### STATION NEWS

Scott has been away in Perth on a pursuit driver training course the last few weeks. After many long days and assessments, he passed the course and now holds the highest driving qualification available in WA Police. This qualification allows him to pursue vehicles in the event they fail to stop when we attempt to intercept them. Pursuits are very high risk for all involved, including other road users, and Scott has received training on how to lower those risks, and end the pursuit safely. All police officers receive advanced driver training, but only a few receive pursuit training. Officers with lower driving qualifications can pursue vehicles in exceptional circumstances but there is a lot of criteria to meet before it would be authorised. We also all complete mandatory annual training on the subject.

### CRIME NEWS

As some people may have heard there continues to be a spate of burglaries in the surrounding area, from Albany to Corrigin. There have been over 60 burglaries in the region since January this year. Lake Grace and Newdegate have been targeted several times. The MO is very similar and we have a dedicated team of police and detectives working on this. We can't comment too much on the investigation side of things but this is what we can say.

The suspects have been targeting farm houses and sheds on remote properties. The majority are vacant or the occupants are away. They seem to have a knowledge of the properties that have CCTV. They have gone out of their way to avoid cameras when they are present or to avoid properties with cameras completely. This shows they have, at least on some occasions, been on the property before and seen the cameras.

They are stealing a range of things from power tools, motorbikes, and vehicles. Basically, anything portable. One burglary last week they stole over \$10,000 worth of property. They are committing these burglaries on a regular basis and show no sign of slowing down.

The best thing you can do to reduce your risk of being targeted is to install CCTV cameras. A cheaper option is to buy some trail cameras and install them at the entrances to your property and in your sheds. These cameras only record when they detect movement so can operate for months without the need for any further input from yourself. Cameras seem to be the biggest deterrent we have identified as these thieves have burgled multiple farms in a night, skipping properties with cameras.



If you have any questions or queries, or want any advice in regards to cameras contact us here at the station as we're more than happy to help.

### TRAFFIC NEWS

People might have seen us out and about late into the evening these last few weeks. We've introduced some later shifts into our roster to give us better coverage over the course of the day. This also means we have been able to do more Random Breath Testing in the evenings.

Unfortunately, in the last fortnight we have caught four locals drink driving. A fifth person failed a roadside drug test. A lot of people we stopped were under the limit, but only just. If you're planning on drinking, plan on how you'll get home too, drink driving isn't worth the risk.

In other news a male from Lake Grace was charged with Dangerous Driving after we received several reports from concerned witnesses that he drove his car while a male was on sitting on the outside of his vehicle. The male was interviewed and came clean and we were a bit lost for words with this one. He has been summonsed to court for the offence.

## CEO Chat

The Shire is undergoing a major review of its Strategic Community Plan which is a requirement of the Local Government Act 1995. It gives the community a say in which direction it wishes the Shire to take in the future. Workshops were held during the last week of April in Varley, Lake King, Newdegate and Lake Grace by Consulting Great Southern who have been engaged to undertake the review. Whilst turnout was not great there was some very good feedback received. As well as the in-person workshops there is an online survey available with the links on the Shire website and social platforms. In addition hard copies are available at the Shire office.

There has been a lot of movement around Lake Grace this past month with regard to both housing and industrial land. At this stage we have a couple of irons in the fire on both fronts and investigations into our options are underway.

We have been advised by Main Roads WA that roadworks at the Stubbs Street South Road intersection in Lake Grace and the intersection of Brookton Highway and the Collie Lake King Road in Lake King are set to commence on 11th May. Weather permitting they are set for completion by 24th May. This work is well overdue and most welcome.

Highlights from the last Council meeting held on 26th April include the following:

- Approval was given for Crisp Wireless to access the old TV/Radio Rebroadcasting Tower in Lake Grace so that they could install a dish and access point so that an additional internet provider option can be given to the town of Lake Grace. (Newdegate watch this space).
- Council was approached by a Varley farmer with regard to the purchase of a house in Varley which is a joint venture project with the Department of Communities. This house has been vacant for all but 3 months in the past 4 years. Council supported the sale of the house to the farmer. As this is a joint venture project and the Shire only has a 14.36% share in the property the ultimate approval needs to come from the Department of Communities. Funds from the sale of the house will be put towards providing housing in a more appropriate location.
- Council authorised the CEO to submit an application under the Regional Development Assistance Program to complete the development by Development WA of 4 Lots in the Dewar Street Light Industrial area.
- The Newdegate Field Days for 2023 are rapidly approaching and planning is well underway. Council approved sponsorship towards the field days to the value of \$15,000 as in previous years. This will be included in the upcoming budget.

We are currently seeking to appoint a Community Economic Development Officer to join our administration team. These are currently some exciting times within the Shire and we are seeking someone who can not only support the community through events but also be capable of completing grant opportunities that may become available to assist all areas of the community and Shire. ## Community Infrastructure Services

Welcome to another edition of the Community News. As sport is now in full swing it is great to see all the ovals in the Shire are looking nice and green and the best they have been for the last few years.

