.

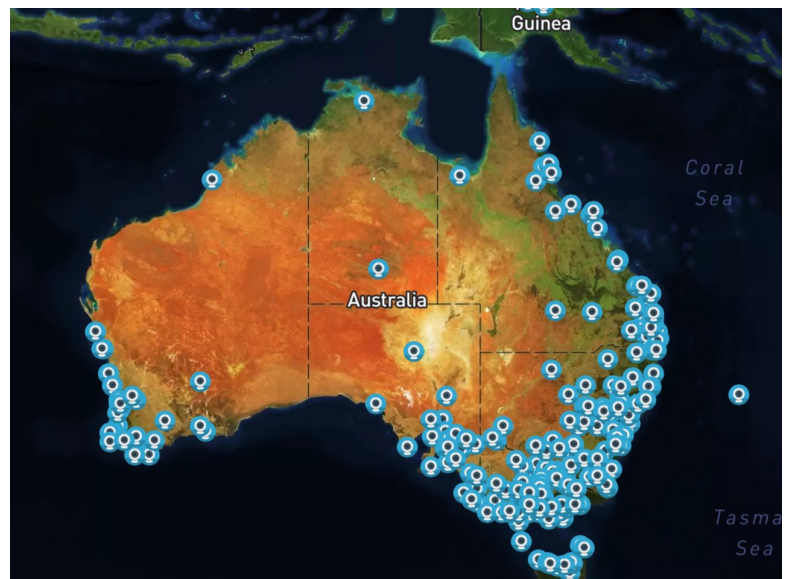
Weather cameras have been operating Australia Wide for some years, understandably the Eastern States have been very well catered for, but certainly not so many in Western Australia. Pilots and the community in general have been able to access the skyline vision from any of these installations at any time and this has contributed very much to the safety of all aircraft, especially General Aviation Aircraft. (light aircraft) Pilots and others can simply touch on the camera icons to view conditions for enroute planning or for potential landing conditions.

Recently entrepreneur and pilot Dick Smith donated \$\$ funds to increase the coverage available, especially but not exclusively in the more remote areas. We were able to obtain the necessary hardware for Newdegate via this very generous initiative. The camera system Australia Wide is coordinated by Aus Web Cams but installations are fitted and maintained locally. After obtaining the gear the next step was to find a location with web access, we were very fortunate to get approval from the Field Day Committee to host the installation via their NBN connection at the Field Day Site building, this generous gesture is really appreciated.

The two cameras are now located on the roof and show a view facing South and West, the directions most significant weather events come in from. Newdegate is very strategically located being roughly half distance from Perth to Esperance and also Albany to Kalgoorlie so our installation fills in a previously blank part on the map.

Pilots can access the vision while flying via their EFB (electronic flight bags) such as OzRunways or AvPlan, and anyone can use the information via the free MyAirportCams (just google myairportcams and save the page)..... See real time weather all around Australia and surprise friends and relatives at other locations ! Picture below showing the scope of these installations all over the country. Special thanks to all involved getting this project up and running, and especially locally Rocky, Hope and Roz.

Grain Brokers Australia Weekly Market Report

Ongoing drought in North Africa threatens food security...

As the summer harvest season begins in the Maghreb region of North Africa, severe drought has decimated the production outlook, leading to higher food prices, an increased reliance on food imports, and exacerbating the risks of political uncertainty, social unrest and economic instability throughout the region.

Among the most arid in the world, the region, which includes Morocco, Algeria, Tunisia and Libya, is facing its worst drought this century. The United Nations Food and Agriculture Organisation rates North Africa as one of the world's most water-stressed regions, and estimates that around 85 per cent of the accessible fresh water is required for agricultural production.

According to European Commission's most recent outlook bulletin for North Africa, released by the Joint Research Centre's Monitoring Agricultural Resources (MARS) on May 22, drought conditions were particularly intense in March, negatively impacting the photosynthesis process of winter cereals during and after the critical flowering stage.

The abnormally dry conditions also accelerated ripening throughout April at the expense of yield resulting in downward production revisions in all countries except Libya and increasing the probability of crop failures for several cereal-producing areas of the Maghreb. The worst affected regions are reportedly Oriental (Morocco), Mascara, Saida, Oum El Bouaghi, Khenchela and Tebessa (Algeria), Le Kef, Siliana and Zaghuan (Tunisia).

In Morocco, extreme drought conditions and above-average temperatures accelerated crop senescence through April and early May, severely denting the yield outlook for both wheat and barley. Almost no rain has fallen in the country's cropping regions since early March, with areas such as Rabat, Fez, Tangier and Oriental receiving just 20-30 per cent of the long-term average since February 11. Below-average crop biomass accumulation is apparent across all of Morocco's primary cereal-growing districts, with crop failures highly likely in the Oriental region.