The lighting projects at the Lake Grace ovals and Newdegate hockey oval are coming to an end with all the towers now up and the lights are operational, with the final adjustments scheduled for next week.

The All Abilities Playground in Lake Grace is finally making some traction. This project has been long and drawn out but hopefully going forward you will start to see some earthworks commence and in the coming weeks the equipment will start to be installed. Behind the scenes I have been working with surveyors and contractors to get the project underway. If all goes to plan we will see another trailer load of equipment arrive.

Shire staff and contractors have been busy over the last few weeks tidying up many projects with the end of the financial year fast approaching.

Works completed include:

- Newdegate Hockey field light tower installation
- Lake Grace Football Field light tower installation
- Bitumen reseal sections on Newdegate Pingrup Road, Holt Rock South Road, North Lake Grace Kalgarin Road
- Back slope maintenance on sections of Burngup Road, Burns Road, Willcocks Road, Varley South Road, Holt Rock South Road and Carstairs Road
- Town gardeners have been busy throughout the Shire
- 4 Maintenance graders have been kept busy throughout the Shire with the recent rains, hopefully we get more rain in the near future so we can get our winter grading program into full swing
- New roofs on the RSL Building, Staff house in Lake Grace and Lake Grace Sportsman's Club



Staff and contractors are currently working on:

- Newdegate Hockey Shed upgrade
- Lake King Cemetery fence (works happening behind the scene)
- Lake King Pavilion upgrade (works happening behind the scene)
- Gravel sheeting on Bidy Camm Road and Jarring South Road
- Maintenance on buildings throughout the Shire

Work is well under way for the New Stubbs Street Park, next to the visitor centre in Lake Grace. Paths have been laid and two shade shelters are now up.

**Please Note:** There is no kerbside recycling collection service in Lake King or Varley.

The recycling bins are collected by Warren Blackwood Waste and transported to a recycling facility. If items which are not recyclable are found the content can't be recycled and the load will be directed to the landfill.

If an item is covered in food, it is not recyclable. Food is one of the worst contaminants in the recycling process. By using the yellow top recycling bin correctly you are contributing, in a combined community effort, to reduce the amount of rubbish that is directed to landfill facilities each year.

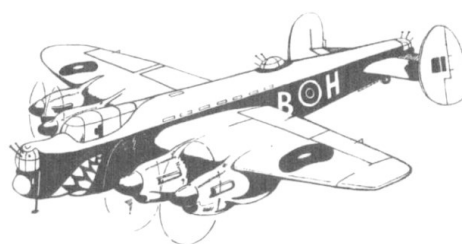

## Grain Brokers Weekly Report

### Grain Brokers Australia Weekly Market Report

May 9, 2023

#### European Union on track for new crop production boost...

After a relatively dry February, most of Europe's grain-growing regions saw soil moisture deficits eliminated and water reservoirs replenished following extremely beneficial and timely rainfall throughout March and April. The only exceptions are Spain and northern Italy, with the former largely drought-declared and the latter extremely dry.

According to the April report from the European Union's Joint Research Centre unit, Monitoring Agricultural Resources (JRC MARS), the EU crop escaped relatively unscathed from a series of cold spells across much of the continent in early March and early April, with crops in most regions now enjoying ideal growing conditions with adequate soil moisture and slightly warmer than average spring temperatures.

JRC MARS decreased EU-27 soft wheat production in 2023/24 from 131.7 million metric tonne in its March update to 131.17MMT in April, up 3.3 per cent on 2022/23 output. This was on the back of a slight reduction in yield from 5.99 metric tonne per hectare in March to 5.96MT/ha last month, but it still sits three per cent above the five-year average. The planted area was unchanged compared to March at 21.99 million hectares but is up a smidgen year-on-year from 21.90 million hectares. Durum wheat production saw a minor month-on-month increase in the projected yield from 3.53MT/ha to 3.54MT/ha, putting total EU-27 production 6.4 per cent higher year-on-year at 7.6MMT.

Total barley production across the EU-27 was cut from 54.15MMT to 52.64MMT off a projected planted area of 10.7 million hectares, following a significant downward revision to spring barley yields in Spain, the EU's biggest spring barley-producing nation. The average barley yield dropped from 5.06MT/ha in March to 4.92MT/ha in the latest report, but the spring barley yield estimate was slashed by 6.9 per cent from 4.34MT/ha to 4.04MT/ha, 4 per cent below the five-year average. On the other hand, winter barley yields received a slight upward adjustment to 5.93MT/ha.

Rapeseed is the dominant winter oilseed crop across the EU, expected to make up almost 60 per cent of total oilseed production in 2023/24. Output is currently forecast at 20MMT, 2.4 per cent higher than 2022/23, off a planted area of 6.05 million hectares, 3.1 per cent higher than the previous season. The Sunflower seed crop is forecast at 10.47MMT, 14.2 per cent higher year-on-year and 31.4 per cent of total EU oilseed production in 2023/24.

## Grain Brokers Weekly Report contined

The winter barley crop in France bucked the wheat trend coming in one per cent higher at 92 per cent good-to-excellent compared to 86 per cent on the same date in 2022. The spring barley crop conditions were unchanged at 96 per cent in the top rating bracket, against 88 per cent in early May last year. JRC MARS pencilled total barley production 2.2 per cent higher year-on-year at 11.64MMT. The new season rapeseed crop is sailing along very nicely, with production forecast to be up slightly compared to 2022/23 to 4.56MMT.

Regular rainfall events through March and April have consolidated winter crop production in Germany, but the exceedingly wet fields did delay the spring and summer crop planting program. Rainfall registrations in March were the highest since 2001, and a cold snap at the beginning of April did test the winter crop's frost resilience. The upcoming harvest is forecast to produce 22.33MMT of wheat, down from 22.59MMT in 2022/23. Forecast barley output is almost unchanged at 11.18MMT, and the rapeseed crop is up 5.4 per cent to 4.53MMT.

The winter crop conditions across most of Poland have been particularly favourable this year, but the spring planting campaign has been dogged by wet and cold weather. Several cold spells saw morning temperatures drop below zero in March and April, but the winter-hardened crops have reportedly escaped any significant damage. JRC MARS inked 2023/24 season wheat, barley and rapeseed production at 13.47MMT, 3.5MMT and 3.37MMT, respectively, off planted areas of 2.6 million hectares, 840,000 hectares and 1.05 million hectares.

The production prognosis is not so rosy for Spain, where winter and spring crops across all regions are suffering under the burden of severe moisture stress. Very little rain has fallen across the Iberian Peninsula since the beginning of January, and maximum temperatures have been among the highest ever recorded in some districts.

Soil moisture reserves are now critically low, and the winter and spring crop production outlook is falling by the day. The drought has reportedly engulfed more than 60 per cent of the country and caused permanent losses to over 3.5 million hectares of dryland winter crops. JRC MARS is calling Spain's soft wheat production from this year's harvest 4.95MMT, down from 5.39MMT last year and 7.46MMT in 2021. The barley picture is very similar, with 2023/24 production forecast at 6.04MMT, down from 6.62MMT in 2022/23 and 8.86MT the season prior.

Spain's summer crop campaign is also hurting, with irrigation water reserves running critically low. This is expected to lead to a reduction in the planted area due to a shift from rice and maize to more drought-tolerant crops, according to JRC MARS. It is highly likely that some dryland areas will not be sown at all as there is insufficient moisture, and the ideal planting window is now closed.

In northern Italy, winter crops are struggling due to a lack of moisture, but the country's production outlook is largely unchanged at this stage. However, rainfall is required in the next few weeks to prevent yields from dropping below trend and negatively impacting this season's EU-27 production. The summer crop planting campaign has commenced, but like Spain, water reservoirs are lower than average entering summer, and irrigation water restrictions have already been implemented in the northwest of the country.

With smaller winter crop production expected in major producers such as Russia, Ukraine, Australia and possibly the United States in 2023/24, a boost to EU output is a welcome positive for global new crop balance sheets. However, with significant production issues surfacing in Spain, drought conditions intensifying throughout the Maghreb region of northern Africa, and continued supply uncertainty out of the Black Sea region, competition will be fierce around the Mediterranean for new crop supplies over the next twelve months.

# Pumpkin, chickpea & coconut curry

- 1 pumpkin , or squash (roughly 900g)
- 4 cm piece of ginger
- 4 shallots
- 4 cloves of garlic
- 1 fresh red chilli
- 1 bunch fresh coriander
- groundnut oil
- 1 teaspoon mustard seeds
- 20 curry leaves
- 1 teaspoon turmeric
- 1 x 400 g tin of chopped tomatoes
- 2 x 400g tins of chickpeas
- 2 x 400 g tins of light coconut milk



*“This is the perfect warming dish to enjoy with your mates after you’ve been out in the cold. If you can, make it some time ahead – this will give all the wonderful flavours a chance to develop. Pumpkin and chickpeas are great friends and really hearty, so this dish will satisfy meat-eaters, too.”*

## Method

1. Chop the pumpkin or squash into 3cm chunks and cut the ginger into matchsticks. Pick the coriander leaves and finely chop the stalks.
2. Pour a good lug of groundnut oil into a large saucepan and place on a high heat. Add the ginger, garlic, red chilli and shallots, then reduce to a medium heat. Cook until golden, stirring occasionally, then add the mustard seeds, curry leaves, and coriander stalks and fry until the curry leaves go crispy. Add the turmeric, tomatoes and coconut milk. Bring to the boil, then add the pumpkin and chickpeas. Reduce to a low heat, cover with a lid and simmer for 45 minutes. Check occasionally and add a splash of water if it looks a bit dry.
3. When the time’s up, take the lid off and cook for a further 15 minutes or so until the sauce is lovely and thick.
4. Scatter with Coriander leavers and serve with rice, naan bread and chutneys and dips on the side.