MARS has pegged Moroccan wheat production at 3.606 million metric tonne off 2.433 million hectares. While this is up 34 per cent on last year's disaster, it is still 25 per cent below the five-year average production of 4.83MMT. The planted area and forecast yield of 1.48 metric tonne per hectare are around 10 per cent and 17 per cent lower than the five-year average, respectively.

This year's barley harvest in Morocco is expected to total 1.121MMT, a 60 per cent improvement on the 2022 harvest but still 31 per cent below the five-year average. The planted area of 1.137 million hectares is 16 per cent below the five-year average, and the yield of 0.99MT/ha is 18 per cent lower.

Algeria's winter crop production outlook was already poor entering the northern hemisphere spring, and the worsening drought conditions through March and April have shattered this season's production outlook. Cumulative rainfall registrations in some regions from February 11 to May 10 were the lowest in more than 40 years. Average daily temperatures have been as much as four degrees Celsius above the long-term average, and the western parts of the country experienced heatwave conditions in the last ten days of April.

Complete crop failure is anticipated in a number of regions, with stunted crops, reduced flowering and poor grain-fill the common story across the rest of the cropping area. MARS is calling this season's wheat harvest 1.783MMT, 45 per cent lower than the average of the previous five years.

The planted area of 1.389 million hectares is 23 per cent lower than the five-year average, and the yield of 1.28MT/ha is down by 24 per cent. The current barley outlook is not quite as drastic, with production of 1.084MMT 26 per cent below the 2018-2022 period, off a 12 per cent smaller planted area of 1.025 million hectares and a 14 per cent lower yield to 1.06MT/ha.

The third biggest producer in the region is Tunisia, and this season's production outlook is grim. Cumulative rainfall tallies across the entire cropping region were the lowest in more than 40 years. No rain in the 40 days from April 2 to May 10 was the final nail in the coffin for many districts. Irreversible crop damage is expected to lead to universal crop failure in the regions of El Kef, Siliana and Zaghuan. And the biomass data in the rest of the country paint a very distressing picture. Irrigation is the only thing that has salvaged crops in the northernmost region of Bizerte.

Wheat production is forecast at 837,000 metric tonne by MARS, 33 per cent lower than last year's crop of 1.252MMT and 28 per cent below the five-year average of 1.170MMT. A dramatically lower yield of 1.62MT/ha is the main contributor, 33 per cent lower than last harvest and down 19 per cent compared to the five-year average. Barley output has taken a bigger hit, with forecast production of just 225,000 metric tonne down 57 and 56 per cent against last year and the five-year average, respectively.

The dramatically lower production does not auger well for the price of dietary staples like bread. With a lower supply of essential raw materials come higher domestic prices. Groundwater supplies are also depleted, and water levels at regional dams are falling quickly. Rationing of both food and water has already begun in the worst-hit regions.

Maghreb governments are slated to import a record 25.1MMT of wheat and barley in the 2023/24 marketing year, commencing July 1, to fill the looming grain deficit. However, the concurrent fall in agricultural exports will strain budgets and potentially destabilise economies. Foreign currency reserves are already low, especially in Tunisia, and debt liabilities are already high, especially in Morocco. While Libya is aligned with Russia, the other three nations will likely turn to the West, or possibly Saudi Arabia, to provide financial aid and funding support for the increased grain import burden.

After his poor handling of the inflation crisis and a perceived lack of empathy, social unrest is already a challenge for Morocco's billionaire prime minister Aziz Akhannouch. And Tunisia's authoritarian president Kais Saied has been struggling to appease non-government organisations calling for his resignation. Hungry people are revolutionary people, and this drought will no doubt test the resolve of many Maghreb civilians.



MOROCCAN LAMB, TOMATO & LENTIL SOUP

Ingredients

- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 700g diced lamb
- 1 onion, chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, chopped
- 2 tablespoons tomato paste
- 1 1/2 teaspoons ground cumin
- 2 teaspoons sweet paprika
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1 bay leaf
- 1L (4 cups) beef stock
- 2 x 400g cans Ardmona Rich & Thick Classic Tomatoes
- 1/2 bunch coriander, leaves finely chopped, plus extra leaves to serve
- 2 x 400g cans chickpeas, rinsed, drained
- 2 x 400g cans brown lentils, rinsed, drained
- Thick Greek-style yoghurt and toasted pita bread, to serve



Method

Step 1

Heat the oil in a large saucepan over medium-high heat. Season the lamb, then in batches, cook, turning, for 4-5 minutes until browned. Remove from the pan and set aside.

Step 2

Add the onion and garlic to the pan and cook, stirring, for 3-4 minutes until softened. Return the lamb to the pan with the tomato paste, spices and bay leaf. Cook, stirring, for 1 minute, then add the stock, chopped tomato and coriander. Bring to a simmer, then cover and reduce heat to low. Cook for 1 hour, then stir in chickpeas and lentils. Cover and cook for 30 minutes, then remove the lid and cook for a further 30 minutes or until the lamb is tender and the soup is slightly reduced and thickened.

Step 3

Garnish with extra coriander and serve with yoghurt and pita bread.
